Professor injured in pedestrian-auto accident

A 63-year-old geology professor from was hit by a car Tuesday night in front of the Student Union and University Bookstore.

Peter Siems of Moscow was transported by ambulance to Gritman Medical Center. Siems remains at the hospital where he is listed in stable condition. Siems suffered a broken leg and minor head injuries as a result of the incident.

The driver of the car was 18-year-old Lynn Ann Braaten, of Moscow. She and her passenger, another UI student, were traveling north on Deakin Avenue in a blue 1983 Honda when the accident happened.

"We didn't see him," said the passenger. The passenger said the car was going between 10 and 15 miles per hour and the headlights were turned on.

UI student Mike Igelman heard the brakes and turned around after the man fell over. He said he saw Siems close to the sidewalk and

inside the crosswalk area.

"I could see his forehead looked red and had a big cut," Igelman said. "That was all I could see."

Igelman said the accident was frightening. "It could have been me," he said.

Several other people came to the aid of Siems before the police arrived, but no one remained for questioning.

Police said Braaten has been cited with failure to yield the right of way to a pedestrian in a crosswalk.

Budget battle affects student aid

Government employees went back to work, but the budget battle continues. And it affects student aid funds.

The UI is one of 1,400 institutions participating in the new Direct Loan Program, which may be eliminated by Congress' budget bill. The DLP has replaced the old Stafford Loan Program, reducing the student loan paperwork and making funds available faster.

"It just has simplified it and reduced the cost," said Daniel Davenport, director of admissions and student financial aid.

Under the old program, students filled out an application and their loan eligibility was determined. They then found a financial institution to make the loan and filled out a loan form for verification from UI.

The form was returned to the financial institution, which secured the loan through a guarantee agency. The lender sent a check for

the student to UI. The student then signed the loan over to the college, Davenport said.

The new program has students fill out an application, and their loan eligibility is determined. They sign a promissory note and the money is credited to their student account. Instead of going through a bank and using a guarantee agency, the money is drawn down from the federal treasury, Davenport said.

"It's just cutting out the middleman," he said. In either case, the funds are guaranteed by the government. Under the Stafford program, if a student defaults and the guarantee agency cannot collect money from the student in 120 days, the government repays 98 percent of the loan. Then the guarantee agency has another chance to try to collect, and if they do, they get another 27 percent, Davenport said.

But Republicans in Congress want less government involvement in the loan process. With the DLP, the Department of Education has complete control over the student

loan program, said Khris Bershers, press secretary for Rep. Helen Chenoweth.

Republicans want to cut government bureaucracy and downsize the Dept. of Education. They also think that privatizing the loan process will eventually provide better loan rates, access and funds, Bershers said. Davenport doesn't think that will happen.

"The students are the ones who will pay for it—the students and the institutions, but particularly the students," Davenport said. Some students see it differently.

"In the long run, we're going to look back and say, 'Yeah, it was a sacrifice, but it was for a larger goal,'" said Damon Darakjy, state chairman of College Republicans.

Proponents of the DLP have formed the Alliance to Save Student Aid. They have established a hotline to inform the White House of student concerns and encourage the President to veto any proposal which would eliminate the DLP. The hotline number is 1-800-574-4243.

Sylvester's fills Moscow shopping void

Shopaholics start your engines. Sylvester's Bargain Emporium opened its doors Nov. 16, 1995. The Moscow clothing store is the latest addition to the Sylvester chain, headquartered in Grand Rapids, Minn.

"Sylvester's is a brand-name clothing store, and we have a lot of brands that you probably don't see in Moscow...and they're at discount prices," explained Joni Hendee, assistant manager of the Moscow store. "This is a family-owned chain which started in Minnesota," Hendee added.

"It's not a big corporation. It's a personable, family-owned busi-

ness," said Steve Faacks, Sylvester's regional manager in a recent interview with Ad-Mart magazine. The Moscow store is the 10th outlet in the Sylvester chain, which owns stores in Minnesota and Montana.

"I think they thought it would be a good location because of all the college students," Hendee said. "They really didn't have this kind of store here in Moscow. We also have a lot of people coming from Pullman and Lewiston," Hendee explained.

The Palouse Mall is Sylvester's main competition, but Hendee is not worried, "because no other store carries all the name-brands we have." The store is currently

located in the former Jeff's Foods building, on the Pullman Road.

Response to the new store has been "great, especially from students and senior citizens." The store carries many type of clothes for men, women and children.

Sylvester's has currently hired about a dozen full and part-time employees. "Everybody we hire—manager, assistant manager, department managers and sales associates—will be hired locally," Faacks explained.

You may see more Sylvester's in the area soon, Hendee said. "I think that's why they started out here," to get their feet wet in the northwest. "There's going to be a lot more Sylvester's around this area."

Hair salon subject of racist arson attack

IDAHO FALLS—A little more than a week ago, Chadd Wheelington and his wife opened a hair salon on Idaho Falls' west side, realizing a lifetime dream.

Sunday, Little Mac's Styling Center was in ashes, destroyed by an arsonist the couple believes was racially motivated. Left behind in the ashes were spray-painted swastikas and racial slurs on mirrors.

"It hurts," said Wheelington, 27, a black man. Diane Wheelington, 27, who was raised in Idaho Falls, was upset to see that sort of attack in her community. She believes racism is an issue largely ignored in mostly-caucasian Idaho Falls.

The fire caused about \$25,000 in damages to the salon. Neighboring businesses sustained another \$10,000-\$15,000 in smoke damage.

Idaho Falls police are investigating the blaze as arson, but they're checking into the legitimacy of the racial references as a motivation for the crime, said Detective Ken Brown.

Other possibilities have to be looked at, including questioning the owner, he said. "In this type of situation, you look at everyone," Brown said.

Wheelington said he didn't feel he was treated fairly on the day of the fire, when he was threatened with arrest. Officers said Wheelington was very emotional

in early stages of the investigation and obstructed police efforts, said Detective Steve Barnes.

Wheelington said the store was insured and he and his wife plan to rebuild.

Diane Wheelington said she only recently graduated from Excelsior Beauty College in Idaho Falls, where her husband had been a student since 1993 before graduating in February.

Wheelington said the fire is a disturbing escalation in the level of racism he's seen since moving to Idaho Falls to marry his wife about four years ago. He said he has experienced a lot of prejudice.

Racist fliers directed at black people have been distributed in Idaho Falls several times in recent years. Mayor Linda Milam set up a community relations committee. A Washington man also faces a criminal charge of racially harassing the president of the Idaho Falls chapter of the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People.

Craig: Liberal Arts breeds liberal politics

IDAHO FALLS—In Sen. Larry Craig's view, liberal arts breeds liberal politics.

The Craig campaign attacks Boise Democrat Walt Minnick's resume including business and law school degrees from Harvard University in a recent fund-raising letter.

"His ties to the liberal Eastern establishment are rooted in his educational background. He is well-educated, graduating with honors from the Harvard MBA program and the Harvard Law School," the Craig campaign said in a fund-raising memo sent out.

It isn't the first time Harvard-

bashing has become an Idaho campaign tactic, but three years ago, Republican U.S. Rep. Mike Crapo was the alumnus on the defensive.

Gary Glenn, an Ada County Commissioner, made Crapo's Harvard law school degree a recurring soundbite in his unsuccessful 1992 run for the GOP's Republican nomination for Congress.

That irony wasn't lost on Minnick.

The line in Craig's fund-raising letter hints at Minnick's "Eastern attitudes" toward big government and high taxes, a campaign aide said. It suggests no ill will toward Crapo or other alums from Harvard, the nation's oldest university.

Reynoldson, named to run Craig's campaign, isn't sure how the new fund-raising letter has been received. But he says Craig is steadily collecting money for a 1996 run against Minnick, his only announced opponent.

Harvard's Cambridge, Mass., campus has been fertile fodder for many political candidates, not just Craig and Glenn. Some candidates paint the law school as a den of liberalism, a training ground of Kennedys. Others paint it as a breeding ground for button-down, conservative corporate attorneys.

Craig, a member of Congress since 1980, attended the University of Idaho, where he served as student body president. He later took some graduate courses at George Washington University in Washington, D.C.

Minnick received a master's of business administration from Harvard in 1966 and graduated from Harvard's law school in 1969. Before that, he received a bachelor's degree in economics at Whitman College in Walla Walla, Wash., near his family's farm.

Clinton signs highway systems bill

WASHINGTON—President Clinton has signed a National Highway System bill redesignating parts of U.S. 59 in and around Houston as Interstate 69, a major trade highway that eventually will link Montreal and Mexico City.

The president signed the bill Tuesday after wrestling with a provision lifting the 21-year-old national 55-mph speed limit.

Despite misgivings about increased highway fatalities, White House spokesman Mike McCurry said Clinton was concerned that a veto could cost states nearly \$6 billion in highway improvement money.

Texas is expected to raise its speed limit to 70 mph on some interstates and highways when the federal speed limit is dropped, which would occur 10 days after the bill is signed.

"Those who support sending power back to the states have cause to celebrate today," said House Majority Leader Dick Army, R-Irving. "Now when you drive from Dallas to El Paso, the federal government won't be riding shotgun with you."


The National Highway System bill approved earlier this month by Congress includes the U.S. 59 language inserted by Rep. Tom DeLay, a Republican from Sugar Land.

Portions of U.S. 59 in and around Houston that meet interstate standards will be designated as I-69, allowing for future upgrades to the so-called NAFTA superhighway.

Russia appoints Bosnian representative

MOSCOW—Russia has appointed its representative in Bosnia in a bid to establish full diplomatic ties between the two countries, a news agency said Wednesday.

Yakov Gerasimov, 49, is a career diplomat who has been dealing with the former Yugoslavia in Russia's Foreign ministry. Gerasimov left for Sarajevo Wednesday, ITAR-Tass said.

An agreement to establish diplomatic relations between the two countries was reached during Bosnian Prime Minister Haris Silajdzic's visit to Moscow last February, it said.

Two women executed in China scandal

BEIJING—Two women were executed Wednesday for their roles in one of the worst swindles in modern China, a case that reportedly involves the capital's disgraced leadership.

The two were among six found guilty of using the Xinxing Industrial Corp. in Wuxi, 620 miles south of Beijing, to raise \$385 million fraudulently, the official Xinhua News Agency reported.

The case is one of the most serious to come to light in a three-year anti-graft campaign launched by the ruling Communist Party. Xinhua called it "the worst case of its kind in China."

At least one official in the Beijing municipal government is reported to have ties to Xinxing. The city government already is reeling from corruption scandals in its highest ranks.

Wednesday's announcement by the Supreme People's Court of the executions gave no indication whether charges were pending against any top officials in the capital.

Deng Bin, 58, Xinxing's general manager, and Yao Jingyi, 54, were executed in Wuxi. A third accomplice was given a suspended death sentence, and three others were given prison terms of 20, 10 and 4 years.

The nationally televised evening news showed footage of the trial, as well as shots of a room crammed with purportedly confiscated goods, including bottles of expensive liquor, electronics, gold ingots and Chinese furniture.

Deng allegedly repaid principal and interest with newly acquired funds and invested the money elsewhere, eventually causing Xinxing to lose \$144 million. Deng also accepted bribes and embezzled funds totaling nearly \$1 million, the television news report said.

Hong Kong news reports have said that Li Min, a deputy chief of Beijing's security bureau and a former aide to Beijing Mayor Li Qiyuan, was arrested for his ties to Xinxing.

Photographer linked to 1992 model slaying, murder probe finds

LOS ANGELES—A photographer charged with murdering a model was linked Wednesday to the slaying of another blonde whose remains were found in the same forest in 1993.

Investigators are also looking at other unsolved murders around the country for links to the photographer, Charles Rathbun.

Rathbun, 38, led investigators to the body of Linda Sobek in the Angeles National Forest on Nov. 24, two days after claiming he accidentally ran over the former Los Angeles Raiders cheerleader and buried her in a panic.

Another model, 20-year-old Kimberly Pandelios, was also dumped in the 1,000-square-mile forest, about five miles from Sobek's makeshift grave.

Her skeleton was found by a hiker in 1993, a year after she disappeared.

Rathbun "is a suspect in that case," Sheriff Sherman Block said.

Block said the task force investigating the Sobek killing is also looking at slayings in other states.

Sobek, 27, disappeared Nov. 16.

Preliminary autopsy results cast doubt on Rathbun's claim that Sobek was run over by a car. The Sobek family was told the model was asphyxiated, but an official cause of death hasn't been announced.

UNICEF sells cards and gifts for kids around the world

Outside of the food court at the Student Union for three days this week Christmas cards and gifts were on sale. The cards and gifts are part of a fund raiser for UNICEF which raises money for the world's children in need.

Dorothy Thomas, from the Moscow Committee for UNICEF said about all of the students that have stopped by, "It's good to know students are interested in UNICEF."

Thomas said, "It is always encouraging to come here." The first day the table was set up a lot of students stopped by to look and buy some of the gifts and cards.

"It's a nice combination to have both students and community involved; it strengthens the program." Thomas said.

The program was started in 1946 as the United Nations International Children's Emergency Fund which helped a generation of European and Chinese children recover from World War II. In 1950, UNICEF changed to focus on children in developing countries.

Now UNICEF works in 140 countries to help provide the children of the world with health care, clean water, improved nutrition and education.


"Under 10 percent of the children were vaccinated (prior to UNICEF's founding), now 80 percent are." Thomas said.

UNICEF sells Christmas cards and gifts to raise money to fund their cause. Only 10 percent of the profits go to overhead with 40 percent of the profits going directly to the program.

This year Thomas estimated that the Moscow UNICEF chapter will send about \$600 to the program.

The Moscow UNICEF program sells these gifts every year for three days at the Student Union here on campus, as well as in various Moscow churches and at market time.

Thomas said that the Moscow community

becomes very involved in UNICEF's efforts. "It becomes part of peoples' thinking."

Christmas cards are donated by artists. Thomas said it is a really big asset for UNICEF to receive do many donated designs.

Thomas said, "The amazing thing is the people volunteering to help even though it is a busy time of the year." Thomas added that the Moscow UNICEF has 25 volunteers

working on UNICEF projects.

UNICEF of Moscow gets help from all over, especially area churches. Students can support UNICEF by buying cards and gifts or volunteering to help sell these items.

Thomas said, "It's great to be a part of the total thing, even though it seems we are a long way from the action."



Metallurgy and mining engineering students will be given an opportunity to make job and internship contacts through the efforts of the Northwest Mining Convention Dec. 5 through 8.

The 101st Annual Convention will be held in the Spokane Convention and Agriculture center with help from The Materials Information Society. Those attending the convention will include members of the department of metallurgy and mining engineering

from UI and representatives from mining companies, equipment dealers and other related organizations. Each organization will have their own booth.

"Each day a member from metallurgy and another from mining will be available to answer questions," said Craig L. Shaber a metallurgical engineering major. "About 11 people from University of Idaho will go to the convention."

Dr. Patrick R. Taylor, head of the metallurgy and mining engineering department, explained UI has three goals for its involvement with the convention.

"We want to make people aware that students are available for employment in related fields, show that UI has a good undergraduate program and emphasize the research capability of UI's metallurgy department."

UI students and faculty have worked hard to prepare for the upcoming convention. Displays were made for the booth and appropriate people were obtained to provide UI metallurgy and mining information to the public.

"The meeting is usually very large," said Taylor. "In the past people from Nevada, Colorado and

Montana have attended. The convention is a great opportunity for all of the schools and companies to get together and share ideas."

Over 300 U.S. and foreign exhibits are featured every year. The exhibitors range from AT&T to Wildlife Control Technologists. There are also short courses offered by the Northwest Mining Association.

"The convention will give a lot of exposure to UI students," said Shaber. "Students will have an opportunity to meet people and develop job contacts they never could have otherwise."

New core requirement proposed to expose diversity

Promoting cultural diversity on campus has taken a new direction this year as the Office of Multicultural Affairs seeks to expose undergraduates to different cultures as part of the required curricula.

Director of Multicultural Affairs, Dr. Linda Morris, speaking about the issue in a recent meeting of the Faculty Council, said she would like to see diversity oriented classes added to the core and urged members of that organization to address the issue as part of an ongoing effort to update general education

requirements at the university.

Currently, said Morris, there is no exposure to diversity requirement for graduation. Diversity classes currently available that can be used to meet the humanities requirements, such as History 313; Red, White and Black: the peopling of early North America, are not required.

"It is possible," said Morris, "to graduate without ever taking any courses on diversity."

"All of the schools that I know of require such courses for graduation," said Morris. One of such schools Morris used as an example is the of New York State University, Buffalo which requires

students to complete a course on cultural pluralism as part of its general education requirement for graduation.

WSU has a diversity requirement as well, though, Morris said she used the New York model as a possible guideline for UI.

Should UI decide to make such a move it would first have to pass through the University Committee for General Education and the University Curriculum Committee before becoming an issue for Faculty Council.

One of the goals said Morris, is to implement the diversity curricula without adding to the overall credit load of the core. The problem then

is what could be cut in order to introduce the new program, while keeping the general education requirement from losing some vital area of study.

For the time being, at least, the Office of Multicultural Affairs and its multicultural student organizations will continue to promote diversity, as in the past, by sponsorship of extracurricular activities. Events such as Hispanic Heritage Month, Cinco de Mayo and Black History Month provide students with the opportunity to learn about other cultures while bolstering cultural pride of campus minorities, said Morris.

Jupiter probe flying silent approach

NASA's unmanned Galileo Probe is flying towards Jupiter at nearly 18,000 mph. When the probe hits Jupiter's atmosphere on Dec. 7, it will be travelling over 100,000 mph; 50 times faster than a speeding bullet.

Jupiter's hydrogen-helium atmosphere will slow the probe down to 1,000 mph in the first minute of entry. The probe will release two parachutes, drop its heat shield and deploy scientific instruments two minutes into entry.

The probe will establish contact with the Galileo Orbiter, more than 200,000 km above Jupiter's atmosphere three minutes after entry.

"The scary thing about the probe mission is there are so many things happening, so quickly, and they have to happen exactly at the right time," says David Atkinson, associate professor of electrical engineering at the University of Idaho. "People are getting nervous. It has to hit the atmosphere at exactly the right angle. It is the most involved entry into planetary atmosphere anyone has ever tried."

Atkinson worked on the Galileo Probe as a NASA engineer from 1980 to 1986 and is the principle investigator of the Doppler Wind Experiment. The experiment is one of eight to be conducted by the probe inside Jupiter's atmosphere.

The Doppler Wind Experiment will record wind speed and direction as the probe descends into the atmosphere. Meanwhile, seven

instruments aboard the probe will record atmospheric composition, lightning activity, cloud formations, temperature, pressure, sunlight and heat readings.

Probe information will be sent to the orbiter and stored. However, difficulties with a data-storing tape recorder last month has raised concern. "They think the tape stuck on one of the heads," says Atkinson. "Because of nervousness about the tape recorder, they will not turn it on until the probe mission begins."

The original approach plan called for imaging of Jupiter's moons Europa and Io. With the tape recorder off, no pre-probe science will be conducted.

"The probe is silent right now," Atkinson said. "The only thing on is a timer counting down to six hours before entry, when it starts waking itself up."

Once the probe hits the atmosphere, it will send data back to the orbiter for 75 minutes. The orbiter will orphan the probe at the end of 75 minutes and return to an outer-orbit around Jupiter, where it will remain forever.

The orbiter's primary mission is to send back data from Jupiter to Earth for two years. NASA may pull the plug on the orbiter after its mission, if there is not enough money to continue.

Atkinson anticipates doing a quick analysis of probe data for a Dec. 19 press conference from the Jet Propulsion Lab in California. "There is a possibility of another government furlough Dec. 15," he




said. "If that happens, I will analyze data (at UI)."

Probe data could keep Atkinson busy a few years. "We should get back the entire data set in bits and pieces from January to May," he said. "My experiment analysis depends not only on my data, but also from the atmosphere extraction data."

NASA television coverage of the probe mission is scheduled to begin at 1 p.m. on Dec. 7. Coverage can be seen on cable channel 8 in Moscow.


We need to hire 21 writers, an opinion editor, entertainment editor, copy editor, a columnist and one pagination artist.

His short stories are like fragments of sultry and savvy puzzles. The editor of distinguished literary journal *Fiction International* and his readings are performance pieces rather than straightforward oration of text. The man, who verges on the bleeding edge of fiction, is Harold Jaffe.

Jaffe's work has been translated into seven languages.

He is the winner of a number of grants, Jaffe is professor of Creative Writing and Literature at San Diego State University.

"Reading Jaffe is like watching a CNN broad-

cast written by Burroughs and scored by the Sex Pistols. It makes Kathy Acker look like a primpy choir girl," Lance Olsen said.

This reading, sponsored by the creative writing program, marks the fourth and last for the fall semester. Spring readings will begin on Feb. 7, 1996 with an offering by distinguished visiting writer Mary Morris.

Jaffe will be reading in the UI Law Building Courtroom on Wednesday, Dec. 6 at 7:30 p.m. He is an author that should not be missed. This reading promises to be anything but a dull and boring experience. It will be more of an interactive multi-media event in a style that is all style and nothing else.

Who the hell are you?

John talks about his 'Streiff' of life

John Streiff says that in an ideal world we'd treat everyone the same, but this isn't an ideal world, now is it?

No one would know better than Streiff, the self-titled "overlord" of the Gay, Lesbian and Bisexual Alliance, what it feels like to be treated differently.

Streiff is originally from Minnesota but did his undergraduate work at Northern Iowa University in chemistry. With a love for the geography of the Northwest he came with his partner to do his graduate work here at the University of Idaho.

Studying physical chemistry and the philosophies of quantum

mechanics has allowed him to see things with a different view. "The reality of a molecular world is very different than the perceptions of our human world," said Streiff. But Streiff adds that not every human perception is alike either.

While at Northern Iowa, Streiff enjoyed celebrity-hood after coming out of the closet and proclaiming himself as the rare gay member of a Greek organization.

For Streiff it is having people like himself be completely open of their sexual orientation in order to have it accepted.

"If you just ignore it, you are giving in," said Streiff, deciding he wouldn't let the fear of other people determine his choices in life. Although Streiff had figured out he was gay by the time he was in high school, talking to his family and peers wasn't all that easy at first.

"Since college is a time for everyone to find themselves and live a comfortable lifestyle, it was easy to avoid telling my family," says Streiff. But when the day of coming out came, his family was accepting and Streiff has never had any problems with friends accepting who he is. Of course, Streiff attributes that to the quality of the friends he does have. They are more open-minded than most. As a teaching assistant of over 80 freshmen and sophomores every year the fact that he is gay usually is undertalk

of discussion, but the whispers eventually turn into acceptance as soon as the novelty wears off and people find out he is just a normal human being.

Streiff simply doesn't understand the Kelly Waltons of the world. "I'm not sure what his motives really are," says Streiff. "Many people don't realize that we don't enjoy the civil rights that they do."

When people ask Streiff why he couldn't just keep to himself about his orientation he gets upset. "What they're doing is asking me to lie," says Streiff. "We don't ask them to not talk about their own family life. They should just put themselves in our shoes."

Streiff has recently been trying to find the roots of the GLBA here on campus. The group has gone through its transitions since it was introduced around 1970. In the '80s the groups went through sporadic budget changes. Streiff

But his group of about 20 members is very active in making themselves visible.

The GLBA currently have a homepage on the Internet listed under Student Organizations on the campus page. The group gets involved with tables at every chance they can; during Palousafest, National Coming Out Day and the Student Health Center for example. The GLBA also has a helpline for students that want to discuss anything or have questions about the alliance.

Since many gays have to do a lot of soul searching to identify who they are, Streiff believes his group to be insightful, well-read and traveled.

"Straight or not, though, everyone is entitled to human," says Streiff. The purpose of his group is to provide support for its members and educate the community about their existence.

"Whether people are offended by the posters we hang, the fact is that we exist whether they are pinned up or not," says Streiff.

UI spikers fall in NCAA tourney



In the Pacific Northwest when the going is bad the old adage says "pray for rain." The Idaho Vandals could have used a freak midwest natural disaster to stave off elimination from the NCAA Volleyball Tournament in a 15-13, 15-5, 15-10 road loss to the Iowa State Cyclones Wednesday.

The Cyclones (22-11) looked like a team on a mission after coming back from a slim 13-11 deficit in game one. The Cyclones led 11-6 in the first game only to see the Vandals storm back to take the lead before falling. Iowa State jumped out to a 6-1 edge in the second game and was never really threatened again.

Idaho (28-5) didn't die off easily, fighting to a 10-10 tie late in game three, but the Ames, Iowa school reeled off the last five points of the game en-route to victory.

The Cyclones, who finished second in the Big-8 Conference to top-ranked Nebraska, owned the net, outhitting the Vandals .236 to .072 and blocking the UI crew 17-1. Idaho managed its only block midway through the third game. The Vandals put down 47 kills,

but were forced into 37 hitting errors in the match. Despite the weak offensive output, the Vandals outgub the Cyclones 64-47.

"Their blocking was exceptional tonight," Idaho coach Tom Hilbert said. "It was the major difference in the match and our hitting efficiency reflected that. We were not really mentally sharp and I don't think we handled this road trip exceptionally well."

UI seniors Lina Yanchulova and Sarah Toomey played well in their final games as Vandals. Yanchulova led Idaho with 15 kills and 23 digs while Toomey, the defensive specialist, con-

tributed 13 digs in back row action.

Zags drop Vandals in season debut

It's very hard to win a basketball game if you don't have the ball, as the Idaho women's basketball team proved Tuesday night in a heartbreaking 62-58 loss to the Gonzaga Bulldogs in a non-conference game.

With the score tied 29-29 at halftime, Idaho jumped out of the gates in a hurry with a 10-2 run. Idaho's Jennifer Stone, a true freshman from Craigmont, Idaho, made a short jumper to give Idaho a 39-31 lead. Mindy Rice, who led the Vandals in first half scoring with eight points, picked up her fourth foul with just under 12 minutes to play in the game.


Idaho's lead was cut to 51-48 before Gonzaga's Amy Jo Silva took over. The Ephrata, Wash. native scored five unanswered points to give the Bulldogs a 53-51 lead with 5:00 remaining. After a couple of missed opportunities, the Vandals took the lead on Kelli Johnson's trey to put the score at 54-53. Idaho upped its lead to three on a lay-in by Michelle Greenwood. Gonzaga bounced right back on a three-pointer by Joy Pauley who led all scorers with 20. Gonzaga's Chelsea Herman made two free throws with 15 seconds left to set the final at 62-58. Idaho had the chance to cut into the score, but an errant in-bounds pass from Johnson was intercepted to seal the win for Gonzaga.

The Bulldogs upped their mark to 1-2 behind the scoring of Pauley and Silva who had 20 and 11 points respectively.

Idaho was once again led in scoring by Johnson. The Moscow native poured in four three-pointers and added a couple of free throws to finish with 14 points while playing all 40 minutes. Ari Skorpik was the only other Vandal to reach double figures with 11. Rice finished with nine points and eight rebounds after getting into foul trouble midway through the second half. Stone came off of the bench to score six points and grab six rebounds in just 20 minutes of play.

The Vandals were hampered by cold shooting from the charity stripe, hitting a meager 4-11 from the line, or just 36 percent. Both teams shot fairly well from the field as the Vandals finished at an even 40 percent on 24-60 shooting, while the Bulldogs connected on 25-56 shots (44.6 percent) of their shot attempts.

Idaho played Lewis-Clark State Thursday, however results were not available by press time.

Last season's losing ways in past for UI cagers



Last season the University of Idaho men's basketball team suffered its first losing season (12-15) since 1985-86. This year is UI's last dance in the Big Sky before it bolts for the greener pastures of the Big West Conference. The Vandals hope to go out with a bang—perhaps a Big Sky title.

"I think we have a talented enough team to contend for the title this year," third-year head coach Joe Cravens said. "It will come down to how many close games we can win."

Idaho returns three starters in forwards Nate Gardner and Harry Harrison and guard Shawn Dirden.

Harrison, a 6-foot 7-inch power forward from Brunswick, Ga., muscled his way to a league best 10.9 rebounds and 11.9 points per game.

In addition, the honorable mention all-conference pick shot 55 percent from the field, but his production fell as the season concluded.

"Harry just wore down at the end of the year," Cravens said. "If he can play the whole season the way he did the first half of the season last year, he's got a chance to be the best player in the league."

The 6-foot-3-inch senior guard, Dirden, caught fire last season once he earned a starting position. The

Denver, Colo. native finished 11th in the Big Sky in scoring at 13.6 points per game. Dirden is expected to be the go-to-guy this year, much like last year's leading scorer Mark Leslie, whose eligibility is up. The 1995-96 Vandals only lost Leslie and guards Benji Johnson and Todd Spike.

The flamboyant Gardner is in his third season of action. In 1994-95, the 6-foot 9-inch center averaged 9.0 points and 6.1 rebounds per game.

"Our returning players all have a chance to be all-league players and are capable of filling Mark's role," Cravens said.

New faces and added depth might provide the winning combination, however. Last year junior forward James Jones was the leading scorer off the bench, averaging a paltry 3.9 points per game. Early last season Jones was penciled in the starting lineup, but lost his position after 11 games. The 6-foot-7-inch Tuscaloosa, Ala. native was one of the top scorers for Idaho during the

exhibition season and in UI's Hungarian basketball expedition during the summer.

"It's a safe conclusion to say that J.J. really improved a lot during the trip (to Hungary)," Cravens said.

Junior college transfers Jason Jackman, Eddie Turner, Reggie Rose and Marvin Thomas will all see action this year.

"We really improved our overall talent level," said Cravens, who has a 30-25 record at UI. "Reggie, Eddie and Jason are three guys that are all capable of scoring 20. It's not just depth we gained, but quality depth."

Jackman played in 27 of 28 games his freshman year at Utah, averaging 5.2 points and 3.9 rebounds per game. Cravens said the 6-foot-10-inch Jackman, who played at Dixie Junior college his sophomore year, could average double figures in rebounding.

Turner averaged a team-high 18.4 points for North Idaho College last year and was a second team all-region and first team all-regional

tournament pick. The 6-foot-3-inch guard hails from Seattle.

One of Idaho's most versatile newcomers is Rose, a 6-foot guard from Chicago. He averaged 15 points, four rebounds and six assists per game last year at Garden City Community College as well as hitting 81 percent of his free throws.

"He is capable of playing both guard positions," Cravens said. "He's a very good defender, a tough, hard-nosed kid who is mentally tough and a real leader. He's capable of scoring a lot of points in various ways."

The Vandals also return reserve shooting guard Kris Baumann and red-shirt center Bjorn Magnussen. The first seven-footer in Idaho history, freshman David Sturing, will redshirt.

Senior Chad Coates and more recently, sophomore Jared Mercer have quit the team.

Vandals start 2nd year under Holt

Thoughts of a New Year's resolution coming early for the Idaho Vandal women's basketball team are readily becoming more evident, as they have already shown vast improvement from years past.

After finishing a dismal 5-21 last season, the Vandals are showing great improvement over the past two seasons already this fall, after only one game and two exhibitions. Idaho gave itself many opportunities to win in its season opener against Gonzaga Tuesday, but came out on the bottom end of a 62-58 loss.

"We have put ourselves in position to win some games already, whereas last season we weren't usually in the game at the end," Idaho coach Julie Holt said.

Holt, who is in her second season as UI coach, has her team already reaching a plateau that was seldom seen in her rookie season.

"We have greatly improved from a year ago, and for that matter, greatly improved from the Simon Frasier game," added Holt.

With the nucleus of last year's team back, Idaho could be a dark-horse in its last season of Big Sky play, before taking the plunge into the uncharted waters of the Big West.

Mindy Rice returns as Idaho's leading scorer and rebounder from a year ago, averaging 17.3 points per game and 9.5 rebounds in limited time due to volleyball in her 1994-95 campaign. The Grandview, Idaho native should be up for Big Sky honors at the end of the season, as she is able to concentrate solely on one sport this season.

Idaho also returns its second and third leading scorers from a year ago

in Ari Skorplik and Kelli Johnson. Skorplik was second on the team in scoring, averaging 13.3 points per game last year. Johnson averaged just under double figures at 9.2 points per game respectively.

With so many of it's key players back and the addition of Natalie Hawks from Eastern Utah JC, Idaho has put together a solid offensive make-up, but Holt feels her team's success may very well depend on it's improved defense.

"I think we have a chance to be a great defensive team," said Holt.

Defense has definitely improved from last year, as Gonzaga players were constantly hounded by UI defenders Tuesday in attempts to bring the ball up the floor. Holt has instilled the instinct into her players to push the ball handler to their weak hand and exploit it for all it's worth.

Another pleasant surprise has been the play of true-freshman Jennifer Stone from Highland High School. The Craigmont native has shown she can definitely make an impact at this level as well. After leading Highland to a Idaho Class A-4 Championship last season, Stone chose to stay close to home to pursue her college career. She has come off the bench in consecutive games and made an impact for the Vandals. In the Simon Frasier exhibition, Stone tallied 11 points in

just 16 minutes of play and followed that performance with six points and six rebounds in 20 minutes of play against Gonzaga.

With a good foundation heading into this season, the recruiting efforts for next season can't go unnoticed. Holt proved she can land the best talent from Idaho, as well as from the rest of the nation as well. High School all-American candidates Alli Nieman, a post from Sandpoint and Susan Woolf, a point guard from Andover Kan. have signed a letters of intent to play for the Vandals. Nieman is undoubtedly one of the best products to ever come out of the state of Idaho, while Woolf averaged 39.2 points per game as a junior. With these two acquisitions and two more solid recruits, Idaho's move to the Big West could reek havoc on it's new foes.

With the addition of Holt to the program, it would appear there comes a renewed loyalty to in-state talent. With eight of the 13 players on Idaho's roster having their roots firmly planted in their home soil, Holt has shown that she will try her best to keep the local talent just that, local.

"I think that every player in the state of Idaho should attend the best school in the state, and Idaho is the best school in the state," said Holt.

With the top three scorers back from last year's ball club and a strong nucleus to surround them, Idaho could find itself in unfamiliar territory this season, winning. Holt has proven she will coach her team to victory, as evident by her court-side intensity.

"I really enjoy what I'm doing and at times I really get into the game, but if you think about it, that's what I get paid to do," said Holt.

AA last year fell on the first day of finals here at Idaho. I wonder what the NCAA would have done if the mighty Vandals had gone all the way—postpone the game?

Next, athletes at the level of D-I A can't take the rigors of a schedule with 15 or 16 games that a tournament would entail. Okay, so I guess that means our D-I AA athletes are better, great job guys. It makes me sorry we decided to move up to the Big West.

Maybe the problem of formatting the tournament scares people with travel and time considerations involved. Well, isn't that same problem alive and well with other divisions and sports?

Well, we have a history of bowls, we couldn't get rid of history without hurting the game. Probably the only solid reason to save the current system, but then, wouldn't the current bowls prosper even more by having teams like Nebraska and Florida play in two or three of them.

Obviously the system needs help. What can be done, and who should do it?

My suggestion: let the colleges be the ones who vote and make up the bowl coalition. Here's the plan, all the campuses get two votes in the poll, the official poll, the College Sportswriters and Athletic Departments Poll of America. This will be the poll that decides who gets bowl bids, who gets ranked where and who wins the national championship.

Each school's sports reporters would gather, vote and rank the teams in their division with one stipulation, you cannot rank your own school. That way, the people at the games with a more personal stake in the outcome of polls would be involved. Then, the athletic departments would get together and do the same, with the same stipulation. Now we have a system, lets put it in motion.

Schools would vote, just like the reporters do now and the polls would be published. Then, at the year's end, a tournament would begin

using the top 20 teams as ranked by the poll. The teams would be paired of # 1 vs. # 20, # 2 vs. # 19, etc. They would compete through the bowl season that already exists, until on New Years Day you have two teams remaining and boom, national championship.

The benefits, well, small bowls get big name teams. The public sees matchups it finds interesting and the national championship gets decided on the field, not in newsrooms around the country.

I think this could work. Why not, the only thing we would lose would be a system that in the past five years has managed to crown at least two national champions three times. Well, maybe my system is not the best, but hey, at least I tried to solve the problem. I guess that assures me of not getting hired by the NCAA to make any important decisions. Oh well, back to the bowl games. I have a lot to watch if I plan on figuring out who all the national champions will be.

The Big Sky season begins Jan. 12 when the Vandals take on Idaho State in Pocatello.







The Beatles tell their story

Thanksgiving = A turkey dinner with family and friends, or being able to see the story of a great rock and roll band told from their perspective.

The Beatles Anthology, put together by Chips Chipperfield and colleagues over the past three years, documents the fab four from their early days in Liverpool and Hamburg to their bitter break-up in 1970. In all, the anthology featured new interviews with the three remaining members and two new songs.

With all the excitement surrounding the anthology (beginning last summer), I wasn't looking forward to watching it because I didn't know what to expect. Would it be yet another glossed over, slick "rockumentary" on rock 'n roll's greatest band? Or, would it be listening to middle aged Paul, George and Ringo reminisce for six hours with little footage or information?

Unfortunately, it was both. But fortunately, it was done in such a way that it didn't appear either slick or boring. The visuals, ranging from Beatle home movies to unseen television footage, were stunning. Remarkably, most of the original television turned out quite well, though some had to be repaired or restored.

As for the new interviews, the anthology struck gold. With no narration at all, the story of The Beatles actually was told in their own words. Even old radio and television interviews of the late John Lennon were able to be used to carry the anthology along.

Dave Marsh, of TV Guide Weekly, put it best when he said the greatest thing about the anthology were the revelation of new and interesting information. Among them are an original reel recording of The Quarrymen, the

pre-Beatles incarnation featuring John, Paul and George.

Other highlights were the restored or newly discovered Beatle footage. The anthology caught the first performance of "Yesterday," performed by Paul on an acoustic guitar, the home movies shot by the band while in Florida and their trip to India to see the Maharishi Mahesh Yogi.

Of course, the most anticipated new pieces of information were the new songs themselves. Recorded but not completed by John, the other Beatles collaborated to complete what were released as "Free as a Bird" and "Real Love."

Both songs were done very well. Neither, in my opinion, sound anything like their previous material. This is a good sign though, as that they did have 25 years of catching up to do.

Out of the two, "Free as a Bird" stands out as the better song. Featuring the voices of all the Beatles, with John on lead, the song moves at a pretty soothing pace. Musically, it sounds a bit like some of George's solo material, or closer, his work with the Traveling Wilburys.

I don't know whether or not I'd put down \$20 or more for the anthology double disc set. After perusing through the titles, most were songs I have, and the only interesting bits were the several tracks of interview excerpts and the unreleased songs.

I think I'll wait and see if "Free as a Bird" is packaged as a single. Otherwise, a great gift in the future would be the six hour anthology on videotape. That way, unlike the CDs, I'd be able to both hear and see what I want.

Watching the anthology gave viewers a greater respect for The Beatles, and made them realize the implications that their work has had on music today.

Casino

Some actors seem to be custom made for certain roles.

Casino, the latest film by director Martin Scorsese, couldn't be a more choice example of this. The movie casts Robert DeNiro as a slightly crooked casino owner who works for the mob and either outsmarts or bribes anyone he runs up against.

Joe Pesci plays—imagine this—a tough guy who too often acts before he thinks in his quest to protect DeNiro.

DeNiro and Pesci are magnificent as "Ace" Rothstein and Nicky Santoro, respectively, as their childhood friendship changes from staunch loyalty to unease to, eventually, Santoro sleeping with Rothstein's wife, Ginger, played by Sharon Stone.

This division of longtime partners and friends takes place against the backdrop of the Las Vegas casinos in the 1970s. A town that was ripe with celebrities, the mob and, most of all, money.

It's hard not to draw comparisons of *Casino* to other Scorsese films. *Goodfellas*, in particular, reeks of Scorsese's make-the-mob-look-glamorous style. Both star DeNiro and Pesci, and coincidentally enough, both dramatize a seedy side of a past American society that is both enchanting and appalling at the same time.

Where *Goodfellas* and *Casino* differ, however, is not just their setting (the former takes place in New York City). While the mob hits and murders in *Goodfellas* more or less entail shooting or knifing, *Casino* takes malice and maiming to a new level. Not surprisingly, nearly all of the most gruesome scenes involve Pesci's character, Santoro.

From the start of the movie, when Santoro stabs a guy in the neck with an ink pen at least 20 times, to the end, when Santoro and his little brother are pummeled with baseball bats so viciously that they look like they were showered in blood, disturbing savagery reigns supreme.

Odd as it may sound, this actual works to make *Casino* a better

film. If Scorsese wanted to make the audience realize mob life had its price, he did a good job. When a challenger to Santoro's job gets his head mashed in a vise and blood squirts out his eye sockets, we kind of get the picture.

Sharon Stone is one of the keys that really makes *Casino* work. She's extremely convincing as the independent hustler turned junkie who at one point ties her daughter to her bed because "the baby-sitter couldn't make it."

It's not just the plot and acting that makes the movie so fascinating. Camera angles that look through a cocaine straw and unexpected close-ups of Pesci aid in making this film increasingly different and more mature than past Scorsese-DeNiro works, including *Cape Fear*.

The alternating narration by both DeNiro and Pesci is a bit distracting. There are few major faults, however, in what is one of Scorsese's—and Stone's—best works yet.


