Borah Peace Foundation To Be Dedicated In Fall

Many Notables Expected to Be Present at First Lecture of \$55,000 Peace Fund in September; Levinson and Borah Invited to Attend.

The dedication of the William Edgar Borah Foundation for World Peace has been arranged by the state board of education and the board of regents in a meeting concluded today.

Four lectures will be given by the speaker who is Dr. Manley O. Hudson of Harvard University.

According to announcements made by the members of the state board of education all of them plan to be present on the occasion.

An effort will be made to have both the donor of the gift, Salmon O. Levinson, and the man in whose honor it was given, William E. Borah, present for the opening of the university year and the dedication of the foundation.

Dr. Hudson is considered one of the outstanding authorities on the subject of world peace and international law.

At the close of the World War Dr. Hudson went to Paris with President Woodrow Wilson as a member of the Paris Peace conference.

Idaho Falls tonight won the Idaho state basketball championship from Coeur d'Alene by a score of 38 to 31 before one of the biggest crowds that ever attended a basketball game in the Idaho Memorial gymnasium.

The game started out fast and play in the first two periods was loose. The players seemed nervous and had difficulty in hanging on to the ball.

Idaho Falls jumped into a 7-point lead at the beginning of the game, but Coach Telford sent in several Lake City reserves and the score was finally tied at 13 all before the Vikings managed to grab a 2-point lead at the gun.

Coeur d'Alene dominated the second quarter and both teams settled down and played a steady game of basketball throughout the period.

The Tigers played the same steady, smooth game that marked their appearance in the opening round, and with Naylor and Watson ringing the hoop for 12 points each the result was never in doubt.

Lewiston tossed all her men in the fray in a desperate effort to check the onslaught and each player counted at least one basket, but they were too short and the tall Tigers took the ball off the backboard after nearly every flip.




