- 1½ cups powdered sugar
- 2 eggs, separated2 cups Drifted Snow "Home-Perfected" flour

BROWNIE CUP CAKES

- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 3 teaspoons baking powder
- $\frac{1}{2}$ teaspoon vanilla
- ²/₃ cup milk
- 2 squares unsweetened chocolate

(2 ounces)

¹/₂ cup granulated sugar

Cream butter and powdered sugar until creamy, and beat in one egg yolk. Sift flour, measure and sift again with salt and baking powder and add alternately with milk to creamed mixture

Melt chocolate in top of double boiler, add granulated sugar and stir until smooth. Add remaining egg yolk and mix well. Cool and blend into cake batter. Carefully fold in vanilla and
