

Babes Open '54 Year Tomorrow

The Idaho Yearlings, hit by injuries and lack of depth, open the 1954 home football season tomorrow afternoon at Neale Stadium at 1 p.m. against the University of Washington.

Coach Clem Parberry was still unsure of his starting team as of yesterday but indicated the team would have little depth beyond the first team or so.

"The fellows are working hard," the coach said, "and I'm sure they'll make a good account of themselves."

Parberry said the Babes will do about the same amount of passing and running against the Husky pups. It is the first game for both teams.

The Babes knocked heads the hardest Wednesday night in a scrimmage session. Defense has been the most worked upon fundamental in the two and a half weeks of practice prior to the opener.

The Idaho yearlings will be missing two linemen, the right guard and right tackle, Jerry Haller and Bob Prestel, both of Indianapolis, Ind. Haller has a neck injury, suffered in practice Monday and Prestel is still bothered by an ankle sprain.

Wade Patterson of Moscow is also on the doubtful list with a charley horse. Patterson was figured upon to start at left end.

Last night the team scrimmaged against dummies, worked on handoffs and passing. Jim Green, Delta, Ohio, and Gary Kenworthy of Spokane are figured upon to carry the brunt of the quarterbacking chores.

Shiffs Vinson, a Pasco, Wash., quarterback, has been shifted to left halfback, the coach said Wednesday and is pressing for the starting left half position.

Should Patterson be unable to start at end, Parberry will call on Dennis Ambrose of Jerome and Tony Anderson, Wahpeton, N. D., to share the role.

Parberry was not sure of the starting club last night but tentatively set the following starting club: Patterson, if ready, and Larry Aldrich, 6-4 of Vineland, N. J., at ends; Jerry Kramer, Sandpoint and Dick Nearepts, Pasco, Wash., at tackles; Jerry Smythe, Burley, and Larry Kline, Portland, Ore., at guards; Bill Skinner, Holyoke, Mass., at center.

Green or Kenworthy at quarterback; Larry Norby, Rupert and Dan Davis, Twin Falls, at halfbacks and either George Pugh, Wallace, or Dick Wisdom, Boise, at fullback.

The starting line will weigh an average of 209 pounds and the backfield will scale 185.

Biggest men on the club are the starting tackles, Nearepts at 230 and Kramer at 220.


The loss of Haller and Prestel makes a small line squad even thinner for the game and Parberry feels that some of his starters will have to be 60 minute men.

Others who will definitely see action are linemen Wayne Walker, center; Jerry Ross and Ron Pound, guards, Harry Hogberg, tackle and John Cranston and Jim Munds, ends. Backs include half Larry McCulloch, Dick Shern and Vinson.

Thirty-five will suit for the game. Athletic Director Bob Gibb said the game will be handled similar to any varsity contest with regular press coverage, cheer section and one dollar adult admission charges.

The frosh play a three game slate this season meeting WSC at Pullman next Friday and Montana here Nov. 12 to close out the season.

Sweet Wins In Rematch Thumping Sigma Nu 12-6

Led by a fine passing attack the strong Willis Sweet team captured the intramural touch football championship by downing a stubborn Sigma Nu team yesterday by a 12 to 6 score.

The game was the second between the two teams as Sigma Nu protested the first game also won by Willis Sweet 18 to 6 because of the use of an ineligible player by Sweet.

Sweet showed their superiority on the ground as well as in the air as they picked up a total of eight first downs while holding the vaunted Sigma Nu attack to only four first downs.

Sweet scored first after an exchange of pass interceptions when Jerry Dougherty passed 25 yards to Dick Denney who ran the remaining 20 yards for the score. This scoring play came with approximately eight minutes gone in the opening half. An attempted pass play by Dougherty for the extra point was incomplete.

Willis second score came five minutes later when Sweet's big end Gene Lofdahl intercepted a Rees pass and ran 35 yards for the touchdown. A running play for the extra point was not good and Willis Sweet led 12 to 0 at the half.

At the opening of the second half both clubs battled across the mid-field stripe and it wasn't until the closing minutes of the contest that Sigma Nu scored.

Short passes to Maggard, Wheeler and Powell, put Sigma Nu on the Sweet 25 yard line where a Rees to Powell pass brought them down to the 13 yard line of Willis Sweet. Sigma Nu scored on second down when Rees, running the club from his quarterback slot, lateralled out to Powell who passed to Dean Bent who in turn ran the ball over for the score. This play took place just as the whistle ended the game. An attempted pass for the extra point went incomplete leaving the final score at 12 to 6.

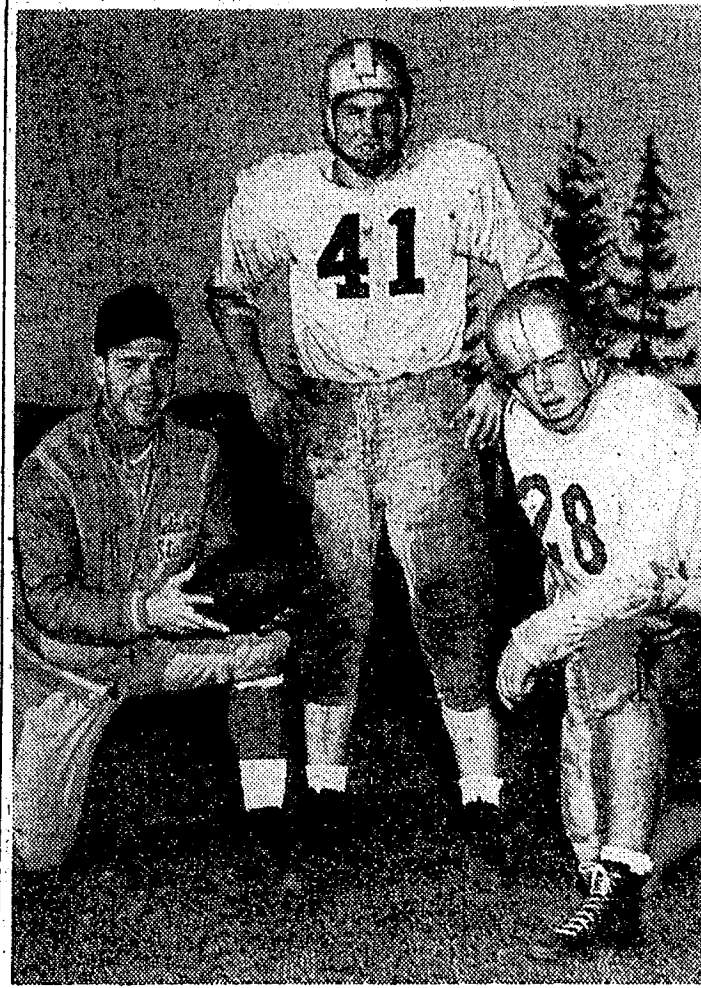

Coach Skip Stahley poured it on the Vandals this week in practice in preparation for tomorrow's meeting at Salt Lake with the Utah Redskins. The Vandals, victors over WSC a week ago, "came down out of the clouds to get ready for Utah" this past week with three scrimmage sessions and individual positions meetings.

Stahley said the Vandals will have to buckle down Saturday to win. Utah dumped Oregon earlier in the season 7-6 at Eugene.

Despite a fine showing Saturday Stahley announced several lineup changes for the Redskin game. Changes will be made at tackle, ends and at left halfback.

Pete Gerpehede and Ed Hilder, sophomores, will start at ends for the Vandals, Dick Foster at right tackle, and Mel Schmidt at left halfback. Otherwise the Vandals will be the same as against the Cougars.

Jerry Leigh, tackle, Burdette Hess and John Armitage, guards and Ed Barton, center, are senior line starters. George Eldam will go at quarterback and Bill Lawr, halfback and Wilbur Gary, fullback, round out the backfield.

Stahley said Ted Frostenson will see plenty of action at left halfback slot. The coach gives Schmidt the nod on offense and Frostenson on defense.

Utah runs from a T formation with wing flankers and have stuck to the ground most of the season. Stahley says scouting reports show Utah has run about 75 per cent of the time against their opponents.


