Or imagine traveling wooden walkways along streams and ponds to view water plants and pond life.

Then imagine walking the paths of a botanical garden containing sections of plantings common to Asia, Europe and North America, rounding a corner and being hit by the explosion of color to be found in an All America Selections display garden.

Imagine being a part of making this vision become a reality. That's what the Arboretum Associates is all about -- furthering the development of the University of Idaho's Shattuck Arboretum extension project launched in 1975.

The 63-acre site of this extension is located in a south-facing valley which is immediately east of the ASUI Golf Course. It lies between Nez Perce Drive on the north and Palouse River Drive on the south. This new arboretum-botanical garden complements the wooded original arboretum established in 1910 -- one of the oldest arboreta in western North America. This new facility will serve as a study, information, and display center for the general public as well as provide a major teaching and research site for students and faculty in plant and soil sciences, landscape architecture, forestry and biological sciences.

Last April, with the help of the Moscow Rotary Club, many specimen plants were placed in three memorial groves at the upper end of the arboretum extension as well as along the shelter belt adjacent to the ASUI golf course. Our thanks to the Rotarians for their help in this service project.

This fall the Arboretum Associates will again sponsor a series of free public workshops for the home gardener. More information on this will be found on the reverse side of this page. We hope you will find time to participate.

Also planned, but not yet scheduled are workshops on pruning and landscaping.
