'Old Faithful' Due For Relief Soon

Relief is now on the way, but "Old Faithful," Well No. 1 at the University of Idaho, is once more gushing water alone, and it looks like a dry summer for campus lawns.

President D. R. Theophilus reported today that the regents had approved an emergency expenditure of about \$3,000 to install a sand trap unit for water flowing from Well No. 2. This four-year-old well, which pumps about 1,000 gallons a minute, had to be shut down recently because of the sand in the water. That left Old Faithful, drilled many years ago, going it alone at the rate of 500 gallons a minute.

"The way the water level has been gradually going down each year in this area, we can't be sure just how long Well No. 1 will be faithful," said George Gagon, University engineer. "It is now supplying domestic needs, but we don't have any water to spare for
