Dear Dr. Bryan:

I am sending you under separate cover a print of the picture taken at the installation of S.A.T.C. at the University of Idaho and also a picture of the boys taken on the occasion of the Governor's visit.

We are vigorously combatting the influenza situation here. There are about fifty cases, mostly among the vocational men, and two of the Wyoming boys ~~are~~ very ill with pneumonia. Most of the influenza cases are milk and the number of discharges from hospitals is now greater than the number of admissions. We are securing excellent team work from all forces and hope to stem the epidemic. Everything is being done that can be done, but I fear we will lose one of the Wyoming men.
