## MESSAGES FROM THE ARBORETUM DIRECTOR

## **Botanical History of the Pacific Northwest**

"The Flowering of Botany in the Pacific Northwest", a notable vignette of botanists who had key roles in our area, is open 9am-4pm M-F at Manuscripts, Archives, and Special Collections of the Holland Library, Washington State University through December 18, 1992. The show, arranged by Sue Fodor, establishes relationships among Linnaeus, Lewis and Clark, David Douglas, C.V. Piper, W.N. Suksdorf, H. St. John, M. Ownbey, and R. Daubenmire.

C.V. Piper's extensive plant collections founded herbaria at the University of Washington (1880) and Washington State College (now W.S.U.) one decade later. There are remarkable herbals, key plant taxonomy materials, and personal notes of the important early plant collectors of the Palouse region. The show merits a special trip to W.S.U.

## **Nurseries Donate Special Trees**

Suzanne St. Pierre and Theresa Greiner, Pullman Garden Center, contributed nine crabapple hybrids ('Brandywine', 'Madonna', 'Makamik', 'Molten Lava', 'Pink Perfection', 'Pink Spire', 'Radiant', 'Red Barron', 'Thunderchild') for October planting in the Asian section of the new Arboretum. These disease resistant, quality cultivars expand the ranges of flowering times and colors, fruit colors and character, and growth habit of our crabapple collections.

Jan K. Schaefer, Lewiston contract tree propagator, presented two chestnut (*Castanea*) test hybrids for the Eastern North American section of our Arboretum.

These quality specimens are welcomed additions to the Arboretum's growing collection.

#### Birds and the Arboretum Ponds

Great Blue Heron, Belted Kingfisher, and juvenile Piedbilled Grebe were the notable Arboretum pond residents through October. As of November first, only the Belted Kingfishers remain. This fall, migratory ducks and geese have not visited in the numbers that were common last spring.

## **Arboretum Entry Signs**

Entries to the new Arboretum along Nez Perce Drive,
Palouse River Drive West, and the Main entry to the Charles
Houston Shattuck Arboretum near the KUID station will
have permanent entry signs installed within the next two
months. Signs, matching the UI styles, will be useful to
identify the entries for the increasing numbers of arboretum
visitors--especially now that we are being cited in increasing
numbers of travel brochures and books.
