

Best known and most widely Best known and most widely used diamond cutting is that shown above. In the trade, it is known as "round" or "bril-liant" cut. The "brilliant" has 58 facets—(32 facets and the table above the girdle, 24 fa-cets and the culet below). As light strikes the 58 facets, part is reflected and part enters is reflected and part enters the diamond. If it is properly proportioned and polished, most of the light ray are re-flected to the eye from the

back facets. Rays so reflected are also bent and scattered, resulting in the beautiful play of color called "fire." Proportions and cutting are more important to the brilliance and beauty of your diamond than perfection and color. No matter how perfect or colorless the gem may be, it will not have maximum brilliance unless it has been cut in correct proportion.
