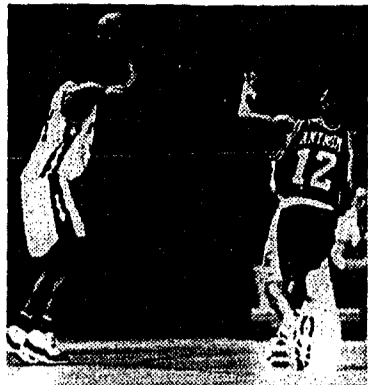

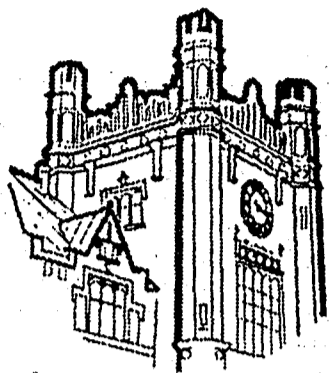

## UI may need another sorority

As rush numbers increase so does the University of Idaho's need for more on-campus sororities.

Panhellenic has been asked by its Greek Adviser Christian Wuthrich to consider the addition of a new sorority into the Greek System.

In the past years high rush numbers have caused chapter houses to overflow, forcing many members to seek housing elsewhere.

"We have had the sorority extension in mind for a year or so," Wuthrich said. "In the beginning we wanted to bring back women's fraternities that were on campus before, now we just want all sorority members to continue living in houses."

In the past, the sorority overflow was placed in the Sweet Avenue house. Recently the Sweet Avenue house has been converted into an honors residence and is owned by UI.

"Members of the Residence Halls and the Honor Society have made a big commitment to the Sweet Avenue house," said Wuthrich. "We couldn't just move in on them."

In order for the implementation of a new sorority to be approved Greek Advisers have to obtain approval from all members of the Panhellenic Council. The extension has to be presented to and voted on by the national Sororities. If everything is approved, a new sorority has to be chosen by the Panhellenic Council.

## Ski team, literary digest get funds from senate

The ASUI Ski Team is headed for regionals in McCall next week, thanks to hard work, talent and some financial help from ASUI.

"This is a big achievement for us. We've raised \$1,400 this year through fund-raisers, but we can't afford the entry fees," coach Chris Duncan told the senate as they considered the funding bill Wednesday night.

"We're not asking for things like transportation and lift tickets, we're asking simply for some help to enter the race," he said.

The senate passed bill #S96-21, providing \$1,050 to help cover the team's expenses at the competition at Brundage Feb. 21-23.

To qualify for regionals, the team took seventh place out of 18 teams. The top eight teams were selected to compete at Brundage.

"We anticipate some people qualifying for nationals," Duncan said.

The five women and five men of the ASUI Ski Team will participate in the slalom and giant slalom events.

"This is the first time that both the men's team and the women's team have qualified for regionals," said President Brian Kane.

Outdoor Programs Coordinator Mike Beiser said the team has volunteered at the Idaho Winter Games in exchange for lift tickets to train at Brundage. They also put on the Warren Miller ski film and helped with the outdoor equipment swap.

Also at Wednesday's meeting, the senate approved a bill providing \$1,500 to the *Fugue*, UI's literary journal.

"The English department has been helping us publish," said editor Eric Issacson. However, budget cuts have forced the department to cut back, so the *Fugue* was looking for other avenues of funding.

The digest publishes fiction,

## UI residents targets of obscene calls

Women throughout the UI Residence Hall System have recently become the targets of sexually obscene and graphic telephone calls.

Mary Lu Freano, resident director for Theophilus Tower, said the calls begin as surveys about summer clothing and swim wear. The caller then asks increasingly graphic, sexually explicit questions.

Freano said at least 10 incidents have been reported to the Residence Life Staff. The last reported call occurred on Feb. 6.

"The reports indicate the calls are scattered throughout most of the women's halls," Freano said.

Obscene telephone calls are more than a prank.

"These phone calls are illegal... punishable by police and against the Student Code of Conduct," Freano said.

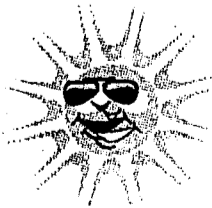
Officer Paul Withers of the Moscow Police Department said making annoying or harassing telephone calls is against section 18-6710 of the Idaho Code. The first violation is a misdemeanor punishable by up to a year in jail. A second conviction is a felony with a maximum sentence of five years in the state penitentiary Withers said.

Annoying telephone calls in the residence halls "just happen," Freano said. However, these calls are "widespread enough that people are tired of it," Freano said.

In addition to notifying residents, the Residence Life staff is working with the Moscow Police Department in order to stop these calls. Freano said they do know the number where some of the calls originated from and police are investigating.

"I hope people will become aware of it and report these calls so we can determine how wide spread it is and put a stop to it," Freano said.

Residents receiving obscene calls should hang up on the caller then dial \*69 and record the number from which the call was made. Next, women should report these calls to their resident assistant Freano said.

## Tax committee sees need, but won't act

BOISE—Members of the House tax committee acknowledge there's a problem with how community colleges at Twin Falls and Coeur d'Alene are funded, but on Wednesday they declined to do something about it.

The Revenue and Taxation Committee killed bills raising taxes on liquor, beer and wine. The measures were intended to help pay for the community colleges and ease the special property tax paid by residents of Jerome, Twin Falls and Kootenai county colleges.

That special tax raises about \$6 million a year, enough to cover about one-third of the cost of running the two-year schools.

Residents of other counties pay \$500 per student per year in tuition but that just offsets some of the cost.

Rep. Dolores Crow, R-Nampa, said eventually, the Legislature may have to at least decide if it can afford as many state-supported colleges as there are in a relatively small state.

Rep. Ron Black, R-Twin Falls, chief sponsor of the bills, said a 10 percent surcharge on liquor would generate about \$6 million per year, which was to be divided equally between the two colleges.

The state tax on beer, which amounts to about 1.2 cents per can, was to be doubled under the other bill to about 8 cents per six-pack. The state wine tax, 45 cents per gallon, also was to be doubled.

Black said those increases would generate \$11 million per year, from which he suggested \$6 million go to the community colleges and \$5 million to Idaho's counties to pay for a new juvenile probation system.

Liquor lobbyist Brian Harris

opposed the bills. He said the state markup and federal and state taxes already contribute to more than half the cost of a \$10 bottle of liquor. Raising taxes higher, he said, will cause sales to decline and cut tax collections, not increase them.

He said alcoholic beverages use Idaho crops, including hops, grapes and barley.

## Idaho lawmakers earn 'environmental zero'

BOISE—Idaho's congressional delegation has received the only zero rating in the nation on an environmental scorecard, say local conservationists who sent them empty boxes of Valentine's Day candy.

The four-person delegation compiled the worst record on 12 environmental votes in the U.S. House and 14 votes in the Senate, according to the annual scorecard of the League of Conservation Voters: Idaho was the only group with a cumulative zero.

The groups gave each lawmaker candy boxes wrapped with fake money for the sweetheart deals delivered to corporations in return for political action committee campaign donations, he said.

Conservationists contend the Mining Law of 1872 allows miners to take over public land at only a few dollars an acre, with hardly any compensation to the taxpayer for the minerals extracted.

Other votes were on health care, selling public lands, renewable energy, Arctic oil drilling, closing national parks and hobbling the Environmental Protection Agency, the groups said.

## Bill to make bypassing voters tougher for cities, counties

BOISE—A Twin Falls lawmaker is trying to make it tougher for cities and counties to sidestep vot-

ers in seeking project financing.

The House Judiciary and Rules Committee on Tuesday approved a bill, sponsored by Republican Rep. Mark Stubbs, that would eliminate the funding method that Twin Falls, Gooding, Jerome and Lincoln counties used to equip their enhanced 911 system last year.

That method involves winning a judge's consent instead of voters' approval.

At issue is a law passed after a state Supreme Court ruling said local governments could seek alternative ways to fund building projects with the approval of a judge. The law gave broad authority to judges to define which projects could be funded without voter approval.

Stubbs' bill would limit that authority. It would require public officials to hold public hearings upon request before seeking judicial approval.

## UI tops the nation on fundamentals exam

MOSCOW—Graduating seniors at the University of Idaho's College of Engineering topped the nation in their performance on the Fundamentals of Engineering Exam.

On the most recently administered test in October of 1995, UI engineering students passed the test at a rate of 95.6 percent. The national average was 68.4 percent.

The national average pass rate since 1983 is 62.8 percent compared to 91.3 percent for UI students during the same time frame.

The Fundamentals of Engineering exam is the first step engineering graduates must take in becoming registered professional engineers. Students may take the eight-hour test in their last year of schooling. It is a standardized test used by all 50 states and covers all the fundamental topics in an engineering curriculum. The exam is administered twice a year, in April and October, on the same weekend nationwide.

## Judge dismisses incest charge against couple

DADE CITY, Fla.—A woman suspected of having nine children with her older brother packed the kids into her car and headed back home after a judge dismissed incest charges against the couple.

But Circuit Judge Wayne Cobb's ruling Tuesday had more to do with geography. He said there was no evidence that the 44-year-old woman and her 66-year-old brother had sex in his jurisdiction.

A half-day's worth of testimony revealed that they began living in Pasco County as of Dec. 6, 1993. Their youngest child was born eight months later.

Authorities said there was no reason to test the siblings' other eight children, the oldest of whom is 22, because the statute of limitations had run out in their cases.

The couple was arrested last March after DNA tests confirmed they were siblings and that they were the parents of an 18-month-old girl.

The names of those involved were being withheld to protect the children's identities. Court records show the children have IQs ranging from 52 to 86. An IQ of 80 is the threshold for declaring a person learning disabled.

State social workers previously had ordered the father to stay away from the children, and the couple planned to continue following that order, said the woman's lawyer, Richard Howard.

## Man who killed ex-girlfriend had been freed by judge

NEW YORK—Despite a woman's plea for protection, a judge released an ex-boyfriend who had repeatedly beaten her at knifepoint, saying she had only been bruised, not disfigured.

Less than a month later, the woman was dead and the man who had been released without bail was the killer.

Benito Oliver walked into the car dealership where Galina Komar worked, shot her in the head with a .44-caliber revolver and then fatally shot himself Monday.

Komar, a divorced immigrant from the former Soviet Union, met Oliver in 1994 after separating from her husband.

Newly released transcripts of the Jan. 24 bail hearing indicate Judge Lorin Duckman focused much of his attention on Oliver's dog, and questioned the severity of the woman's beating.

Komar, a 32-year-old mother, had repeatedly begged the judge for protection from Oliver, who had a 20-year record of abusing women.

At issue was Komar's Dec. 15 complaint that Oliver had beaten her at knifepoint. Oliver was arrested for violating an order of protection issued by another judge.

Prosecutors asked Duckman to increase Oliver's bail because they said he made threatening telephone calls to Komar from jail. But lawyers for Oliver argued he only called Komar because she was caring for his dog.

## Asylum-seeker breaks into Russian mission after killing guards

MOSCOW, Russia—North Korean commandos reportedly shot an armed man who was seeking refuge in the Russian trade mission in Pyongyang on Thursday.

The ITAR-Tass news agency said the commandos entered the building in a special operation with the cooperation of Russian personnel. It was not clear if the man was wounded or killed.

No Russians were hurt in the incident, the report said, without adding further details.

Russian diplomats said the man broke into the Russian Embassy compound in central Pyongyang after shooting dead three North Korean security guards and wounding one. He then fired in the air to gain entrance to the trade mission, a separate facility on the premises.

The man threatened to commit suicide unless he got asylum, mission officials reported.

Tass gave the intruder's surname as Cho, and said he was a 25-year-old sergeant with the North Korean State Guard.

Relations have cooled between Moscow and Pyongyang since the 1991 Soviet collapse but key treaties from the Soviet-era are still valid, including a 1957 pact on extraditing defectors with criminal records.

## Yeltsin still trailing Communist in polls

MOSCOW, Russia—As he prepares to reveal his re-election plans, new opinion polls suggest President Boris Yeltsin lags far behind his Communist rival and has little public support for the war in secessionist Chechnya.

Polls released Tuesday indicate, however, that Communist Party leader Gennady Zyuganov could be defeated by Grigory Yavlinsky, a young, Western-oriented reformer.

This week marks the start in earnest of the race for the Russian presidency, the post that wields real control in this country of 148 million people spread across 11 time zones from Europe to the Pacific Ocean.

None of the presidential hopefuls is expected to get the more than 50 percent of the vote needed for an outright victory. A second round between the top two candidates is likely.

A new poll by the independent Vtsiom organization did not ask voters how they would vote in the first round. Instead, it assumed there would be a second round, and asked people how they would vote in each of several different scenarios.

Asked whether they would vote for Yeltsin or Zyuganov, 19 percent said Yeltsin and 33 percent Zyuganov. Given a choice between Zyuganov and ultranationalist Vladimir Zhirinovskiy, 35 percent picked Zyuganov and 14 percent Zhirinovskiy.

# International symposium to be held on the Internet

When you first walk into Dr. John R. Sturgul's office at the University of Idaho's College of Mines, it appears he is playing video games. What most people are unaware of is Sturgul is working with highly technical computer simulation and animation programs.

Sturgul said, "UI and the National Technical University of Athens, Greece are involved in the First International Symposium on Mine Simulation ever to be held on the Internet."

Sturgul of the department of Metallurgy and Mining at UI and Dr. George N. Panagiotou of the department of Mining Engineering and Metallurgy of NTUA are Co-Chairmen of the International Symposium which will run for two weeks in Dec. 1996.

Sturgul and Panagiotou first posted notices on mining bulletin boards, with the idea of using the Internet but not knowing if they would receive support and sponsorship to do so. Calls started pouring in from all over the world and their symposium became a reality.

Sturgul said, "I was surprised at the tremendous interest in the world!" He added, "This symposium will be the first in a series of symposia on system simulation, artificial intelligence techniques, virtual reality and other relat-

ed topics, as they apply in mining."

The symposium is similar to a regular meeting with 12 individual sponsors each paying a fee and linking to the internet. Sturgul said, "This symposium may be one of the first of its kind in the world, people have been trying to do this kind of work for 20-30 years." He said what he is now doing is a standard part of engineering technology. "The animation is the new thing," he added.

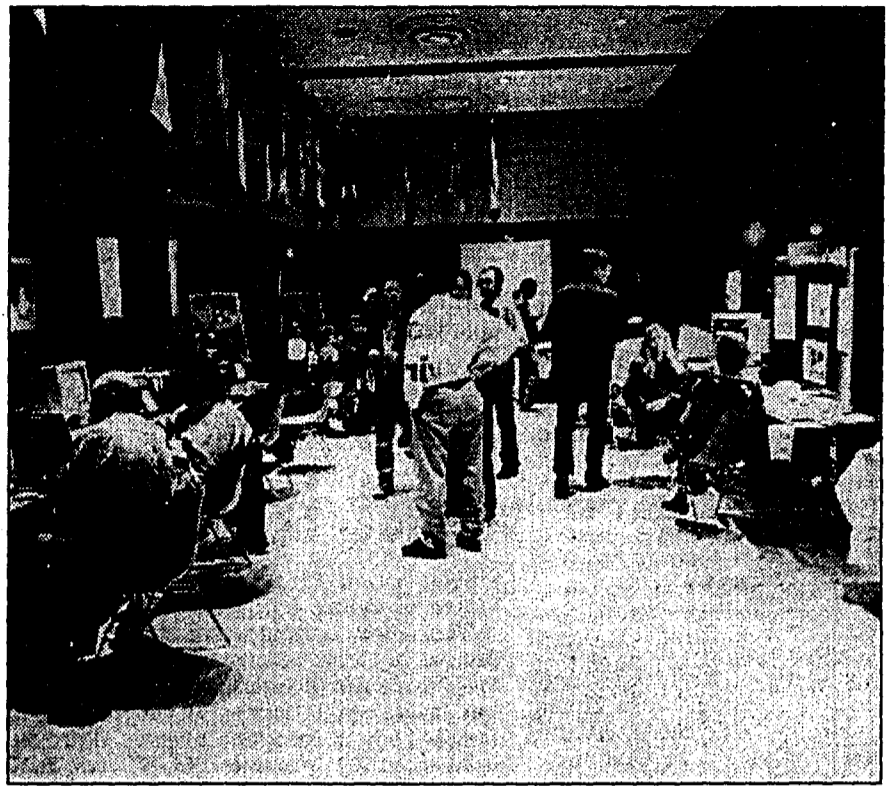
Sturgul said, "The idea of models answer the what-if questions." The models can save companies time and money especially when it involves building a plant at the cost of \$400 million said Sturgul. This is done by drawing a layout, setting up a menu and varying speed to balance everything, for example, how many slabs of copper a machine can handle.

Sturgul has been working with computer simulation for 10 years, of the 50 papers published on this idea in the last eight years, he is the author of 35. Sturgul has been extended invitations from all over the world because of his work.

# World Wide Web provides opportunities for essay writers

With midterms approaching, many UI students are thinking about final essays and research papers. Searching the World Wide Web is quickly becoming one more way to approach untapped information, as the new medium gains acceptance throughout the academic community.

Many UI professors allow and in some cases require students to use the internet as a source for gathering up to date information for assignments and essays, said department of English Chair Gary Williams.

"We encourage people to use the internet as long as they document it," said Williams. News groups can be used to get a different perspective that might not have been obvious before, he said.

History Department Chair, Richard Spence referred to it as "picking the collective brain" of a large number of people, by posting a question in a news group. "It's good for digging up sources and finding material that otherwise wouldn't be available," said Spence.

Spence cautioned, however, that the internet can be abused. "Term paper mills" that sell essays are all the more tempting when those

papers can be downloaded from the internet, said Spence.

Another problem, Spence said, happens when students download complete bibliographies and then use them as sources rather than finding their own. "Part of doing research is looking...what you're assuming is that person is qualified and giving you all of the information that they can," Spence said. Often papers and bibliographies that are purchased from "term paper mills" or plagiarized are missing relevant or obvious sources that make them a "dead give away," said Spence.

Spence said he subscribes to several newsgroups and occasionally

finds "blanket requests" for information. In one instance a person went so far as to blame members of the newsgroup for his imminent failure when other members of the group did not produce sources, said Spence.

"I would be more inclined to help if I had a sense that this person had done some digging on their own...don't demand information," he said.

Spence said he urges students to use the Internet as a resource, but not to rely upon it as their sole means of research. Finding information on larger library servers, such as UC Berkley's Melville, and then requesting a book on interli-

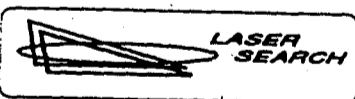
brary loan is one way that the Internet can help the process.

Another "danger of Internet research" is the sense doing an Internet search is an exhaustive one, Williams said. First hand library research won't be replaced by the Internet, but should work as a supplement to it, Williams said.

Until a guide on citing sources on the Internet is published has become something of a "vexed" issue said Williams, there are guidelines that can be used that will help validate the information. Cite Internet addresses and at the very least print the screen as documentation, Williams said.

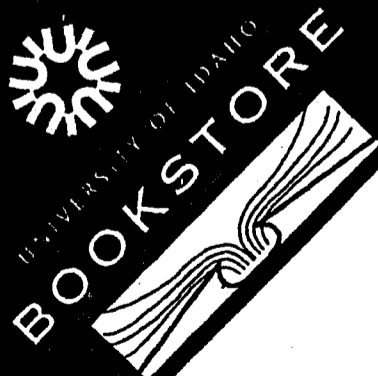

# Moscow recovers from flooding

The water may have receded into the appropriate places, but there are still health considerations to weigh. Even if you think your flooded basement is dry, it probably is not. Environmental, health and safety officials are concerned the flood waters have left behind more than just a bad memory but also bacteria and in some cases bad water. Paul Gunther of Environmental Health Services said the biggest issue right now is potable drinking

water. "If people sense their water system has been contaminated they should not drink the water," Gunther said. If you feel your water is contaminated local health services offices have water containers for testing water. Ken Babin of Environmental Health and Safety said, "Flood water is contaminated with a whole bunch of things." Not only is sewage water harmful, but ground water can also carry other bacteria. Mixing bacteria filled water and upholstery in a flooded basement

can lead to a potentially bad situation. Babin said soaked carpets, couches and other items can promote mold growth. Mold releases spores into the air causing respiratory problems and other complications. Gunther said, "Our best advice is to get rid of carpet unless you can get it professionally cleaned." Gunther also said, "Carpets are very difficult to clean." Unless an item can be thoroughly sanitized it should be thrown out. Babin also said carpets and items like couches, mattresses and box

springs should be thrown out if they were soaked by the flood. If smaller rugs, blankets, towels and clothes were affected Babin's best advice is to wash items in bleach to kill bacteria. For bright colored items color safe bleach will also work. Other overlooked items which may not be safe if flooded are home canned goods and food with screw top lids. Canned items may be dry on the outside but Babin said you can't clean around the seal and so the water and bacteria gets into the

# Students want it all in Recreation Center

In accordance with the 2020 plan set in motion by former University of Idaho President Elisabeth Zinser, planning for the Student Recreation Center continues to move forward. In 1994, the Sports Management group, a consulting group for leisure time use, surveyed the campus and polled the students, faculty and staff in order to propose a

viable option for the Student Recreation Center. This report, coupled with a student survey from last year which found that a new Recreation Center was favored by 80 percent of the student body, caused the Campus Recreation Department to hold 29 sessions to fine tune the wants and needs of the campus. According to an Executive Summary presented by the Campus Recreation Department, the stu-

dents want it all, from new aerobics rooms to whirlpool spas to an indoor ice rink. "Between 120,000 to 180,000 square feet in size and would cost between \$12 to \$18 million....students' fee levels of \$50 or more per semester did not seem unrealistic to most focus group participants since they felt that the university should 'do it right' and build a showcase facility," the report said. The focus groups discussed the

new facility and how to meet the needs of the students, faculty and staff as well as the community, without overlapping existing facilities. They also discussed dual-purpose rooms, such as the aerobics rooms being able to be converted to martial arts areas. There was some interest in moving the ASUI Outdoor Program and Rental Center to the SRC and including a climbing wall in the

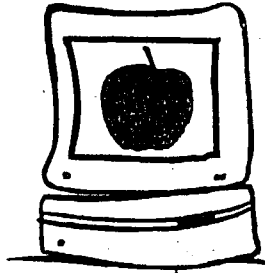

# Pirate attacks on the high seas nearly doubled in 1995

**LONDON**—Pirate attacks nearly doubled in 1995 and were increasingly violent and cruel, the International Maritime Bureau said Monday.

"Most worrying is the increase in the number of vessels fired upon and vessels hijacked, where there has been a prolonged threat with fire arms to crew members," the bureau's annual report said.

The incidents of piracy on the high seas soared to 170 in 1995, compared with 92 in 1994, according to the report compiled by the bureau's Regional Piracy Center based in Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia.

"Although many are armed robbery in coastal waters, there is an increase in the ferocity of attacks which is disturbing," it said.

The most dangerous areas for pirate attacks were Indonesia, Somalia, Djibouti, Brazil, China, Hong Kong, Macau and the area between Hong Kong, Luzon in the Philippines and China's Hainan Islands, it said.

A "prime example" of the increasing ferocity of pirate attacks was the hijacking Sept. 13 of the Cyprus-registered bulk carrier Anna Sierra as she traveled through the Gulf of Thailand toward the Philippines, the report said.

Some 30 masked pirates armed with machine guns, pistols and knives boarded the vessel and held the 22 crew members hostage for two days, before setting them adrift on the high seas aboard a life raft and a makeshift pontoon made of drums and wooden planks.

As it floated away, the pirates opened fire but none of the eight crew aboard were injured, the report said. All the crew were later rescued by a Vietnamese fishing boat.

The pirates repainted parts of the ship and changed its name before taking it to Beihai in Guangxi Province, southern China, arriving Sept. 20.

The report said they sold the vessel's cargo of 12,000 metric tons of sugar to a local company for a sum reported to be more than \$1 million.

Authorities in Beihai detained the vessel Sept. 25, but the pirates are still aboard the ship.

"What singles this attack out from the majority...is not just the size of the vessel or the value of its cargo, but the pirates' blatant disregard for the safety of the crew's life," said the report.

The Maritime Bureau, a specialist division of the London-based International Chambers of Commerce, gave details on the

five areas of special concern in 1995:

• Somalia and Djibouti had 14 attacks in 1995 compared with one the previous year. "What is more worrying is the fact that in seven of these attacks, the victim vessels were fired upon with machine guns and on occasion by mortars," said the report.

• In China, Hong Kong and Macau, attacks rose from five in 1994 to 28 in 1995. In the ports of China and Hong Kong, thieves usually crept on board to steal ships' equipment unnoticed by the crew, the report said.

On June 12, however, gunmen hijacked the passenger ferry Guiato as it traveled between Macau and Hong Kong, robbed the 129 passengers and stole U.S. \$1.6 million cash that the vessel was carrying for a security company, the report said.

• Indonesia reported 34 attacks in 1995, compared with 25 the previous year. "In the vast majority of these attacks, the vessels were boarded in port and had equipment and possessions stolen," the report said.

• The Hong Kong, Luzon, Hainan area saw a small decrease in the number of attacks from 14 to 12 in 1995.

• Brazil saw the number of attacks rise by 10 to 17 in 1995.

# Program aims to keep women SAFE

Out of six women on campus, one will be raped this year Betsy Thomas, Director of the UI Women's Center said. Educational programs presented by the center aim to stop these crimes before they happen.

The Women's Center continues to offer support for victims of sexual assault as does Alternatives to Violence of the Palouse. The Student Counseling Center facilitates a Sexual Abuse Recovery Group.

Valerie Russo, Sexual Assault Education Coordinator for the UI Women's Center, coordinates a new program called Sexual Assault Facilitated Education. SAFE uses peer educators from the Health and Safety 311 class to present sexual assault prevention programs to fraternities, sororities and other living groups.

Russo said the goal of the program is to "reduce the incident of sexual assault on campus." Russo said about 50 presentations have been given so far.

Most rapes are not committed by a stranger.

"Over 80 percent of victims know the person who assaulted them," said Russo. Although any woman can be a victim of sexual assault, Thomas said communication and good decision making can help a woman avoid becoming a statistic.

"Women should be aware of their surroundings," Thomas said. She said a woman should meet acquaintances in public places, drive her own car, carry enough money to cover emergencies and tell a friend where she is going.

"When walking at night, women should have their keys ready and walk as if you'd rip someone's face off," Thomas said.

However, not drinking heavily or using other drugs can be one of the best ways to avoid attack. According to statistics provided by the Women's Center, alcohol abuse occurs in 75 percent of acquaintance assaults.

Rape, as defined by the state of Idaho, is sexual intercourse with a woman whose resistance is overcome by violence or the threat of violence, who is incapable of giving legal consent, who is unconscious, or under 18 years of age. Men can also be raped by another man.

Victims of rape often first tell their friends or their next boyfriends Thomas said.

"It is important to believe your friend, offer support, respect her privacy and refer her to a rape victim advocate," said Thomas.

The Women's Center offers crisis intervention, support and referral for victims of sexual assault. The center receives between 80 and 100 reports of sexual assault each year. Alternatives to Violence of the Palouse offers similar services.

"If it's going to be prosecuted, report as soon as possible," Thomas said.

Victims should go to the hospital or Student Health Services to have evidence collection done. Victims should also be tested for HIV and other sexually transmitted diseases. Even if a victim does not want to file charges, she should still contact the police. Police want reports even if it's after the fact or if the victim does not want to file charges Thomas said.

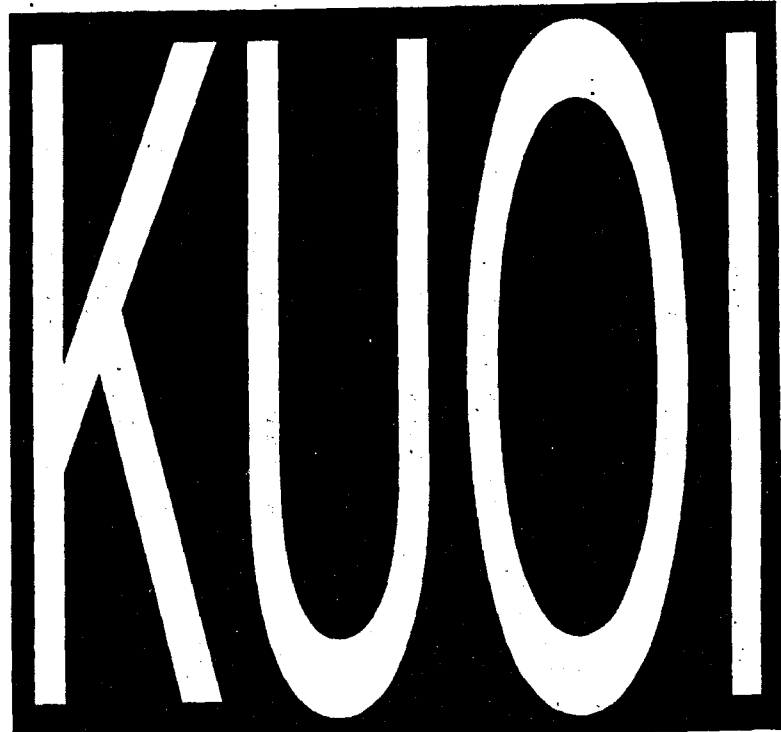

# Buchanan looks to grab support of Gramm and Perot backers

**MANCHESTER, N.H.**—Pat Buchanan, already nipping at Bob Dole's heels, is pressing to pick up supporters of Phil Gramm's failed presidential bid and those who formerly backed Ross Perot.

It's a combination, coupled with his own zealot supporters, that Buchanan says can win him next week's New Hampshire primary, the GOP nomination and the White House.

"This thing is on fire across America," Buchanan told hundreds of cheering supporters Tuesday night at a banquet hall in Concord, one day after he had scored his strong second-place showing in the Iowa caucuses.

"Phil Gramm said the winner of the Louisiana caucuses is going to be Mr. Conservative in 1996," Buchanan, the surprise winner of the Feb. 6 caucuses in Louisiana over Gramm, told the crowd. "You know, as usual, Phil was right."

Buchanan campaigned in New Hampshire this morning and wasted no time attacking leading opponent Bob Dole, calling the Senate majority leader a "big tax man who

hasn't balanced a budget in his last 25 years in Congress."

Buchanan, in an interview with WCQL in Portsmouth, also set his sights on homosexuals, saying, "If someone declared that I'm an out-of-the-closet homosexual and here is my lover and I want to be in Pat Buchanan's Cabinet, I'd have to tell them you're not going to be in Pat Buchanan's Cabinet. This is about having people in here who share the views and values of Pat Buchanan or at least pay homage to those views and values."

As if to cement his credentials as the true conservative in the race, and the friend of blue-collar America, Buchanan used an earlier news conference to blast Republicans and Democrats for trade agreements that he said had exported American jobs to Mexico.

"I used to be a free trader, but it seems to me simple common sense that you do not force American workers who make \$10-an-hour or \$12-an-hour at a textile mill to compete with Mexican workers who have to work for \$1-an-hour," Buchanan said, his voice hoarse constant campaigning and a cold.

Buchanan said his opposition to the North American Free Trade Agreement and the international trade pact known as GATT would help bring Perot supporters into his camp.

"I want to make the Republican Party a great coalition. I can bring the Perot voters home," Buchanan said. "I'm the one candidate in the Republican Party who can bring the Perot voters home."

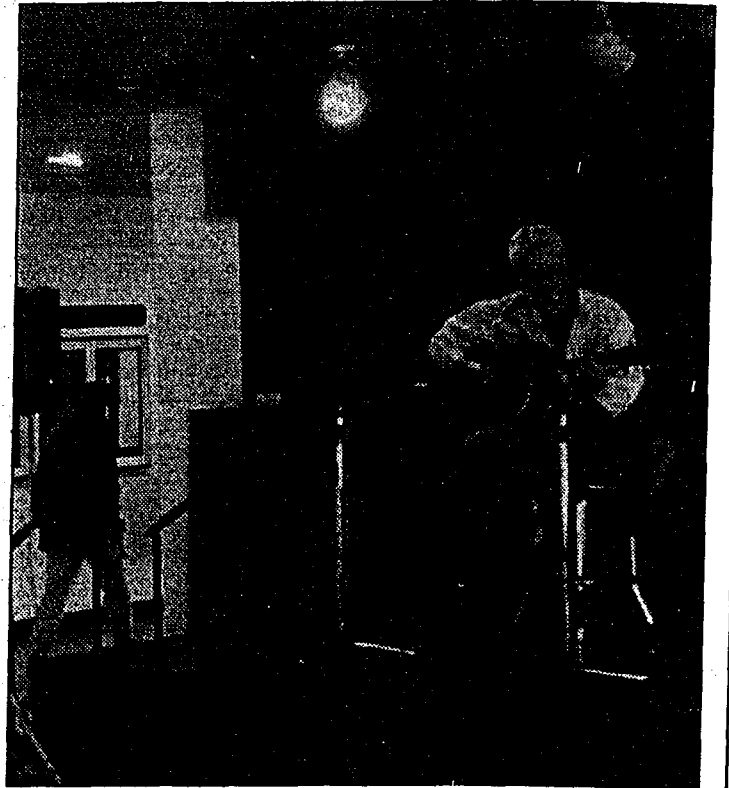
Perot responded to Buchanan's statement today, declaring, "We don't talk about supporting individuals. It's totally inappropriate for me to tap somebody on their shoulder."

"The people who create this party, who stand out there in the snow and get the petitions signed, will decide who their candidates are," Perot said on *CBS This Morning*.

Throughout the day Tuesday, as word spread that Gramm might be quitting the race in the wake of his dismal fifth-place finish in Iowa, Buchanan took to praising his former rival. By the end of the day, he was offering sympathy.

"We know what it's like to get beat. It's painful and unpleasant and I wish the senator well," Buchanan told his own supporters, "He's done a lot of good things for us in the Senate."

Meanwhile, Bay Buchanan, the candidate's sister and campaign manager, said she had begun making calls to Gramm contributors, hoping they would switch their allegiances and their money to her brother.

New Hampshire Republicans said the short-term beneficiary of a Gramm departure could be Buchanan because much of

"Look what happened when that deal miscarried and Mexico needed \$50 million," he said. "I protected American workers. Who did they protect?...They rushed to protect Citibank, Chase Manhattan and Goldman Sachs."

Buchanan has run strongly in New Hampshire before. In 1992, he challenged President Bush for the GOP nomination and collected 36 percent of the vote. While Bush won the primary, it pointed up his vulnerability.

He looked at me all sad as though I'd just run over his dog, then wandered off.

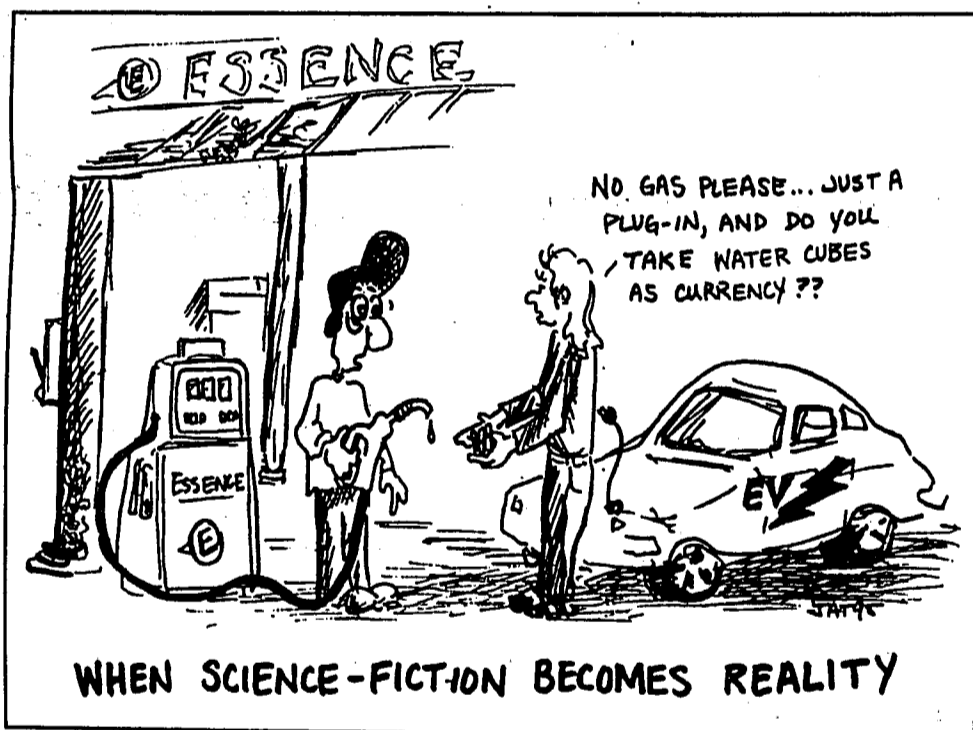
I guess some people just don't know how to handle spirited women. They also don't know how to say their names.

Sasse misses the call

In response to the lead editorial in the Feb. 13 issue of the Argonaut:

Let me first respond to Dennis Sasse: I am an off-campus student, and the overtones of your article seems to be in frustration as an off-campus student.

Fact 1) I authored the bill because I am working with the Residence Hall Association on a benefit concert for the United Way. In the process of planning, I learned they hadn't filed the proper paperwork to be registered with ASUI.

This was not because of last semester's IACURH funding bill as Dennis Sasse referred to.

Fact 2) The intent of the Activities Board registration process for clubs and organizations is to validate the legitimacy and intentions of the clubs and organizations that register.

Fact 3) The Interfraternity/Panhellenic Council's and the Residence Hall Association are long-standing, well organized groups that serve the many students of UI and will continue to do so.

Fact 4) This bill has absolutely no financial orientation or basis, and RHA, PHC/IFC are precluded from applying for funding because

they are organizations based on a living arrangement, and thus prohibited from receiving funding from ASUI.

Why SB #96-20? These groups will continue to be stable and strong, and shouldn't be bogged in ASUI red tape.

In response to Dennis' statement, "off-campus students are snubbed and ignored once again." If there were an off-campus organization that had demonstrated the long-standing record of service and stability the IFC/PHC and RHA have done, they would be included in this bill as well.

I would especially like to thank senators Sasha Nash and Brandon Jessup for relaying the concerns of an off-campus student, even though I might be a former ASUI President.

I would concede one point to Dennis Sasse. He was right about GSA in his column. Thus GSA has been removed from the language of the bill, because they are an ASUI organization.

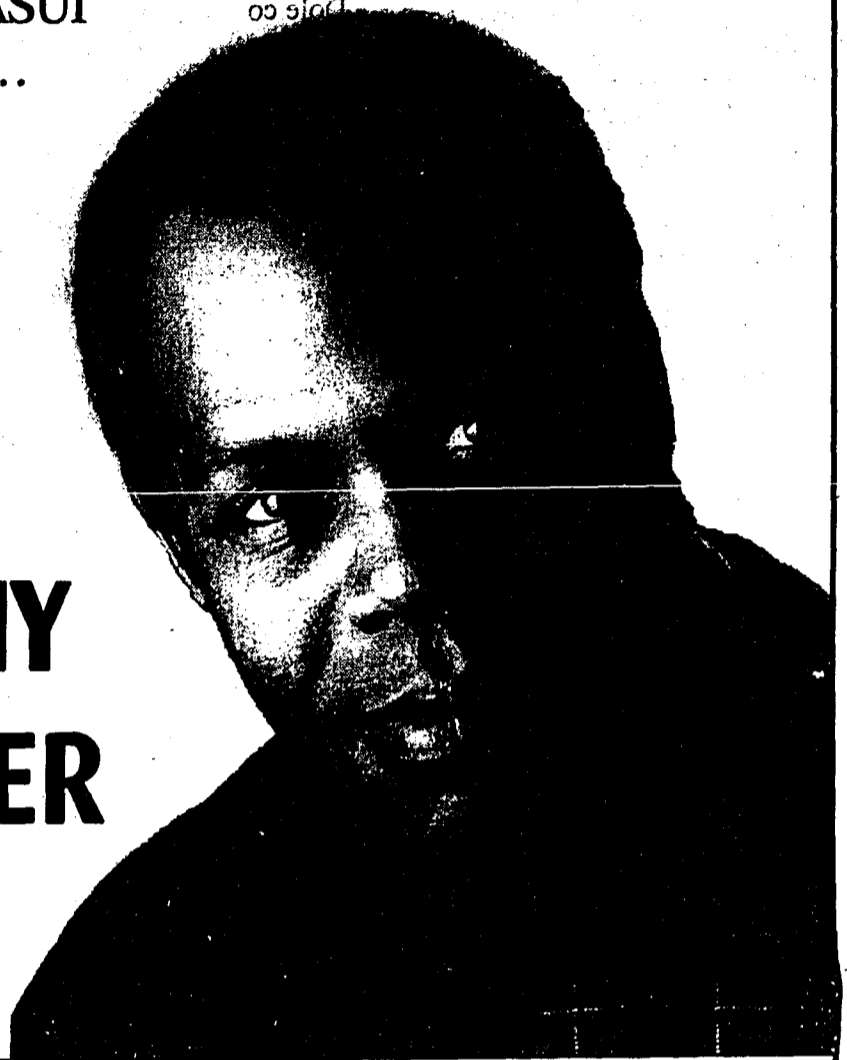

most cases, we are enjoying the benefits of shade, windbreak, beauty and attractive shopping areas because someone before us had the foresight to plant trees.

Today, large numbers of trees in Idaho communities are reaching or exceeding the limits of their life expectancy. They need systematic care to increase their longevity. Some need to be made safe through pruning; others should be removed to reduce breakage that can lead to property damage, injury and lawsuits. On some sites, planting is urgently needed to continue our tree tradition, enhance the livability of neighborhoods, and make commercial areas attractive to shoppers and new businesses.

All of this depends on aware citizens and the kind of informed action that comes through education. These are the goals of the Idaho Department of Land's Community Forestry Program and its citizen advisory council. I am writing because the Council urgently needs help from everyone to meet these goals. Therefore, may I

call the attention of your readers to the Community Forestry Trust Account that is funded by voluntary donations through the check-off box at the bottom of Idaho income tax returns. This is a "painless" way to help assure the continuation and growth of a worthwhile, statewide effort to promote tree planting and tree care in Idaho communities of all sizes.

All that is necessary to become a partner in Idaho is to simply check the box next to "Idaho Community Trees" and show the amount you wish to contribute. Importantly, when the form is completed by someone else, it is essential to instruct the preparer to use the check off. It will not be done unless you insist. Either way, please make this effort on behalf of abundant, healthy and safe street trees in Idaho. If you have questions about the check-off or opportunities for community forestry, you can contact Craig Foss, Idaho Department of Lands, Box 670, Coeur d'Alene, ID 83816 (208/769-1525).

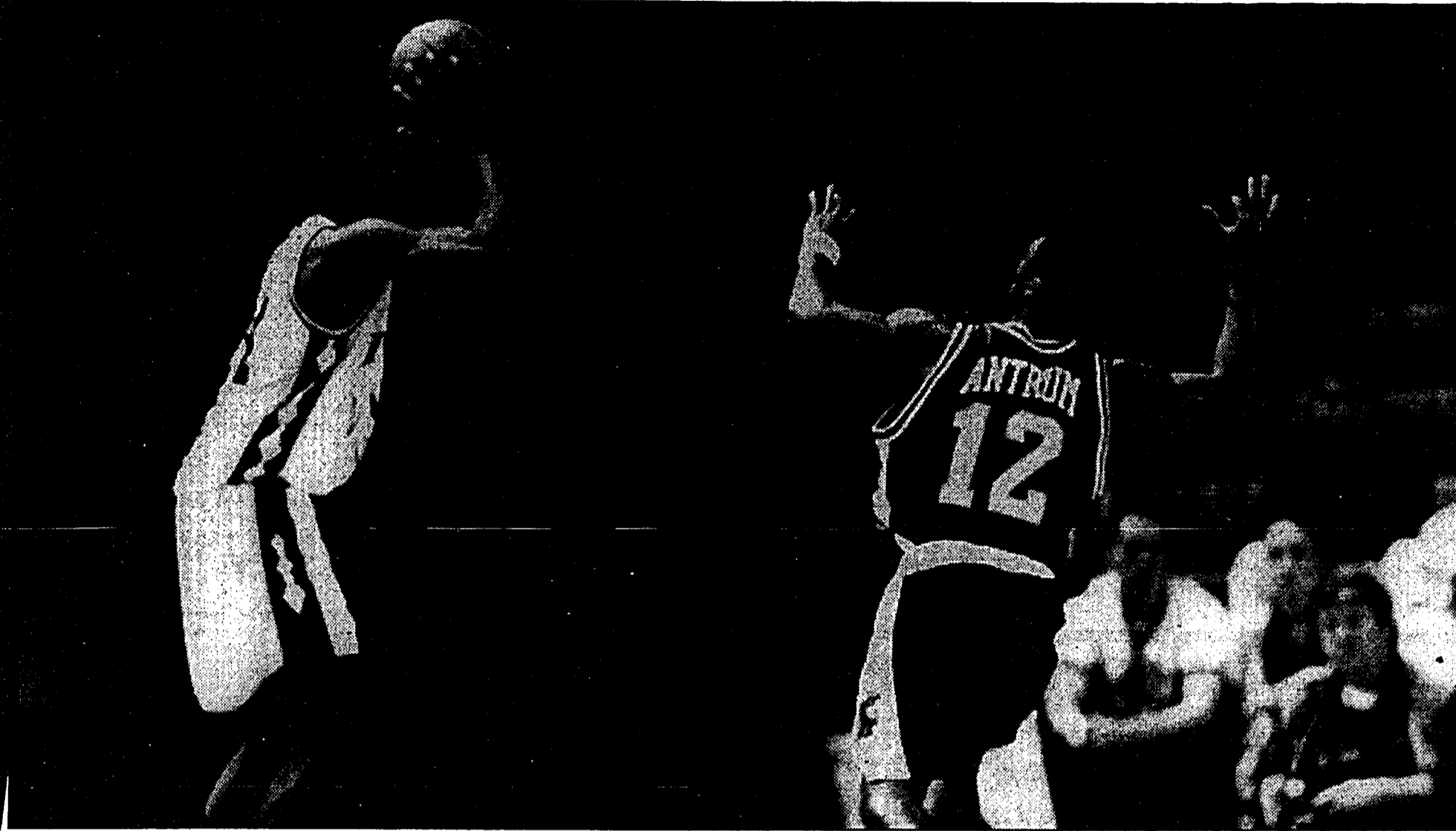

### Cougar zone does in Vandals down stretch

It would be an understatement to say Idaho men's basketball coach Joe Cravens left Tuesday night's 68-59 home loss to border rival Washington State kicking and screaming.

The third-year UI leader promptly took the ball from Washington State point guard Donminic Ellison following a postgame handshake with Cougars' coach Kevin Eastman and punted the ball, which fell short of doing any booster harm, toward the seats.

"I thought I'd get more distance on that ball," Cravens said. "I don't really know what I was reacting to. You guys will have to fill in the blanks on that one."

Although Cravens may have pleaded ignorance after the game, during the action it was apparent the officiating was not at all to his liking. On countless occasions Cravens paraded the sideline in disgust after a call went against his Vandals.

The focus of Cravens' abhorrence was Washington State forward Mark Hendrickson. The 6-foot 9-inch forward ate the Vandals alive in the low post, pumping in 23 points and pulling down 11 rebounds. Hendrickson scorched the Idaho defense for eight points in the final 8:25 of the game, including a layup with 2:18 left which virtually put the game away by giving the Cougs a 65-54 advantage.

"Our inability to attack their zone and trying to guard Mark Hendrickson with him hanging all over us cost us the game. He's hard enough to guard anyway."

The Cougars (12-8, 4-7 PAC-10) switched from their man-to-man defense into a zone scheme at the

9:20 mark of half two. The change came after a layup by Harry Harrison pushed the Vandals to within one at 51-50. Idaho (9-12, 3-6 BSC) managed just three field goals and a pair of free throws the rest of the way as Washington State outscored the UI crew 16-9 down the stretch.

"Our defense has been something we've had to work hard on this year, because we haven't been shooting the ball well," Eastman said. "Our defense is what gets our team going. Our zone was the difference tonight."

Washington State got the best of

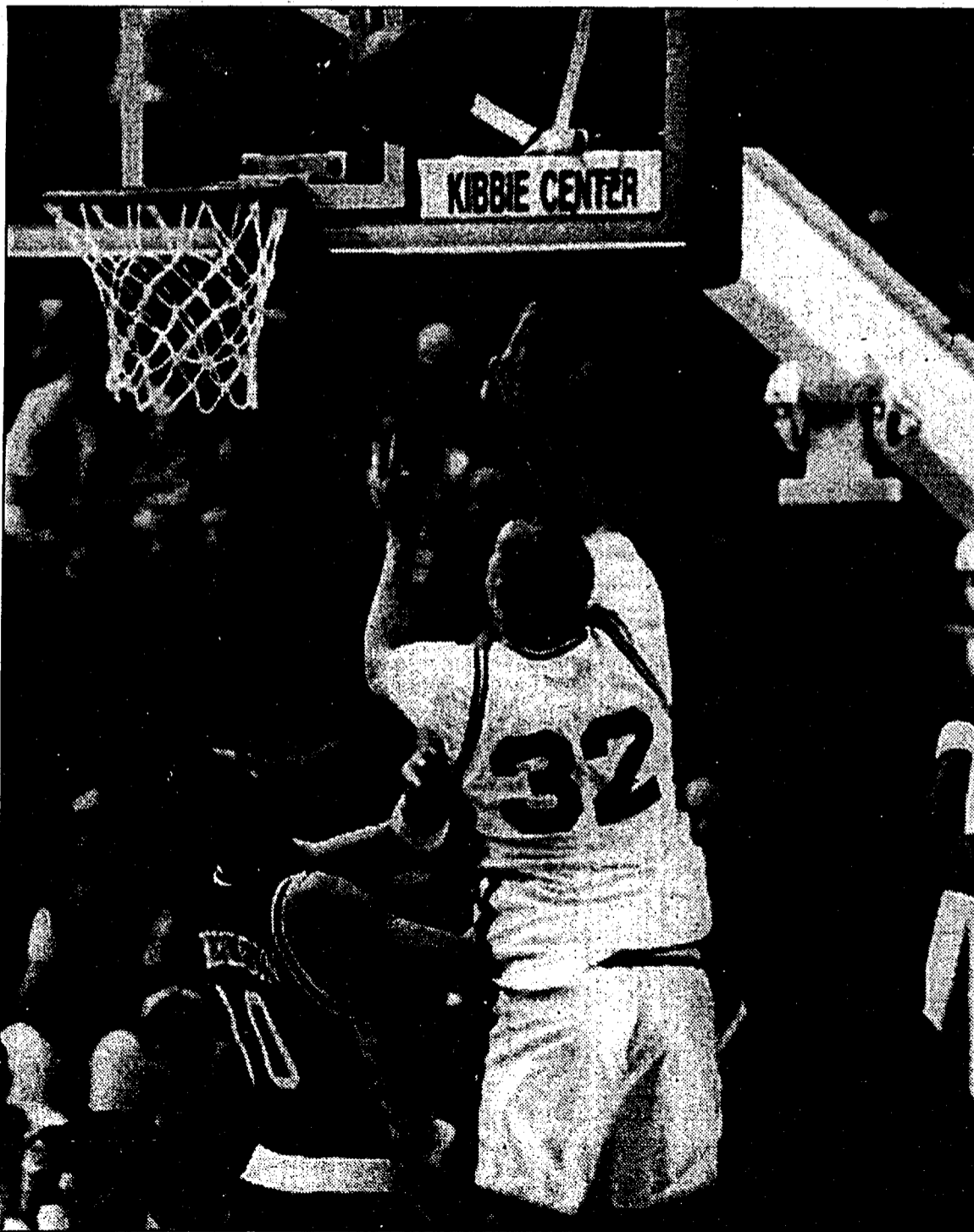

Shamon Antrum was flammable from the perimeter for Wazzu,

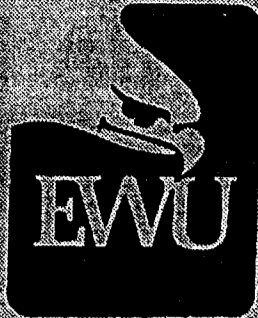

## Tracksters compete tonight

Idaho indoor track and field coach Mike Keller encourages students to come out to watch the 21st Vandal Indoor Invitational at the Kibbie Dome tonight at 6:30 p.m. and the McDonald's II All-Comers Meet starting at 8 a.m. on Saturday.

Among the teams competing on Friday are several area teams, clubs and former Vandal and Cougar track athletes including world decathlon standout Dan O'Brien.

O'Brien's first event will be in the 55-yard dash starting at the beginning of the meet, then the world decathlete record holder will high jump and run the hurdles toward the middle and end of the track meet.

On the men's side of things, Tawanda Chiwira and Thad Hathaway lead Idaho in their respected events. This week, Chiwira and Hathaway were both named as Big Sky Conference track and field athletes of the week. This is the second time in three weeks that Idaho has swept the BSC award.

Chiwira, a freshman sprinter from Zimbabwe, provisionally qualified for the NCAA indoor championships last week at the Holiday Inn Invitational in Reno, Nevada with a time of 21.6 in the 200-meter dash. Chiwira's time is the fastest in the Big Sky this year.

Hathaway, a senior, also provisionally qualified for the NCAA championships at the same meet. The LaGrande, Ore. native won the high jump with a mark of 7-foot 2 1/2 inches. Hathaway's mark leads the con-

ference by more than 2 inches. Keller views Friday's meet as an opportunity to compete against some quality athletes.

"We want to improve our marks," Keller said. "We'd also like to get some other people qualified for the Big Sky Championships. This is a meet where only select individuals are invited."

Keller looks forward to Idaho competing in the 400m relay and hopes to break the previous Kibbie Dome record time.

"I'm holding back my top sprinters. It (400 relay) is the last event of the night. We're competing against WSU and UW," Keller said. "I'm hoping to get qualified for the NCAA championships."

On the women's side of things, Idaho women's track and field coordinator Julie Taylor also has high hopes for this weekend.

"Since we already had one of our meets canceled we're hoping to get qualified for the Big Sky," Taylor said. "There is a few people looking to do real well."

Leading the women is shot putter and discus thrower Jill Wimer, who is expected by Taylor to eventually break the Big Sky indoor discus record of 136-10. Taylor also expects her Vandals to do well in the 400m relay.

"We're hoping to improve our time in the 400," Taylor said.

Both the men and women squads are hoping this weekend's slate of events provide the necessary warmup before Idaho travels to the University of Montana for the Big Sky Conference championships Feb. 23-24.

...aining five of six shots from three-point land and finishing with 16 points. His trey with 15:48 left in the second half gave the Cougars a 49-38 edge, the first double digit lead for either team in the game.

However, the Vandals were not alone, responding with a 12-2 run capped off by Harrison's layup.

Lost in the shuffle of Cravens' antics and Idaho's late offensive power outage was the solid play of Harrison. The 6-7 senior scored 12 points but also pulled down a game-high 19 rebounds, the most by a WSU opponent since 1972, helping the Vandals to a 37-30 edge on the boards.

The win by the Cougars marked the first time since 1989 the visiting team has come away with a victory in the Border Battle series.

Despite a 4-15 shooting performance UI point-guard Reggie Rose led the Vandals in scoring with 13 points. Shawn Diriden contributed 12 points in the loss.

The Cougars, who won their third straight contest and second over the Vandals this season, got 17 points from swingman Isaac Fontaine. Tuesday's loss was only the second home nonconference loss in the last seven seasons for Idaho.

Idaho in 1992.

Stokes received her master of science degree in sports and recreation management from Idaho in 1995, and is a member of the United States Volleyball Association and the American Volleyball Coaches Association.

The Vandals compiled a 103-21 record with Stokes as an assistant under Tom Hilbert

Idaho has four of its starting five averaging in double figures in Big Sky Conference play, with the fifth playing perhaps the best of all.

Rice leads the way at 13.6 points per game, with Natalie Hawks second at 12.1 and Ari Skorpik and Kelli Johnson at 10.9 and 10.2 respectively. Lost in the shuffle no longer is Melisa McDaniel. McDaniel is coming off back to back career highs against Boise State and Idaho State, with 15 against the Broncos followed rather nicely by 18 to down the Bengals, including 13 of Idaho's last 24.

# Big city man big hit for Idaho

Struggling to win always provides a challenge to athletes. The tireless practice schedule, the grueling road trips, the last second tension, add to the challenge a first ever sub-500 season and an athlete might lose faith in the game. But if you're playing a game you love and respect, you probably just kept playing, hoping things turn around soon and learning from each game.

For Idaho point-guard Reggie Rose, 20, the challenge to play, win and learn became a reality this season with the Vandals. Despite the tough times his team has fallen on, Rose continues to play hard for one reason.

"I love the game," Rose said. "Some guys are out here because they can play it, but I love the game. Basketball has helped a lot of troubled youth. I really respect basketball."

Rose's love for the game developed during his childhood in Chicago, Ill., where he played basketball from about age 11, including four years in high school at Hubbard High School. Along with high school sports, Rose stayed active in youth programs at a local park that offered sports like softball, flag football and occasional basketball tournaments.

Rose recalls some fond memories from high school, including scoring 58 points against Curie High School in a playoff game

and winning over 80 games in four seasons. However, a loss to the nation's #1 ranked high school team, Martin Luther King, proved to be the most memorable moment in Rose's childhood career. The young Rose pumped in 38 points and helped his team fight to within four points of an upset in the last four minutes of the game.

After a successful high school career, Rose moved on to Garden City, Kan. where he played two years for Garden City Community College. After two years of 20-plus win seasons, including a final season highlighted by selections to both the all-conference team and the all-region team, 15 points per game, four rebounds per game and six assists per game with Garden City, Rose moved on to Idaho.

Moving from a metropolis like Chicago, to a small town like Moscow or Garden City might create an extra challenge for an athlete, but Rose actually welcomes the change.

"In a small town you can relax," Rose said. "For college life I can focus on basketball and academics, a small town is best."

However, Rose does look forward to moving back to the big city once his tenure at Idaho ends.

The move to Idaho came after a Vandals' recruiting technique that focused on Rose and his family, a practice that Reggie found the other schools did not believe in.

"My family felt comfortable," Rose said

about Idaho.

The other schools included Arizona, Texas Christian and New Mexico State. Rose believes he would have started at all these schools, but his playing time would not be as great as at Idaho.

The jump to athletics at Idaho creates some new problems for Rose, despite being a small town. The schedule proved more grueling than in junior college Rose admits, reflecting on the road trips. Rose said in junior college the team would play on the road, get on a bus and be home that night. Now he finds himself traveling for several days. "I'm catching jet lag a little bit," Rose said.

Despite the jet lag, the change to school in Idaho came fairly easy for Rose, a junior sociology major. He admits school has gone pretty well and that you just have to go to class and hand in the work, being an athlete does not change that. Rose also has time to maintain a long distance relationship with his sweetheart from junior college, Kim Northworthy, a student and track athlete at Clemson.

On the court this season, Rose has lit the scoreboard up for the Vandals, hitting 39 percent from the floor but averaging a team-leading 13.5 points per game. He also leads the Vandals in most other offensive and defensive categories, including steals with 37, 62 assists, 282 points and 68 free throws. Rose has hit on 29 of 95 three-point attempts

for 30.5 percent and shoots 72 percent from the free throw line. As a starter, Rose has helped the Vandals pick up some huge wins, including a victory against new PAC-10 power Washington, and played through a nagging ankle injury sustained during Idaho's Montana road trip. Despite his individual contributions though, Rose struggles with the team's record.

"I've never been on a losing team," Rose said. "I'm use to winning 20 games."

Although the losses have been tough for Rose to take, he believes Idaho still has hope in the conference tournament, "the pot of gold at the end of the road, let's try to focus on that pot of gold," he says.

Also, Rose believes that losing can help a team if it knows what it did wrong and it learns from it. This season has provided Rose with several opportunities to learn, but with the talent and desire he holds for the game, Reggie Rose hopes to be back to his winning ways soon, leading the Vandals to a lot of wins in the stretch run.

Indeed, the lack of space was an issue in deciding the locale for tonight's concert.

"Last year, the concert was in the food court and it was so packed that it became standing room only," Church said. "I guess we even broke a few fire codes. So, we expect quite a large turnout."

With three different choirs showing up to perform, variety is definitely the key word for tonight's show. Styles will range anywhere from small vocal ensembles to the more upbeat sounds. All three of the choirs are directed by Daniel Bukvich.

The concert, which is free to everyone, is just one of many ASUI-sponsored productions that fall under the "Coffeehouse" title. Tonight's event follows up last week's Coffeehouse performance by entertainer/speaker Pat Surface. An Open Mic night in the same category is scheduled for March 2.

# Clark delivers message with authority

When Joe Clark speaks, people listen.

And even though one would need a dictionary to handle his vocabulary, the message is understood. "Stand tall. Make a difference. Be a contributor to bring about change," Clark said to an audience frozen by the strength of his voice.

Describing himself as "Type A" and "parochial" Clark spoke with fearlessness and fervor last Thursday evening at the Student Union Ballroom. In his earnest speech Clark relayed his philosophy about life and the duties everyone has into it. Clark was brought to campus by ASUI Productions.

Telling his audience that it is "inexcusably indispensable" that they find their purpose in life, Clark spoke of the issues that transcend race and religion—cooperation. "Do all the good you can by all the means you have," Clark said.

"Life is a roller coaster," Clark said. "Sometimes you're the statue and sometimes you're the pigeon, but you do what you find propels you to accomplish what you need." As a high school principal, Clark did everything he needed to reform a drug and crime infested high school in New Jersey into an orderly domain of education.

Equipped with a bullhorn and baseball bat, Clark's discipline tactics may have been branded as harsh and even uncivil. But his style received fame as he was invited on several TV and radio

shows including a CBS *60 Minutes* feature and *Donahue*. Clark also graced the cover of *Time Magazine*, received an offer to serve a White House post, wrote his own book *Laying Down the Law*, and was the central character of the movie "*Lean on Me*." In the movie Clark was portrayed by Morgan Freeman.

Witnessing Clark speak removes all doubt about the authenticity of his character portrayal in the movie. His intolerant attitude could cause any unruly human to put their nose to the grindstone. In a time where hate and disorder are abound, Clark maintains that it is each person's responsibility to overcome.

"If we must hate, then let us hate those things that should be hated," he said. "Ridding ourselves of cynicism and the 'toxic' people in our lives can only better us."

Clark doesn't seek to be loved, his ultimate gratification is his contribution to change. Currently Clark is director of the Essex County Juvenile Detention Center in New Jersey. He plans on continuing what he feels he does best: managing and speaking well.

He trusts his own inner convictions to guide him in life.

"I listen to my inner voice," he said. "It talks to me, it walks with me." As the need for the production of clear thinking people rises, we can only hope that there will be more Joe Clarks to help.

# Distinguished writer visits campus

Brenda Hillman is the first Distinguished Visiting Writer to visit the University of Idaho for the 1996 Spring semester.

During her stint on campus she taught a week long night workshop in the field of poetry and gave a reading of her own poetry Feb. 7. Hillman teaches at St. Mary's College in Moraga, CA.

Hillman is originally from Arizona and attended her undergraduate years at Pomona College in California. Her graduate work was done at the University of Iowa.

Ever since she was a young girl Hillman has been writing poetry.

"I've been writing poetry since I was nine. Then I wrote quite a bit in my young days and quite a bit as an adolescent," Hillman said. "I was writing a lot in college. I was well known for carrying a briefcase full of poems and they were pretty much all terrible, but I think by the time I had finished college I had written several good poems. Then I started submitting things when I got into graduate school."

During graduate school Hillman began

submitting things to literary magazines. Her first publication came at age "22-23" in the magazine *Kayak*.

"At that point I was just trying to follow my path and I knew I couldn't live without writing. And so I thought it would be a really good idea out and get published," Hillman said.

Much of her work, specifically in *Bright Existence*, centers around her own private belief in gnosticism. The belief which emphasizes an inward search for reality, a disjunction between spirit and matter and the soul's individual journey.

"I began to be interested in it (Gnosticism) in college," Hillman said.

Hillman began to read systematically about the Gnostics and their beliefs in 1985 when a man, who she subsequently married, replied to a comment she had made about the oddity and repellent shape of a green pepper blessing her Gnostic heart. After that she began to research the Gnostic studies heavily.

"I started integrating the ideas into my writing," Hillman said.

Her book *White Dress* is more conventional. In her third book *Fortress*, she began to get an interest in narrative

poems—telling a story within the confines of poetry.

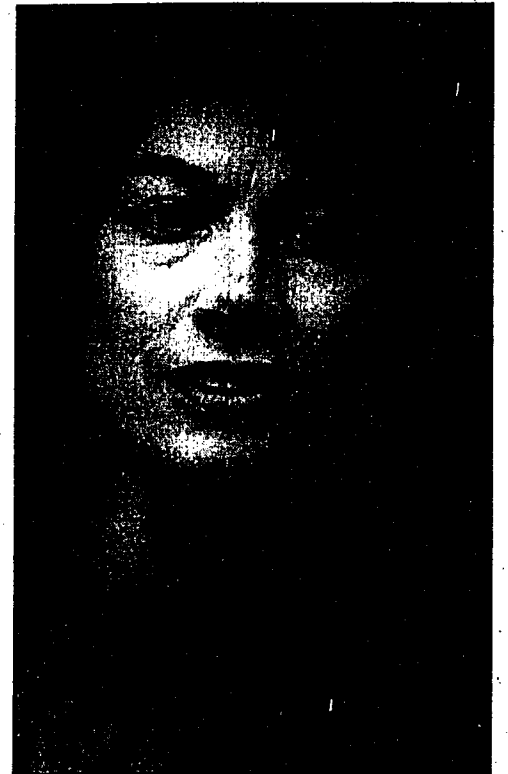
"Basically narrative poems have to be pretty efficient—little short stories. I was interested in how to get meditative and even scientific material and other kinds of intellectual material in to tell the story. Not just tell the bare bones lyrics," Hillman said.

Hillman's sixth will be filled with post-modern work. In the book Hillman experimented with different kinds of layouts for her poems. This new work will be released soon.

*Bright Existence*, Hillman's most recent collection of poems, was nominated for the Pulitzer Prize.

Hillman is the author of five books of poetry: *Coffee, 3 A.M.* (1982), *White Dress* (1985), *Fortress* (1989), *Death Tractates* (1992) and *Bright Existence* (1993).

The second Distinguished Visiting Writer will be Mary Morris. Morris will be teaching a fiction class running from March 25-29. Submissions for entry into the workshop are due March 8. They can be turned in at the English department's main office, Brink Hall, Room 200.
