## Communique Comment

General Eisenhower's Tunisian campaign forms the minute hand on the clock that will time the expected Allied invasion of the continent of $\ddagger u r o p e$. By sudden counter-attacks and deft use of rear guards, Rommel has escaped from the trap aid for his army between Gafsa and Mareth and has delayed by several weeks the final Anglo-American assault on the northeast comer of Tuni
descent on sauthern Itady.

The enemy grip on the northern part of Tunisia is
nenaced by Montgomery's advance northward from Gates and by the anryal of romporcements for the British ist Army. But Allied mihitary experts warn tand the destruction of the divisions under yon Armin and Rommel will take one to two months zather than a few weeks. The Germans have been msme the wo the strengthen the natural and prepared defenses of Bizente-Thas sector, while the -90 mile strait ber the ad Cape Bon and sicuy gives the Auxp, conn thion suppily vantage of short communication tines to Itatian supply bases.
Conclusion of the fighting in Tunisia may be followed im Conclus by Alliod thrusts into the Balkan states or the Scandinayian peninsula. A suecessful drive through the Aegean islands and Greace would put the eastern Medater ranean under Anglo-American control, threaten Italy with invasion from two directions at once, and endanger th southern anchor of Hitler's long Russian front. accupatio of the northern part of Norway would strike terror into Finland and secure the vital sea route to northern $R$. against attacks from land-based units of the Luftwaffe.

Theoretically it is operated for the benefit of the students, the only way the administration will know that it is working for the benefit of the students is by way of an advisory committee that
will offer suggestions and criticisms in the interest of those students.
The bookstore policy, with its Itimate aim of giving the students ookstore service at a minimum college joe unfavorably. When the Idaho bookstore was bought out, thereby creating a semi-monopoly, prices went up instead of down; the debt that was to be retired by! the profits has increased; everyone talks about eventual student ownership, yet the ASU nor has there been any effective student committce to watch the wheels turn.
