When an Idaho graduate reeives a compliment equal to that of Idaho's famed potatoes-then they have reached the top. And at least one graduate can boast of that accomplishment.



The constitution used outmoded terms in referring to class dances. calling them the Junior Cabaret, Sophomore Frolic, and Freshman Glee.

Other information concerning athletic policies, the rifle teams music, and election procedures are imilarly outdated.

Graduate manager Gale Mix reports that colleges throughout the country are remodeling their constitutions since the war. He has received numerous requests for
