Ties, scarves, purses, baby clothes, mittens, all sorts of articles woven by the women of Gatlinburg, Tennessee, are on sale from 10:30 to 4:30 under the sponsorship of the Pi Beta Phi alumnae of Moscow. After advertising and other expenses have been covered the remainder of the profits will be sent to the school at Gatlinburg.

In 1910, when Pi Beta Phi questioned the commissioner of education in Washington concerning a place in which to locate a settlement school, he named eastern Tennessee as the most needy from the standpoint of education in the United States.

The organization of a settlement school was begun to give to mountaineers of eastern Tennessee educational training and advantages, with emphasis on industrial and agricultural work. The health center begun in the community after the first World War has been cited as a model for any rural health establishment.

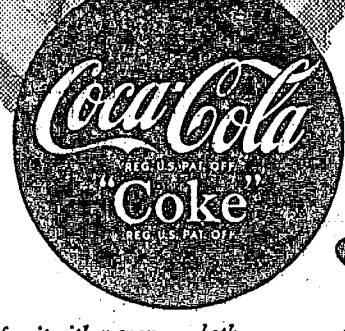
So here's to bigger and better Argonaut issues in years to come.

So far the draft law passed by the "worst" 80th Congress has had little effect on the Idaho campus. A few more upperclassmen are taking advanced ROTC than might otherwise be, and a few more men go to national guard drill on Tuesday and Thursday evening.

The registrar's office has sent out quite a number of statements concerning students' enrollment in college, and a few of the males have found it necessary to make hurried trips home to assure their draft board that they are, indeed, registered at the U.

So far as we know, none have been ordered to report. And so far as we know, none have—like the students in a Satevost cartoon—flipped a coin, saying, "Heads we finish studying for finals; tails we join the army."

By the end of the school year, things may be different. Draft boards, so far, are authorized only to defer students through one semester. Only pre-professional (pre-med, pre-dental and pre-veterinary) students may be permanently deferred. The advanced ROTC students are deferred as are the members of active guard units.

The rest of the non-vets may have something to worry about. They may be called under the present draft law. Or the 81st Congress may enact a draft law more to President Truman's liking—universal military training. —H.R.

Enrolled in the courses are 39 teachers in Payette, 27 in Twin Falls, 113 in Boise, and 69 in Nampa.
