

YAF Combines Forces With Young Democrats

Students Print Literary Mag For Students

Recently a group of students on the Idaho campus banded together and produced a publication called the "YI."

The students, many of them campus-politicians, and pseudo-intellectuals, have produced a quite admirable literary magazine containing many interesting articles, and pieces of fiction. The most notable of the pieces of fiction was the last article in the "YI", entitled "Second Trip," which was probably one of the most entertaining novelettes ever published. Author Ben Kibblen certainly deserves to be complimented on his mastery of the short novel technique.

Reportedly some 420 copies of the last issue were sold, with a \$30 loss being taken by the non-political group sponsoring the magazine. Kibblen reported that some organizational meetings were going to have to be held though before the next issue because some of the candidates of a campus political party had claimed the magazine as their own in the last election, and this may hurt its reputation.

He also reported that he is looking for people who are "dogmatically conceited" in their opinions to write the "opinionated" editorials that the magazine is famous for. Anyone interested should contact him.

Some investigative reporting by the Argonaut revealed that a printing press is being set up in the basement of Downham Hall so that the magazine can be printed without the fear of administration censorship.

In a surprise move yesterday the Idaho chapter of the Young Americans For Freedom combined forces with the Young Democrats supposedly to combat intellectual competition being received from such organizations and people as the Dames Club, AAPU, Sulton Lewis, IV, and the publishing company selling "Sen. Joseph McCarthy's Memoirs," or "How To Be a Radical In The Guise of Conservatism."

The move came after the YAF had made an unsuccessful bid to gain control of the Young Republicans but had been refuted by "liberals who have no damn business being in the Republican Party."

Idaho Is Picked For Bad Blood

Word was received here today that the University of Idaho has been selected as the only major institution of higher learning to participate in a "Get Out The Bad Blood Drive."

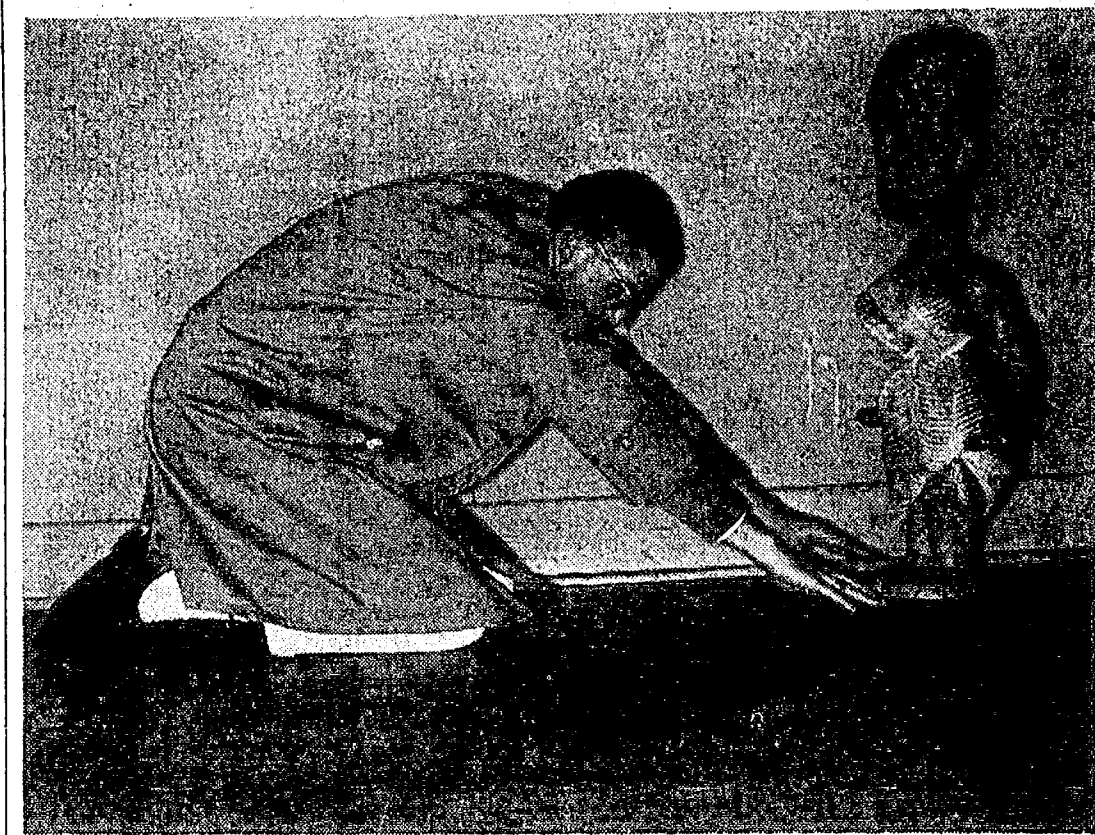

Sin-In-Life Conference Will Open In Arboretum

New SUB No Longer Stands; Collapses During First Dance

The new \$2.4 million Student Union Building addition, completed only three days ago after two years of work, collapsed last night in the midst of the SUB Housewarming Dance and opening ceremonies. To the embarrassment of SUB officials, 231 students were killed.

"Boy, do I feel silly," said ASUI General Manager Gale Hix, laughing nervously. "We thought

we had that thing constructed pretty well."

The entire building collapsed into the basement, and Hix said the building is a total loss. "Maybe we can use the basement for a big swimming pool or something," he commented hopefully.

The well-attended dance was held on the third floor of the new addition, and when the floor collapsed everyone suddenly

plunged to the basement.

An investigation of the catastrophe revealed that the builders of the structure had accidentally had the formula for mixing cement for the building's main pillars switched with an Art Department formula for making plaster of Paris.

Coeds Too Fat
"The pillars just collapsed when they started playing this

real 'stomp' song," Hix said. "I think the floor might have been able to stand the strain a few months ago, but, well, you know how hefty some of the Idaho coeds get about this time of year."

The mishap occurred at 10:15 p.m., and the rest of the evening was spent fishing bodies out from under the tons of rubble. The orchestra playing for the dance had become quite drunk during the evening, witnesses said, and wasn't even aware that the building had collapsed.

"It was kinda funny," one bystander commented. "Here was this big pile of rubble in the basement, and underneath it all you could hear were the faint sounds of tubas, oboes and piccolos. Somebody finally went down and told the orchestra that the dance had been interrupted."

The collapse, of course, also took a number of other persons by surprise. "Here I was making out with my girl in the corner," one bystander recalled, "and all of a sudden I heard her hollering at me from three floors down. Then, the Wurlitzer fell on her and she shut up."

Mullellen Irked
ASUI President Jim Mullellen was working late in his office on the first floor when the accident took place. According to the president, "suddenly 14 people, two desks, four chairs, a couple of tables, a TV set, three typewriters, a tuba and a root beer float came crashing through the ceiling into my office."

"The hell of it was, my cigar got put out," he added bitterly.

Hix wasn't sure how the SUB could be replaced since student funds had been depleted by construction of the last SUB. He added, however, that the ASUI had managed to purchase an out-house from a Latah County farmer and was presently in the midst of plans to expand the structure. "We're gonna have to air it out, too," he stated.

Two 'Diverse' Lectures Set

"The Microscopic Measurements of Enlarged Ultraviolet Semi-nuclear Radioactivity Particles on the Pimple," will be discussed tonight by Dr. Philipo C. Dumas, of the biological sciences department, at the regular meeting of the Faculty Farceum.

Dumas made an extensive research paper on this topic when he was a freshman undergraduate at the Michigan Pimple Testing Center. A question and answer session will follow the diverse lecture.

Dr. M. M. Runthrough, chairman of the chemistry department, will present the first in a three series how-to-do-it-yourself program tomorrow night when he will tell the members of the Faculty Farceum, "How to Blow Up the World With a Book of Matches and a Bottle of Nitro-glycerin."

All faculty members attending are asked to bring their dinner, breakfast and lunch in a sack, since both lecturers are noted for their verbosity.

Gus Corridor Speaker At HHC Workshop Plus Politicians

The banquet will conclude a two-day workshop on various phases of political activity. **Welch Will Speak**

R. J. Sullen will inform students on the techniques of holding secret Executive Board meetings and getting away with it.

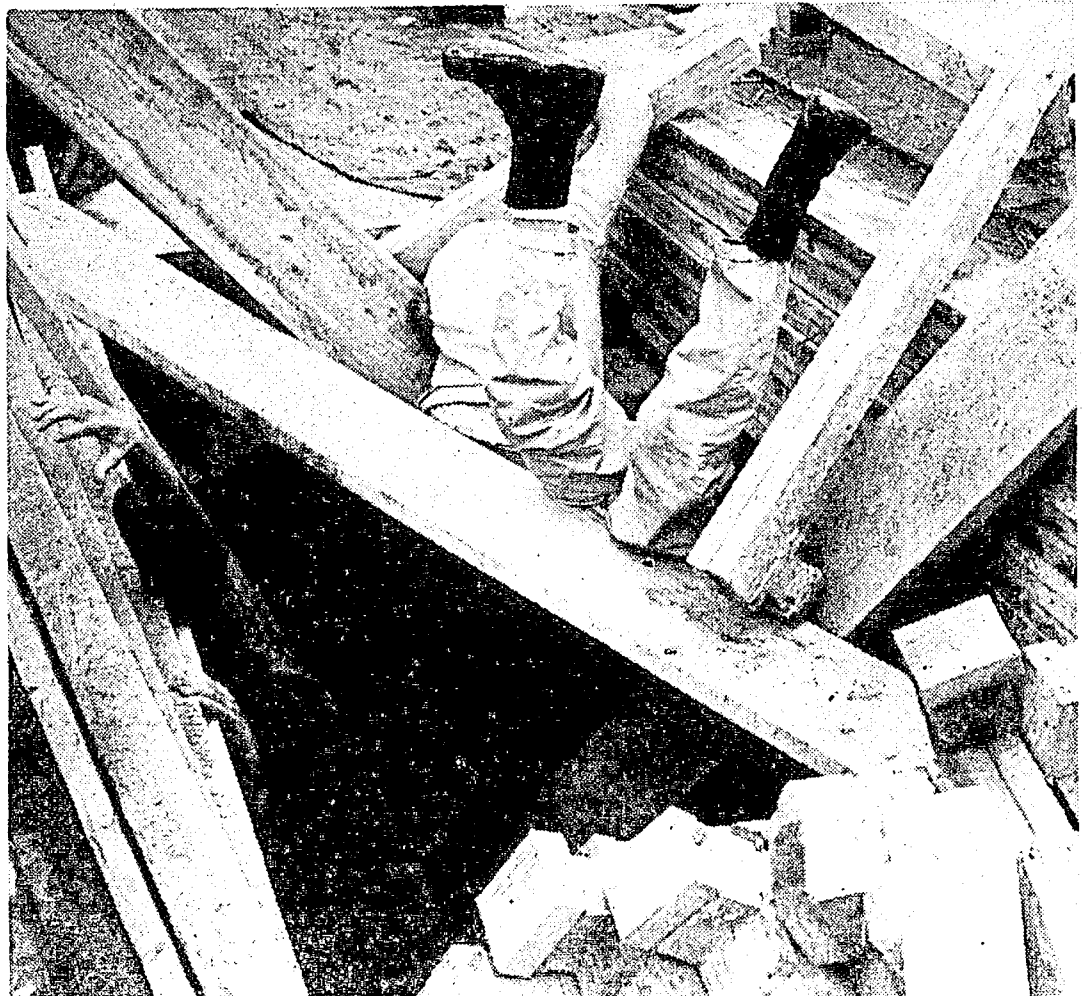
