







...the manager of the paper, subject to the will of the board.

(14) The managing editor shall receive a salary of \$100 per year, payable in advance, for each issue of the paper during his term of office, this salary to be paid semi-monthly.

(15) The editor shall have power to appoint such additional members to the staff as he shall deem necessary and to determine their duties; he shall also have power to remove any appointee when, in his judgment, he shall fail properly to perform his duties. He shall determine the policy of the paper subject to the supervisory powers of the executive board and shall be responsible to the executive board and to the university administration for the paper.

(16) The editor shall receive a salary of \$50 for each issue of the paper during his term of office, such salary to be paid in advance.

(17) A circulation manager shall be appointed by the executive board within one week after the annual A. S. U. I. election from the membership of the incoming junior class.

(18) The circulation manager shall automatically become business manager for the year immediately following his service as circulation manager; and, in case of a vacancy in the position of business manager, before that time, he shall be appointed to that office.

(19) The business manager of "The Idaho Argonaut" shall conduct the business affairs of the paper, subject to the general control of the graduate manager and in addition, in case of a vacancy in the position of business manager, before that time, he shall be promoted to that office.

(20) The business manager shall receive a salary of \$30 per issue of the paper during his term of office, in addition he shall receive twenty per cent of all moneys collected for advertising during the year over and above \$1000.

(21) "The Idaho Argonaut" shall be published twice a week until otherwise provided for by the student body.

(22) The student body, acting through the staff of "The Idaho Argonaut" for three consecutive semesters shall receive the following awards:

(a) The "Blue Bucket" shall be awarded by the executive board to every person qualified who has been recommended by the Editor and Manager of the Argonaut.

(b) The "Gem of the Mountains" shall be administered by an editor, as assistant editor, business manager and assistant manager under the following provisions:

(1) The associate editor shall be elected during the annual A. S. U. I. election by the students from not more than four members of the incoming junior class who shall be nominated by a board consisting of the editor, two members of the staff selected by the editor and the president of the A. S. U. I.

(2) The associate editor shall automatically become editor for the year immediately following his service as associate editor, and, in addition, in case of a vacancy in the position of editor before that time, he shall be promoted to that office.

(3) The editor shall have power to appoint such additional members of the staff as he shall deem necessary, and he shall determine their duties. He shall also have power to remove any appointee, who, in his judgment, shall fail properly to perform his duties. He shall determine the policy of the magazine, subject to the general supervision of the executive board and he shall be responsible to the executive board and the university administration for each policy.

(4) A circulation manager shall be appointed by the executive board within one week after the annual A. S. U. I. election from the membership of the incoming junior class.

(5) The circulation manager shall automatically become business manager for the year immediately following his service as circulation manager and, in addition, in case of a vacancy in the position of business manager before that time, he shall automatically be promoted to that office.

(6) The business manager shall conduct the business affairs of the magazine, subject to the general control of the general manager, which have not been made official by the A. S. U. I.

ARTICLE III  
Department of Debate

Section 1—The Student Manager shall be elected by the students each year after the annual A. S. U. I. election by the students who have participated in one or more inter-collegiate debates for the year. The election shall be held by the executive board.

Section 2—That for representation in one variety intercollegiate debate the participant shall receive upon recommendation of the debate coach, the following award: one gold block "M" one half inch high and three eighths of an inch wide at each end, to which has been applied a block "D" inlaid with black enamel. The block "M" shall be inserted in a small pearl for each year the participant has debated on the state team.

For the debate manager if is provided, (not exclusive of the above provisions) that a larger pearl be inserted in the center of the "D" and the central portion of the "M".

Section 3—The above provision shall apply to both men and women debaters.

ARTICLE IV  
Department of Music

Section 1—The Department of Music shall be composed of:

(1) The Men's Glee Club.

(2) The Women's Glee Club.

(3) The University of Idaho Pep Band.

Section 2—The Men's Glee Club shall be an official organization of the A. S. U. I. and shall be administered by a student manager under the direction and control of the graduate manager and shall be subject to the approval of the Men's Glee Club from the year membership, subject to the approval of the executive board.

Section 3—The Women's Glee Club shall be an official organization of the A. S. U. I. and shall be administered by a student manager under the direction and control of the Graduate Manager. The student manager shall be elected by the Treble Clef from among its own membership, subject to the approval of the executive board.

Section 4—The University of Idaho Pep Band shall be an official organization of the A. S. U. I. under the following provisions:

(1) The managing editor shall have the direction of a leader who shall be elected by the regular members to the band. To be eligible for a vote in the election of the band a member must have been chosen by the leader at the beginning of the year, or have served one semester as a member of the Pep Band.

(2) The personnel of the band shall be selected by the leader in consultation with the

ARTICLE XI  
Election Rules

Section 1—The election committee shall conduct student body elections as follows:

(1) The polls shall be open from 10 A. M. to 3 P. M. the day of the election.

(2) No proxies shall be voted at any A. S. U. I. election.

(3) No candidate for office shall serve as an official at any election.

(4) All disputes or irregularities shall be decided solely by the election committee.

(5) All election statistics shall be certified to by the chairman of the election committee and record put in the minutes of the executive board.

(6) The candidate receiving the majority of the cast shall be the officer elect for that office.

(7) In case of a tie vote, a new election for that office shall be called within one week.

General Provisions

Section 1—All bills called for doing A. S. U. I. work involving an expenditure of three hundred dollars (\$300.00) must be opened by

the manager concerned, at a regular meeting of the executive board.

Section 2—No member of the executive board can hold an appointive office which requires executive board approval.

Section 3—The association shall, each year, publish a handbook containing a copy of the constitution and by-laws.

Section 4—Meetings of the association shall be held once each month during the college year unless otherwise decided by the executive board. Ten per cent (10%) of the members of the association shall constitute a quorum. "Robert's Rules of Order" shall govern this association in all cases in which they are applicable, and are not in derogation of any provision of this constitution and by-laws.

Section 5—All campus organizations shall, when founded, file a copy of their constitution and purposes with the secretary of the association. In the event that any organization, which has been organized at least one year, is not so registered, the faculty of the University faculty that such organization be removed from the active records, and not accorded any of the privileges of the university, or represent Idaho in any manner.

Section 6—This constitution and by-laws shall go into effect immediately upon its adoption to it are hereby declared null and void, except that this provision shall not be construed to be retroactive so as to seriously affect past acts of the association.

ARTICLE XIII  
Amendment to By-laws

These by-laws may be amended by a vote in a student body meeting, at which meeting one-fifth of the student body votes and two-thirds of the members of the executive board may be proposed and voted upon at the same meeting.

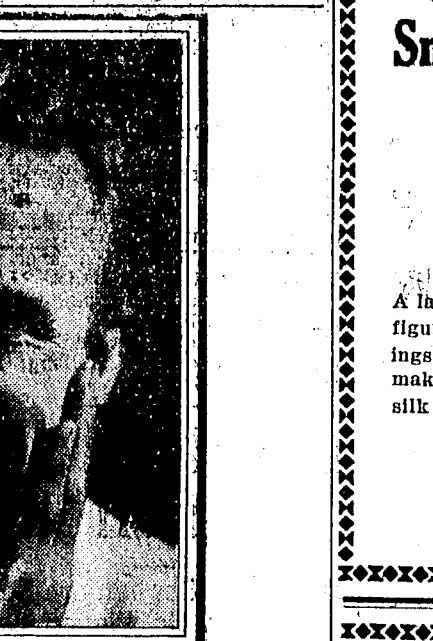

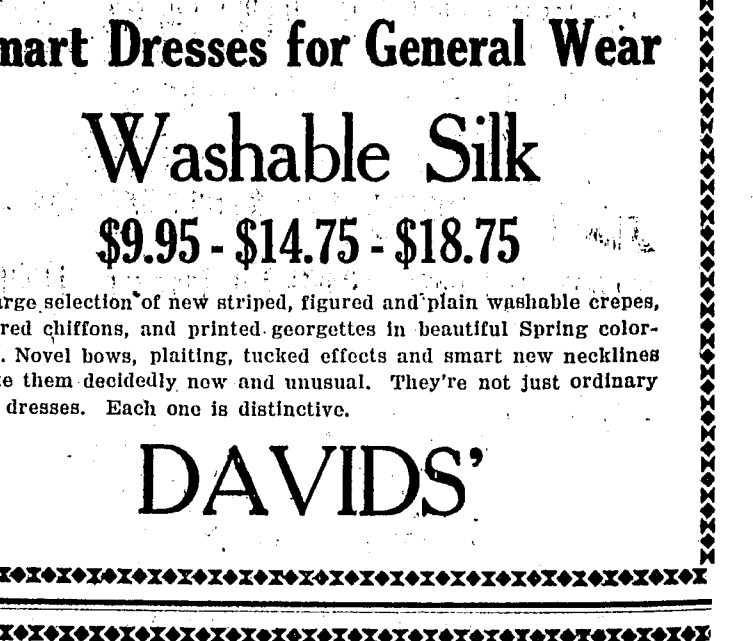
