An article carried last week by the Washington State
Evergreen proclaimed the State college as being the low cost college of the Pacific Northwest. The information for th
lews story was derived from a panphlet by Dr. Walter Greenleat" of the United States office of education. A one room, plus incidentals and fees' at the college is given as
$\$ 394$. And this is said to be the lowest cost in the three
Northwest states. Idaho can better that figure in any one of four men's and
women's cooperative halls, and can match it in four other men's and women's groups. A same ""onservative minimum
estimate of tuition, board and room plus incidentals and fess" t he University of Idaho could be placed at $\$ 347$. And that is almost a liberal figure. Dr.

Board and room costs at the University of Idaho cooper
tives will approximate $\$ 18$ per month, and total $\$ 160$ pe 2ar. At the University dormitories, board and room will run acific coast. Cooperatives are not unknown at the Washing

Student's Cooperative league meeting there last summer gave
the monthly cost of the Washington State cocperative as the monthly cost of the Washington State cocperative as
eeing $\$ 24$ per month, which brings the cost to $\$ 204$ per year
for an cight and one half month collegiate yeur. tor an eight and one half month collegiate year.
The Idaho catalogue gives cost at the university as being
s267 per year for board, room, books, and fees. A conservative estimate will give cach student $\$ 80$ per year for "inci
dentals." This will total $\$ 347$ for the student living in dentals." This will total $\$ 347$ for the student living in
cooperative, which includes $\$ 20$ for books each semester.
Figures for the university-operated dormitories are high ollege year. Board and room at a university dormitory will approximate $\$ 230$ for this year, according to Robert Greene
director of dormitories. That would leave $\$ 164$ for every
hing else to mateh the Washington State "low" figure of \$394. It could be done, but following the university catalogue
that gives costs of $\$ 337$ for the year and addingr $\$ 80$ for the
incientals," the Idaho student could live for $\$ 417$. This

Low costs here are partially explained by the student cooperatives that have placed living costs at a minimum and
