Dear Dr. Bryan:

Immediately on receipt of your letter concerning Ralph O. Jones we took the matter up with the hospital and a messenger was sent to ask him to get in touch with his parents. He was well, and I wired his father Saturday that the smallpox case would be released from quarantine on Sunday and that Ralph would communicate with him. Director Angell promised that his instructors would arrange his courses satisfactorily.

You will be glad to know that at present we have but thirteen cases of influenza in the hospital. A few may still prove ~~fatal~~^{serious}, but at present all are recovering nicely. There are, however, a few cases in one of the sorority houses. We have fitted up a special hospital for the girls and are taking every precaution. Their cases are very mild, and we are hopeful that no others may be infected.
