Will Idaho Win the Meet?

"YES, BY THREE OR FOUR POINTS," SAYS THE DOPE

IDAHO'S STRENGTH IN WEIGHTS AND SPRINTS SEEMS TO GUARANTEE JOYOUS RESULTS—MEET HAS MANY HIGH POINTS

JAZZ OVER THE HILL AND HELP MAKE THE GLADSOME DOPE PREDICTIONS TRUE

Promises Are Held Forth That Meet at Pullman Tomorrow Will be Real Thriller—One Plunk Lets You In.

What promises to be the most thrilling track and field meet that has been held in this conference in many years will take place on Rogers field at Pullman tomorrow afternoon, under the auspices of W. S. C. Idaho has chances equal to any of the contesting schools to win the meet. However, the results are by no means salted down, for every school is sending many strong men in many events.

Idaho will run strongest in the weights, broad jump, and 220. It is understood that both Perrine and Irving are much feared by all contestants. Many expect to see McCallie step off the 220 in a length of time that will open the eyes of all who see him or hear of it.

Following is what the Spokesman-Review says of the coming event:

The conference meet will bring out some of the best athletes of the cinder path in the northwest, with several candidates for the Olympic teams participating. The sprints should develop exciting races, with Adams of Montana, Foster of Oregon and Snook of O. A. C., all of whom have done 10 flat in the 100-yard dash this year entered.

Greene and Rose of O. A. C. and McCallie of Idaho look best in the 440, each having done the quarter in less than 50 seconds. Douglas of Washington looks good in the 880, while Swan of O. A. C. and Ratchford of W. S. C. are strong possibilities for mile honors. Swan won the race at Palo Alto in 4:29, but has done 4:24 this year.

"Jit" Smith of Washington state

established a new Pacific coast record at Palo Alto in the two-mile grind, his time being 9:53. He had no close competition. He holds the northwest record at 9:45. Smith will make his final appearance at a conference meet Saturday. He leaves next month for Pasadena, where he will try out for the Olympic team June 26, entering the three-mile event. McDonald, Washington, is expected to run second to Smith Saturday.

Fast Men in Hurdles.
The high hurdles should prove one of the closest races of the day, with Spencer of Montana, Ackleman of O. A. C. and Howell of Washington state credited with being 18-second men. The same men will enter the low hurdles.

Irving of Idaho and McDonald of Montana appear to be the best in the shot put, and both have sent the 16-pound ball more than 44 feet. Hope of Washington has a record of 140 feet 11 inches in the discus, and Bartlett of Oregon has a record of 138 feet.

Irving of Idaho has thrown the javelin 176 feet. Idaho also has a quartet of quarter-milers who will make the other entrants hustle to win the relay.

The jumps present the greatest uncertainty from the dopester's standpoint. Jenne of W. S. C., Frankfurt of Washington and Ackleman of O. A. C. are all good performers.

The First National Bank of Pullman has offered a silver loving cup to the winning team.

JENNE MAY RAISE RECORD

W. S. C. Vaulter Will Try to Break World's Record At Coming Meet.

One of the features of the Northwest Conference Track and Field Meet, to be held on Rogers field, at Pullman, tomorrow afternoon, will be the attempt by Jenne, of W. S. C., to break the world's record in the pole vault. This means that Jenne will have to clear the bar at a height of over 13 feet, 3 and 9-16 inches.

Jenne's present record is 13 feet and 5-8 of an inch. This mark was made at the Pacific coast meet at Palo Alto. At this same meet, Jenne made an attempt to clear the bamboo at 13 feet, 4 1/4 inches. He barely grazed the bar as he went over. Jenne claims a disadvantage in this

affair in that he was vaulting with a strange pole. With his own pole it is said that he has been clearing a thirteen foot bar by better than four inches.

DUNNE PICKS OLYMPIC MEN

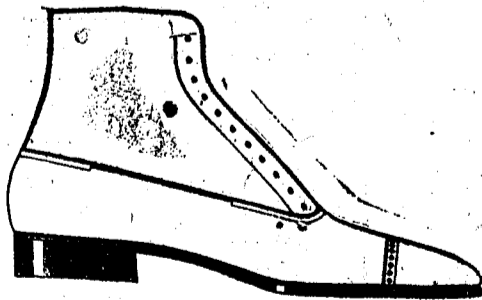
