

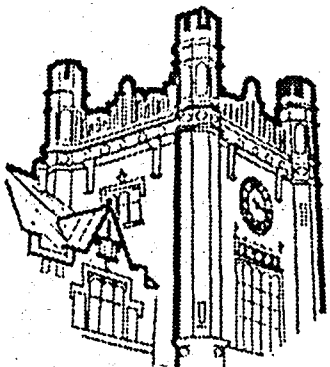
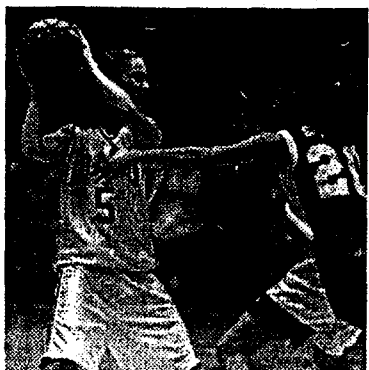

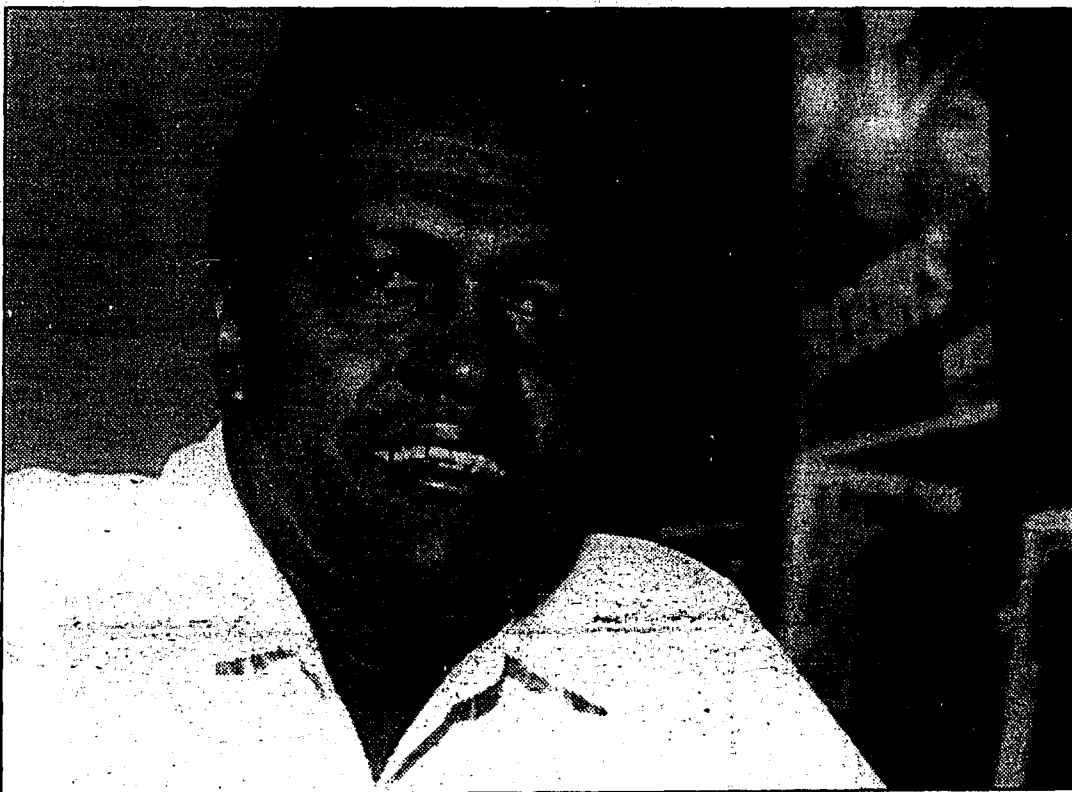

Speaker gives historical Nicaraguan perspective

To help celebrate the 10th anniversary of the Coalition for Central America, Francisco Campbell will speak at 5 p.m. on Feb. 25 in the Moscow Community Center. Campbell's speech will give a historical perspective on Nicaraguan events over the last 13 years.

Campbell will also be meeting with University of Idaho faculty and giving speeches to classrooms on Feb. 26.

Kenton Bird with the coalition said, "Campbell is currently on a one-month tour sponsored by the Pastors for Peace of Minneapolis. He is touring western cities that have Central America Solidarity Organizations."

This is not Campbell's first visit to Moscow. In 1983, while working for the Nicaraguan Embassy in Washington D.C., Campbell came to Moscow and spoke at the Borah Symposium.

Besides being a diplomat Campbell was also a founder of Nicaragua's first university on its Atlantic Coast, the University of the Autonomous Regions of the Caribbean Coast, known as URACCAN.

Campbell is now living in Nicaragua

and is the Vice Rector General of URACCAN. The university is developing many programs in earth resources to aid Nicaragua to manage its resources better.

The Coalition for Central America was founded in February of 1986 to resist U.S. aid to the contra rebels who were trying to overthrow the Nicaraguan government. Since its foundation the coalition has been trying to improve relations with the U.S. through educational and humanitarian aid projects.

"The Coalition has a threefold mission. First, they educate through a quarterly newsletter titled Focus on Central America and a small reference library," Bird said. "Second, they are involved in humanitarian aid by distributing clothing and school and medical supplies. Third, they get involved politically by calling congress and sending a lobbyist to D.C. They are funded through donations and a booth at the Moscow Renaissance Fair."

The Coalition for Central America was founded in Moscow and can be contacted at 883-0898. They also have many branches across the Northwest including Pullman, Spokane, Boise and Sun Valley.

Call to safety: Sounding the alarm

Alarms went off at Wednesday night's ASUI meeting. Safety beeper alarms, that is.

The Safety Task Force demonstrated the new beepers, which students can check out from the library for 24 hours at a time.

"They can't walk in dark alleys with these things. They need to be careful," said Angela Rauch, task force chair.

Students can use the beepers to walk home from the library after dark, or to go to and from night classes. Students must present their ID card to borrow a beeper, she said.

Rauch encouraged the student senators to help strengthen the beeper program by taking the beepers around to their living groups.

Shana Plasters, co-curricular learning coordinator, announced that buses will shuttle UI students to the Danny Glover program at WSU Tuesday. The buses will run every 20 minutes, beginning at 6 p.m. and continuing until 8 p.m. The event is free of charge.

Plasters encouraged students to take the buses, rather than trying to drive and park on the WSU campus.

The buses will leave from the Student Union and from the Wallace Complex. They will return

More campus cops needed

More campus community police officers are needed to meet the needs of the University of Idaho campus.

With only one campus police officer to control the problems of the entire campus, one or more new officers are needed to make campus community policing completely effective.

"I am currently the only campus community officer available," explained Cpl. Carl Wommack of the Moscow Police Department. "More officers are needed because it is impossible to assess and be aware of everything going on campus with just one person."

In 1996 UI and the city of Moscow applied for a grant to increase the number of police officers on campus. Three officers were applied for, but only one was approved.

Since then the Bureau of Justice Administration has re-evaluated the grant and has approved the other two campus community policing positions.

"The only thing we need now is a commitment from the City of Moscow or UI for enough money to fund the officers," Wommack said during the Feb. 20 Panhellenic meeting.

"By getting feedback on how the campus wants the officer to be used, the new positions can be fully defined and funding will

more likely occur."

The campus community police officer works with campus and community members to identify problems, gather information from a variety of sources and link people with public and private agencies that can help solve the problems.

In the 1995-96 year Wommack, as a campus community officer has worked toward the installation of a video surveillance system to prevent car break-ins in lot 25 on the north end of campus and has worked with some new Greek Row fraternities to discuss noise complaints from surrounding community homes.

"Campus police help bridge the

Closing the gate on intruders

In a world with skyrocketing crime rates a common goal is shared by many people...to feel safe and secure at home and work.

Homeowners look to contractors such as Willamette Fence Co., Inc. in Portland, Ore., to help them develop safer communities often termed "Gated Communities." Gate operators and access controls make up the technical control features of

a gated community.

Earlier this year in Pullman, Willamette Fence installed two electric gate operators at the Washington State University Veterinary Teaching Hospital. For safety purposes photo beams were placed on gate openings.

Glen Mills, vice president of Willamette Fence said, "This protects anybody or anything from getting in the gates path while it is opening and closing."

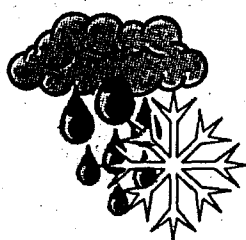
Safety loops in the ground are used if there happens to be a stalled

vehicle on top of the gate opening, these loops keep the gate from closing on the vehicle.

Dennis Wade, president of Willamette Fence Co., Inc. said, "Although gated communities have been around at least 10 years they are gaining popularity as they become more affordable to homeowners."

Why are these gated communities receiving so much attention? Wade said, "Status is part of it, and secu-

Senate panel endorses state management of federal lands

BOISE—Legislation underscoring the state's authority to manage federal lands if given the chance was easily approved on Wednesday by the Senate Resources and Environment Committee.

But even some of the bill's supporters acknowledged it still will be a long wait for the state to replace federal land use policies with its more effective management philosophy because Congress has to act first.

Chairman Laird Noh, R-Kimberly, emphasized that the bill, which now goes to the full Senate, neither adds to nor subtracts from the authority the state Land Board currently has to enter into joint management agreements.

The committee also approved a nonbinding memorial, voicing the Legislature's opposition to any significant sale of public lands.

GOP Sen. Larry Craig and Republican Congressman Helen Chenoweth have been outspoken on the issue of state takeover of federal forests, but a legislative initiative on the federal front has yet to be introduced. Supporters want a pilot project, probably involving a single forest, to test the theory.

Officials contend the state has a long history of efficient public land management, maximizing the financial return on the resources while protecting the environment

and keeping it open to sportsmen and recreationists.

But conservationists point out the federal mandate is for national forest management for multiple uses—not just maximum revenue generation as the state constitution requires for state lands. They also point out that the state's management technique is unencumbered by the strict environmental and public involvement regulations governing federal land management.

Another candidate for Idaho post bows out

MOSCOW—Another of the candidates left in the University of Idaho presidential search has dropped out, saying he was unhappy with the search process.

Scott McNall, provost and vice president for academic affairs at California State University, Chico, on Tuesday confirmed he has withdrawn from consideration, leaving five candidates.

McNall is the second finalist to bow out. M. Roy Schwarz, group vice president of professional standards for the American Medical Association, withdrew Friday.

McNall said he called Rayburn Barton, executive director of the state Board of Education, Friday and announced he did not want to be considered a candidate.

However, he said he was not pleased with the search procedure.

Still in the running are: Larry Brannen, food science and toxicology professor at UI; Nicholas Henry, president of Georgia Southern University, Statesboro; Robert Hoover, vice president for academic affairs at the University of Nevada; J. Kirk Sullivan, vice president for governmental and environmental affairs at Boise Cascade Corp.; Bryan Wildenthal,

provost at the University of Texas, Dallas.

UI extends deadline for financial aid apps

MOSCOW—University of Idaho students filing for financial aid and scholarship priority for the 1996 fall semester will have until March 1 to get their forms to the Office of Student Financial Aid.



"Between the heavy snows throughout Idaho and the devastating floods, we have found many high schools closed for significant periods of time. We hope this extension will provide the opportunity for all our students to receive full consideration for financial aid and scholarships," said Dan Davenport, director of Student Financial Aid.

But extreme weather conditions throughout the Northwest during the past several weeks are not the only reason for the extension.

"The federal government shutdown also affected the ability for the federal processor to process applications in a timely manner," Davenport said.

Marijuana use hurts thinking, study finds

CHICAGO—People who smoke marijuana heavily—at least 22 days a month—may have trouble with mental tasks such as paying attention and performing simple tasks even a day after abstaining, a new study found.



Researchers compared 65 college students who smoked regularly with 64 similar students who smoked only occasionally, nine days a month, at most.

The heavy marijuana users performed significantly worse on tasks involving sustaining and shifting attention than did the light users a day after going without the drug, the researchers said.

Mental impairment may result from a residue of the drug in the brain, from withdrawal or from actual damage to the nervous system, the researchers said.

More than 40 previous studies have explored the residual effects of marijuana on mental and psychological performance, but results have been inconsistent, the researchers said.

The question is important because after a decade of declining use, marijuana's popularity has increased among youth in the last few years, noted a researcher not involved in the study.

Most impairments reported in the new study would not make a heavy marijuana user "stand out in the crowd," Block said. But they could hurt scholastic performance and could worsen over years, he said.

Killer cop's execution delayed

NEW ORLEANS—The State of Louisiana can't execute former New Orleans police officer Antoinette Frank, who was convicted of murdering another officer and two others, until her appeals are heard, the state Supreme Court said.

In a ruling made public Monday, Louisiana's highest court ordered state District Judge Frank Marullo to cancel the "premature execution date" of April 15 given Frank after her conviction last September.

The order came in response to a writ, filed by Frank's attorney, claiming Marullo did not comply with proper procedures, including waiting for an appeal to be heard before setting an execution date.

Prosecutors in the case could not be reached for comment.

Frank, who killed three people in a restaurant robbery, is Louisiana's only female death row inmate.

Frank and an accomplice, Rogers Lacaze, gunned down police officer Ronnie Williams II, and siblings Ha Vu and Cuong Vu while robbing the Kim Anh restaurant in eastern New Orleans.

Lacaze also has been sentenced to death.

Six killed in Northern European blizzard

COPENHAGEN, Denmark—At least six people have died in a ferocious blizzard that blew across Europe for a second day Tuesday. Snow drifted 13 feet deep across some highways, where the storm was the worst since 1971.

Snow depths up to 3 feet were reported in parts of Germany.

For the first time in 17 years, Danish authorities put their snow disaster plan into effect, deploying army vehicles to assist police and ambulances.

Snow trapped some 350 travelers overnight at the western Danish domestic airport of Billund.

Danish Prime Minister Poul Nyrup Rasmussen was stranded briefly when his limousine got stuck in a snowdrift while he toured western Denmark on Monday. He continued unharmed.

Stranded Danish motorists abandoned their cars and sought shelter in schools where the civil defense distributed blankets, food and warm drinks.

The storm stretched as far south as Spain, where it combined with high winds to force organizers of the World Alpine Championships to postpone the men's combined downhill competition until Wednesday.

Heavy snow blocked roads between Spain and France. Access to more than 300 mountain villages was cut off.

Carnival pays tribute to former slave

RIO DE JANEIRO, Brazil—It was a fitting role for the woman who claims to be the world's oldest person: Roughly a century after her release from slavery, Maria do Carmo Geronimo rode atop a Carnival float dressed as the grandmother of an historic Brazilian slave revolt leader.

Geronimo claims to be 124 years old. But because of questions surrounding her birth certificate, the Guinness Book of Records gives the title to a French woman who turns 121 on Wednesday.

As the center of attention in a Rio parade Tuesday, Geronimo wasn't worried about the dispute.

Propped atop a red and gold float that carried her down Rio's Sambadrome, Geronimo portrayed a mythical African princess, Aqualtune, whose grandson Zumbi led a slave revolt 300 years ago. Geronimo, surrounded by topless women in grass skirts, waved to the 90,000 singing and dancing spectators along the parade route.

Geronimo's back still bears the scars of whip lashes from her master. She says his name—Jose Garcia—still sends chills up her spine.

Geronimo says she was born on March 8, 1871—17 years before slavery was abolished in Brazil, and nearly four years before Jeanne Calment of France.

Geronimo's supporters say confusion over her birth document, a baptismal paper issued by Catholic missionaries instead of a birth certificate, has kept her from her place in the Guinness book's international edition. She is listed in the Brazilian edition, and Guinness executives have promised to clear up the matter by July.

UI, WSU Students taking longer to graduate

The faculty council discussed possible reasons why UI students are taking longer to graduate, as well as what position the council will take on the university presidential selection.

George Simmons, Interim Provost, cited that the trend indicates that students take five to five and a half years to earn their Bachelors degree.

At UI, 10 percent graduate in four years, 36 percent in five years, and 42 percent in six years. Twenty years ago 20 percent graduated in four years, which does not make sense to Simmons since incoming freshman have higher test scores and better grades coming out of high school.

Simmons fears that the degree programs, faculty advising and departments could partially be at fault; primarily because Washington State University boasts 23 per-

cent graduating in four years and 48 percent in five. Also because the University of Rhode Island, which is also a land grant institution and requires the same academic achievements as UI, reports 43 percent of their students graduate in four years and 61 percent in five.

In a report by Kathy Barnard in the *Idaho Register*, "Overall, incoming University of Idaho students today are higher academic achievers than their predecessors. Their ACT and SAT scores are higher. A higher percentage of them report receiving an A average in high school. More valedictorians than ever are attending UI."

So why are the numbers continuing to drop? The provost wants to investigate. Barnard said, "The university has taken dramatic measures over the past several years to increase the retention rate of incoming freshman, but graduation rates have not yet moved upward."

Simmons proposed that several things could be at play. He suggest-

ed that the present student body is looking for a wider variety in the educational experience than what the UI is offering. With 60 percent of the students changing majors at least once during their stay here, it should be important that their previous work is transferable. Yet the problem arises when the departmental requirements become more specific. In the engineering program alone, switching majors could mean the loss of one semester worth of work at the least.

Advising could be another problem. Most freshman are advised to take only 14 credits their first semester, starting them out behind the ball. If a student wants to graduate in four years, he or she would have to carry 16 credits for the following six semesters, and one at 18 credits.

Simmons feels that the faculty is setting the students up not to graduate on time. In fact, 18 percent of incoming freshman expect that

WSU looking at four year guarantee plan

The 1993 Washington Legislature mandated that state universities and colleges move to improve their graduation rates. Washington State University is thus following in the footsteps of universities nationwide in proposing a four-year degree guarantee.

The plan's aim is to lower the graduation rate from the current 4.79 years to 4.5 years by 2010 and has been endorsed by WSU's Regents.

WSU Provost Tom George said, "We are excited about this proposal and are looking forward to seeing it implemented." The plan could be in effect as early as Fall 1996 if it continues to achieve affirmation throughout the university system.

George presented the four-year degree plan to faculty members on Feb. 15 and encountered both acceptance and concern. Members expressed anxiety with the emphasis on better advising and with making sure resources for this proposal would be in place before it went into effect. The concern of whether this proposal would hinder students being able to explore other academic avenues was also expressed.

"For the most part though, the response was positive," George said.

Another proponent, Registrar Monty Nielsen, explained that both

the university and students would be required to work together with this plan.

"Students would be required to keep on track in their educational programs and to take a full academic course load each term," Nielsen said. The university likewise shares responsibility and sees its role as providing adequate advising, making sure students understand graduation requirements and providing access to courses for students to complete their programs on time.

There was not expected to be changes within each program nor will the plan address the question of whether the requirements for graduation within each academic program are justifiable. Funding to each department is based on the number of students in it.

One claim has surfaced that some program requirements for completion of a degree are greater to keep student in their department longer. Nielsen said, "We rely on the integrity of each department in setting course requirements." Only programs that currently can be completed in four years will be taking part in this plan.

There are no penalties for students who are unable to complete their degree in the allotted four years. Enrollment by students will be entirely voluntary. Seventy academic programs have indicated they would be willing to participate in the four-year degree plan.

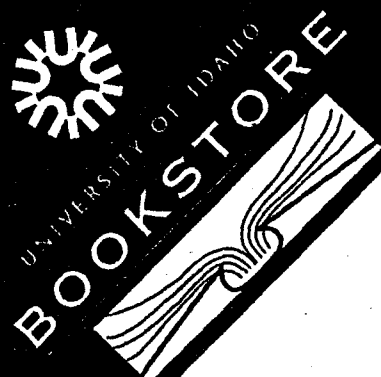

HIV/AIDS task force gears up for spring

The HIV/AIDS task force has a busy spring in the making.

Dr. Susan Gelletly with Student Health Services and HIV/AIDS Health Coordinator for the task force said the group is planning several events for this spring, including a safe spring break week, a tree planting, developing theater productions about HIV/AIDS, working on policy and developing outreach programs.

The HIV/AIDS task force was established in the 1980's when the question of providing condoms on campus was a controversial topic. The task force's members are students and faculty concerned about HIV/AIDS issues on the UI campus.

Now in 1996, students can purchase condoms in vending machines around campus and at Student Health Services in the pharmacy. Gelletly said UI was one of the first Idaho universities to provide condoms on campus.

Gelletly said the task force's three objectives are outreach, working on university policy regarding HIV/AIDS and environmental awareness issues like increasing HIV/AIDS awareness through posters and other passive events.

After the HIV/AIDS task force founding, the group was relatively inactive but worked largely with the Palouse Aids Network.

In the last two years the HIV/AIDS task force has become more active and established some structure to start the group off again. Student leaders from around campus along with faculty and

community members were invited to join the group in working with HIV/AIDS issues on campus.

Now they would like to add to their group "anybody who is very hardworking," Dr. Gelletly said. "The task force is very open to anybody that is interested."

The group has decided to dedicate a flowering crabapple tree in Kara Claypool's honor. Claypool

was a young girl who died in August from complications with the virus.

Another project of the HIV/AIDS task force is to work closely with the university on policy. The task force monitors policies set to ensure it protects those who need protection and prevent discrimination.

The policies and information handbook for students said it "suggests adopting guidelines for responding to each case as appropriate."

Policy does recognize that AIDS is a serious public health problem that needs attention and resources. The policy also says the university's objective is to, "Provide a positive context for educating all segments of the UI community about AIDS."

The task force is working with environmental measures and out-

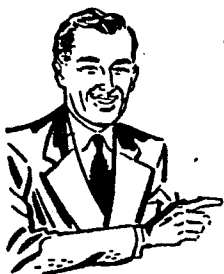
reach programs to raise HIV/AIDS awareness. Gelletly said the task force is trying to, "Put a human face on this disease. We need to realize it can strike any one of us depending on our risks and behaviors."

The task force advocates education and not engaging in high risk behavior. Gelletly said many people feel only a distant threat of HIV/AIDS infection.

Even though there is a preference in some parts of the state for abstinence-based education, the task force explores all branches of HIV/AIDS issues.

The task force also talks about new treatments and how they affect the treatment of the virus. Gelletly says a new drug called Invirhiz, a protease inhibitor, is much more effective in treatment and works with the drug AZT to slow down the progression of the virus.

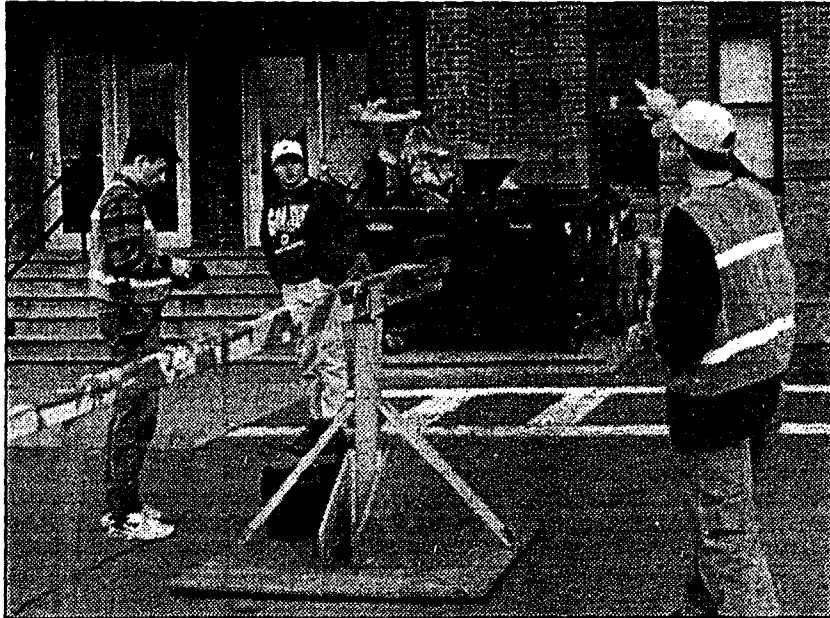
city is the other."

Wade said, in Redmond, Ore., there is a golf course community called Eagle Crest, with a lot of condominiums and homesites. In the homesite area, a gate operator is set up with an access code. These codes are known only by the members of the community or their guests. Without the code, clearance is not made available.

Mills said, "If you wish for the safety of a gated community, but live in a rural area you may want a gate operator placed at the end of your driveway to restrict access to the property."

Mills added gate operators and access controls are also beneficial to businesses as they can be used to monitor employees—for example who's coming and going.

"We are presently in the process of installing a security system at our office so our foremans have access to the yard. It's similar to the gated communities," Mills said. "Everyone will have a different code, and with the transmitter, we can tell whether I was in the yard on Saturday night or if one of our crews was here at 5 a.m. Monday morning. It gives us a complete printout of all the transmittals. In other words, it allows us to monitor who goes in and out of our yard."

Four charged with evading securities laws

WASHINGTON—A broker, a New York law firm and two companies agreed Wednesday to settle charges they evaded federal securities laws through illegal overseas stock sales.

Salvatore Mazzeo, 47, president and co-owner of the now-defunct brokerage Westfield Financial Corp., agreed to a five-month suspension by the Securities and Exchange Commission and to obey regulations in future.

Law firm Schneck, Weltman Hashmall & Mischel and two companies, Candie's Inc., a Purchase, N.Y.-based women's shoe company and Delaware-based Response USA, maker of emergency response systems agreed to obey securities laws in the future.

All four defendants settled the SEC's charges without admitting or denying wrongdoing.

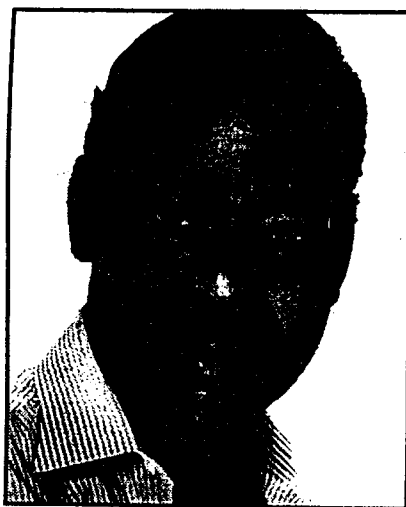
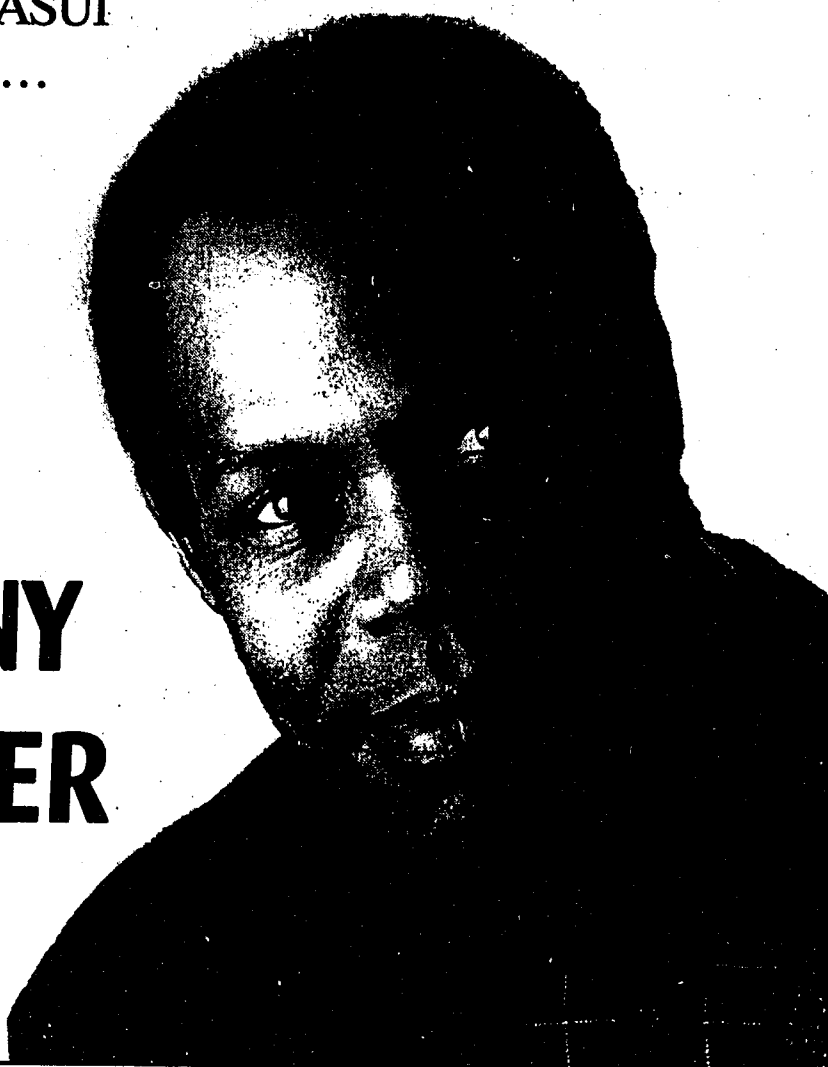

their stay here will be over four years, and primarily because they believe their major requires it, when only architecture actually requires over a four year commitment.

Simmons proposed students meet with their faculty advisor sooner than second semester freshman year. Also, he suggested offering "freshman only" core courses so that they do not have to compete with seasoned upperclassmen and it would be more conducive to forming study groups. He also indicated dropping the credit requirement from 128 to 120, which is divisible by 15 credits per semester, "which only makes sense since our classes are usually three credits each...and students often struggle to find that extra credit,"

said Simmons.

The faculty council also discussed Faculty Council chair, Larry Brannen's leave of absence due to his finalist status in the Presidential search. Mary Bolin, vice chair of the Council, will be the Acting Chair in his absence.

Bolin suggested that the faculty council be actively involved in the selection of a new president. She announced the interview times of the five candidates (down from seven) and advised the council to devise a list of questions to be distributed to the finalists before the interviews take place. After which they would form a letter addressed to the selecting committee with the faculty council's findings and recommendation for the new president of UI.

The SEC's charges concern a scheme to evade federal laws that require companies to register sales of their stocks and bonds with the government. The SEC has been trying to crack down on companies that claim to sell securities to foreign investors, thereby evading registration rules, when the securities actually remain in the U.S. market.

Such a scheme can hurt investors because the additional sales of stock can dilute the value of a company's existing securities.

The SEC charged that at total of \$3.73 million worth of stock in Candie's and Response USA was sold in four separate offerings in

1993, purportedly to foreign investors when actually the shares remained in the U.S. market. The Schneck Weltman firm arranged the four transactions, the SEC said.

The unregistered stock was sold to the foreign investors at a substantial discount in return for a short-term loan in the form of promissory notes.

Jonathan Price, an attorney for Schneck Weltman, said the firm agreed to settle the case after weighing the time, effort and expense of contesting the SEC's charges.

Telephone calls to attorneys for the other defendants weren't immediately returned.

Is the Telecommunications Decency Act necessary?

As many of you know already, I am not a great fan of the World Wide Web. In fact, I could go as far as saying the only consistent benefit I see from increased Internet use is decreased television viewing, but that might be exaggerating just a hair too much.

But I do use the Net. It's a fun toy, occasionally educational and often entertaining, just as television is but even more so, since nowhere except maybe on the Cartoon Network can one find an eclectic collection of kooks, nuts and whackos to rival those who advertise their utter weirdness to the world at large than on the Net.

I know I am not alone in this fascinating love/hate relationship with technology. I also hope I am not alone in agreeing that to preserve the openness and free spirit of the Internet, some regulation or control must come into play.

The Decency in Communications Act of the new telecommunications law passed last week by both houses of Congress seeks, pending promised presidential approval, to prohibit indecent material on-line where anyone, especially children, could access it. Unfortunately, as is par for rules of this sort, our well-meaning rule makers skirted the issue of semantics and gave us an umbrella bill that is ambiguous enough to cause mass panics among huddled Web masses and among people who hold their First Amendment rights dear to their hearts. Congress neglected to define what they mean by "indecent."

This ambiguity has led to fears that sites related to abortion rights, breast cancer research, AIDS prevention and art will be blacked out permanently. This anxiety also points toward the biggest, most unfounded and most favorite Trojan Horse of web users: government surveillance of e-mail.

Phooey.

The goal of this telecommunications act is not to deny access to worthwhile causes such as medical research, artistic expression and free speech. The goal of this act is to protect minds, individuals and children from the destructive force of on-line pornography and sexually explicit material. This type of material is degrading to women, destructive to men, poison for children and an evil festering sore on the God-fearing morals upon which our country was founded.

I am a great fan of the First Amendment, but this battered section of the Constitution is a sorry shield and an eternal last resort for groups and individuals who have no other defense, aside from the even weaker appeal to "art," to offer for their destructive materials and philosophies.

Yet how can I, a person who enjoys the right to offer my opinion not only in print form but also in electronic form on the site I maintain on the Web, avoid the catch-22 that snares even the most vehement of debaters on both sides of any free speech argument? Because I

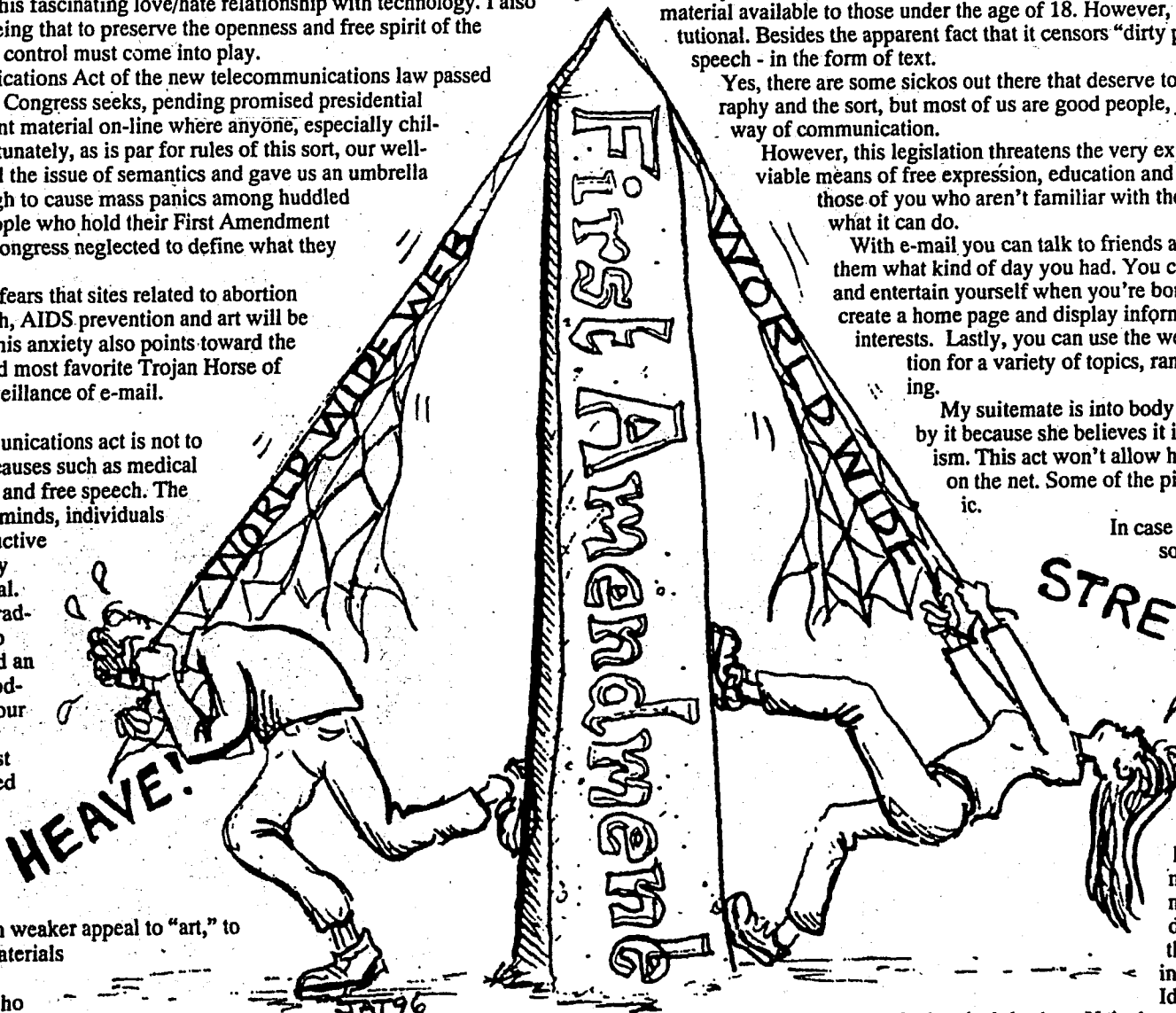

The man has described Hitler as "an individual of great courage." Enough said.

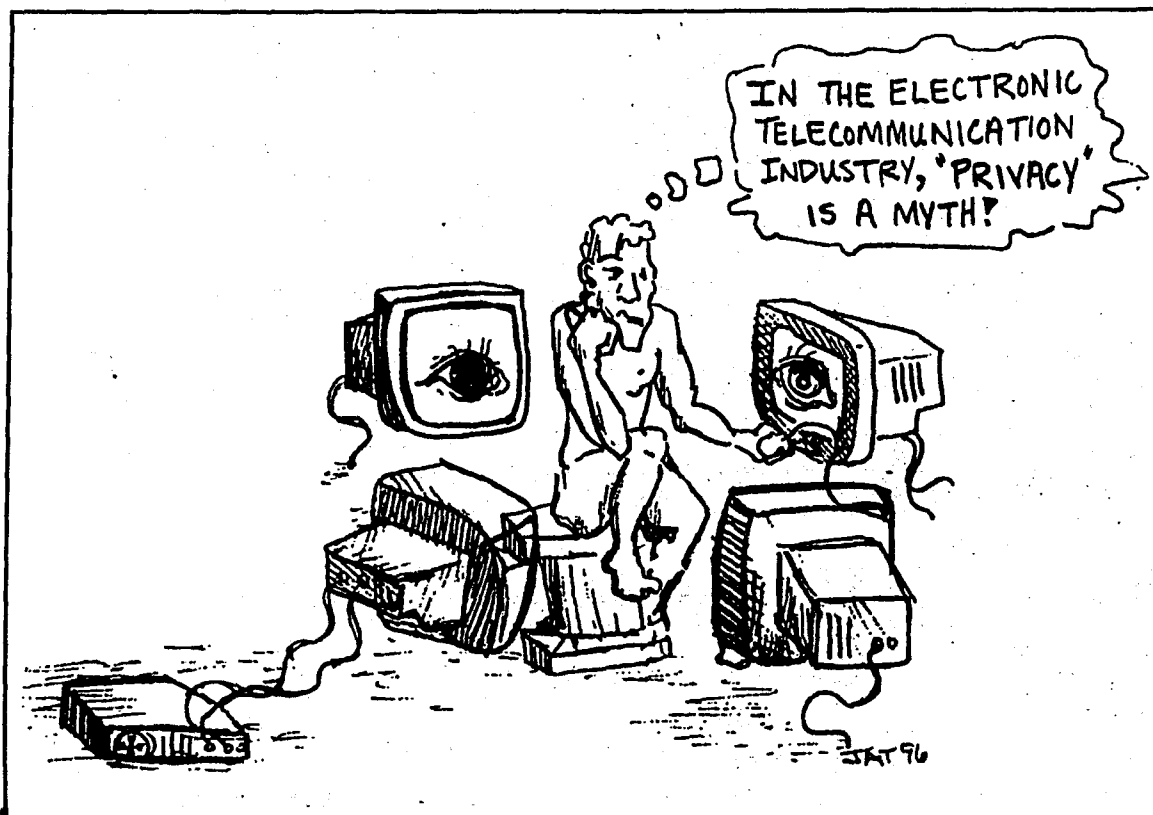

"While the stated intent of this provision is to limit minors' access to indecent material, in fact its effect will be to limit everyone's constitutionally guaranteed right to free expression," said Rep. Jerrold Nadler (D-NY).

Even if you aren't a computer nut, you should still recognize the breach in our First Amendment rights. The Telecommunications Act is contrary to our basic American ideals, and we cannot allow the government to invade our basic privacy like this.

The American Civil Liberties Union has already filed suit against the bill, but it is not enough. We need to fight for our guaranteed rights and promote electronic freedom.

enjoy my rights, it cannot be acceptable to limit the rights of other Net users.

But just maybe it is acceptable.

Those who have objections to material of any kind, whether in print or electronic form, have the right to voice their objections and even demand control of offensive material. Liberals have waged successful wars along that tack for years.

Madeline Murray O'Hair and the American Civil Liberties Union have successfully lobbied against public expression of religious values; curtailing the rights of those who wish to express value offensive to some. Those who profess religious values, then, according to precedents by liberals who claim tolerance but practice it only selectively, have the right to curtail the public expression of values they find offensive. With access touted around the world there are few things more public than the Internet.

Liberals need to give conserva-

tives, and I might as well say religious conservatives, a break. You chastise them for taking the moral high ground while at the same time you flaunt your supposed intellectual and artistic superiority. I've said it before and I'll say it again: No one political movement has a monopoly on stupidity. Mucci wrote to him in an e-mail message that even if the Student Union wanted to control outside food from coming in, they probably wouldn't be able to. However, I've had the rumor confirmed by the pizza place I attempted to order food from.

I don't see how anyone in the Student Union can keep me and others who work in the building from ordering food from outside businesses. Mucci told Sasse that the Student Union has "a contract with Marriott that gives them exclusive food service opportunities in the building."

However, Marriott does not offer pizza anywhere in the Student Union. Burger King closes at 7:30 p.m. on Monday-Thursday, and Taco Bell closes at 9 p.m. on the same days. Like I said before, we work late up here on production nights, and a person can only eat so many burgers and tacos. I guess one of the reasons they're cracking down on this food thing is because some group of people ordered 60 pizzas without going through Marriott's catering service. All I wanted was one pizza. I hope someone in the Student Union will find some way to get a pizza joint in the place.

If pizzas are outlawed, only outlaws will have pizza!

Idaho goes cold against NAU

With a winter storm watch in effect for the Palouse Region this evening, Idaho caught a frigid breeze in Memorial Gym, but it didn't come from the weather.

The Vandals shot an arctic 31 percent in the first half, but were lucky to trail only by nine at the half 32-23. Northern Arizona stepped it up in the second half, shooting a torrid 50 percent from the field, but an even more impressive 76 percent from the free throw line on 22-29 shooting. NAU outscored the Vandals 16-6 to start the second half, with Idaho getting no closer than 12 throughout the second half, before finally falling 79-60 in Big Sky Conference action Thursday night.

Idaho was playing without its leading scorer and rebounder Mindy Rice due to a reoccurring foot problem.

Idaho Head Coach Julie Holt said, "We knew since Saturday Mindy wouldn't play. We missed her rebounds scoring and leadership tonight."

More importantly than Rice's absence was the effect it had on Idaho's post-season chances. Idaho must now win two of its next three games and hope for help.

NAU came out of the blocks smoking, grabbing an early 4-0 lead, but Idaho responded to keep the game close at 23-20 with 4:00 left in the first half. NAU then went on a 9-3 run to finish the first.

It was much of the same in the second half, as NAU jumped to a 46-27 lead and never looked back.

Idaho put a couple of mini runs together, but NAU's foul shooting was the final straw for the Vandals.

"NAU did a good job in transition, but we didn't play very well," said Holt. "Our players have to step up and play and we didn't, maybe I have to do a better job coaching."

The Lumberjacks were led in scoring by Marisa von Bromssen with 18, followed by Karli Rikli's 15 and Jenny Shayani's 10. Rikli added 14 boards to her point total, as NAU out rebounded the Vandals 51-29 for the game and really set the tone on the glass.

Idaho had three double figure scorers as well, with Ari Skorpik and Natalie Hawks leading the way at 17 apiece. Michelle Greenwood pitched in 10 points respectively.

The Vandals will host Weber State Saturday night at 7:05 p.m. in Memorial Gym, with this game concluding the Vandals home schedule.

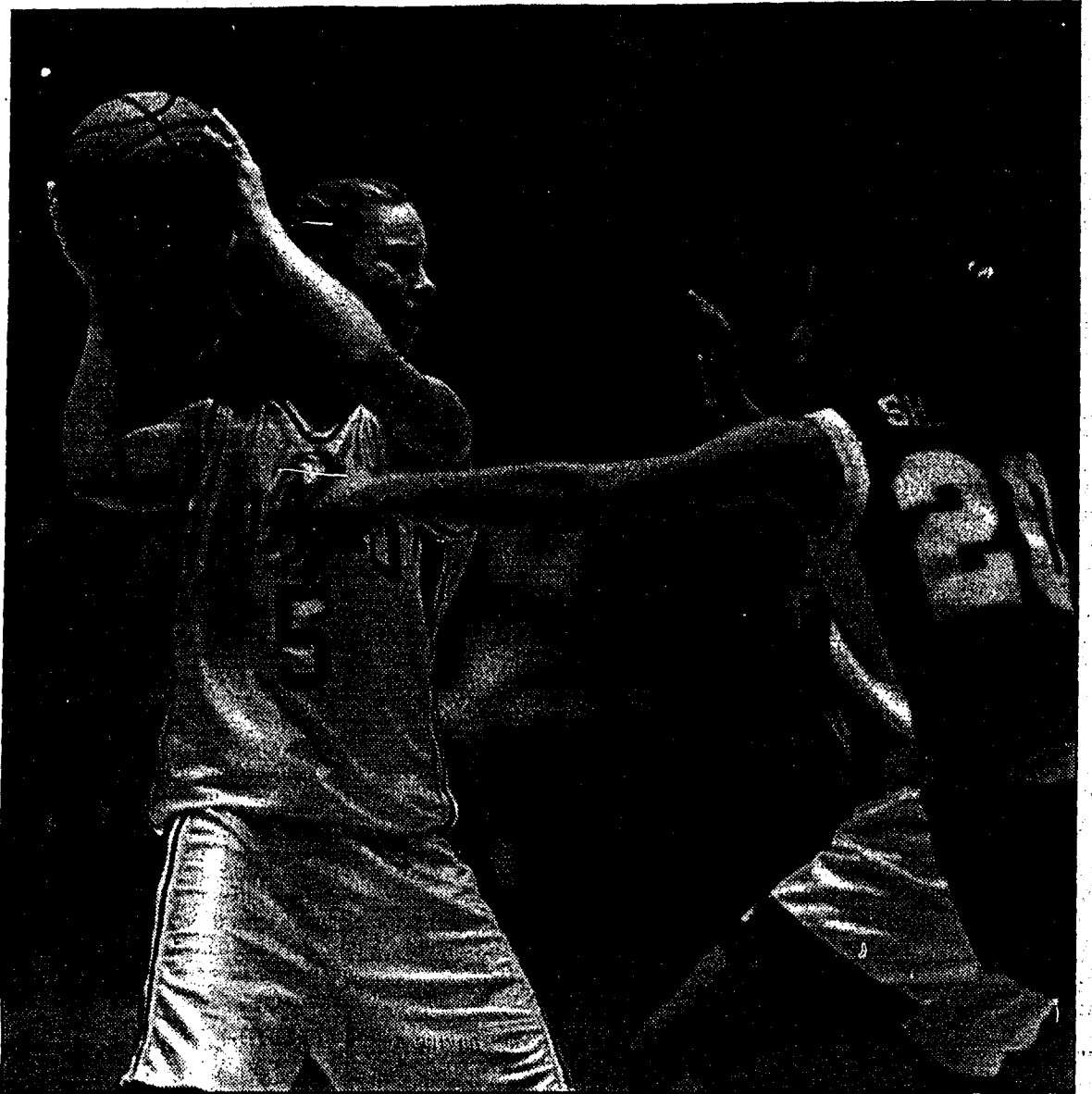

Vandals lose yet another in Flagstaff

Some people believe that everyone deserves a second chance. On Thursday night, the Lumberjacks of Northern Arizona became greedy and grabbed third, fourth and fifth chances on the offensive boards.

And so it goes, the team that touches the ball most wins, as did NAU 79-69 over the Vandals in a Big Sky Conference matchup in front of 1,587 Skydome fans in Flagstaff. The Wildcats (2-10, 5-18) snagged 43 rebounds as opposed to Idaho's 23.

"That pretty much sums it up," Idaho coach Joe Cravens said. "Those are effort things."

The key statistic for the Wildcats is Idaho's four offensive boards compared to NAU's 19. Although if you ask Wildcat center Brett Bowden, he might tell you different. Bowden, usually not considered a prolific scorer, poured in 26 points to lead his Wildcats to the win over the Vandals.

"I don't have the answer any more, it's within the team," Cravens said. "I apologize to anyone who watches this Vandal team."

NAU scored five points in the last 19 seconds to put the game out of reach for the Vandals. Idaho (4-7, 10-13) will travel to Weber State Saturday with hopes of winning at least one of the next three games and clinch a play-off spot. The NAU win keeps the Wildcats mathematically alive for the BSC Tournament and snaps a six game losing streak.

Early on, the game looked to be going the Vandals' way after Jason Jackman hit a pair of free throws to put Idaho up 30-23 with 5:41 left in the

first half. The Lumberjacks chopped back at the Vandal lead and finally went up 35-32 after senior Wildcat Marcel Ten Berge hit his first career three-pointer with 2:06 remaining before half.

Going into the second half, the Vandals trailed 37-35 and looked to pull off an impressive, like performance like that against Eastern Washington last Saturday.

I didn't happen.

Instead Idaho shot 46 percent in the second half and let NAU go up 67-62 after Jerome Riley's layup with under four minutes remaining in the game. Riley added a dunk with :19 left and put NAU up 76-69, deleting any chances of an Idaho comeback.

A bright spot for the Vandals was senior Harry Harrison pulling in his 500th rebound and becoming only the 15th Vandal in history to reach the mark. Harrison had eight rebounds and eight points on the night. Idaho was led by Jackman's 19 points.

NCAA ties into a wise move

The NCAA finally pulled its head out last week from wherever it tends to hide it.

After years of asking, no more like yelling "WHY?" college football fans will no longer have to watch their favorite teams battle down to the wire and then walk away with a tie. Starting next fall the NCAA will institute an overtime procedure in which each team gets a chance to line up at the 25-yard and score. The rule change will affect only Division 1 teams. Yes, that means with the move to the Big West no Vandal games will end in ties.

Of course the decision was a no brainer. This leads me to believe the NCAA must have recently just received its brain since it has had the power to do away with the tie for years.

Nobody was screaming in jubilation in South Bend or Ann Arbor when neither team walked away victorious. The absence of a tie-breaker cost the Wolverines a shot at the national title. Sure they were undefeated, but sportswriters don't rank teams with three ties in the top 5. If the Wolverines had won those three games in an overtime, maybe

a national championship banner would be hanging in Michigan and not Alabama.

I'm just absolutely dumbfounded as to why it took the NCAA this long to do away with the old system. Fans certainly didn't like the old way of doing things. A fan poll conducted on ESPNET showed 80 percent of respondents approved of the new plan.

I'm not going out on an limb by saying people who watch college football on television watch the NFL. Is there an overtime setup in the NFL? Of course the answer is yes. Players and fans grow up watching the best football players in the world win or lose. College players dream about playing in the NFL. You don't aspire to be the

NFL scores early in bout with Cowboys

NEW YORK—Dallas Cowboys owner Jerry Jones says he knew it was a long shot to get a judge to toss out a lawsuit accusing the team of violating league marketing contracts.

"I've been sued before and know that if we had prevailed on a motion to dismiss, it would be like winning a game by forfeit after the coin toss," Jones said after U.S. District Judge Shira Scheindlin allowed the case to proceed Tuesday.

She rejected Jones' motion to dismiss and ruled the lawsuit by NFL Properties can proceed. No trial date was set.

"We had hoped to dispose of these claims with minimal process, but the judge decided that she wanted to hear more from both sides," Jones said from Texas.

The NFL sued the Cowboys last September for more than \$300

million, saying the club had broken its agreements regarding club trademarks and logos by promoting companies on their own.

NFL lawyers argued last week that its negotiating stance for deals it makes on behalf of all the football teams are weakened when one team does its own promotions.

For example, while the rest of the league is promoting Coca-Cola through a deal arranged by the NFL's marketing arm, the Cowboys are promoting and selling Pepsi at Texas Stadium.

Scheindlin said in a written opinion Tuesday that the NFL had shown the minimal facts required to keep the case going forward.

The NFL alleged that deals the Cowboys made with Pepsi, Nike and American Express violated a trust agreement the club had signed in 1982 authorizing the NFL to negotiate commercial uses of the team's name, helmet, uni-

form and slogans.

"This is a blatant breach of ... the most fundamental obligations of good faith dealing," NFL lawyer Herbert Wachtell said at least week's hearing.

"This is about power," countered lawyer Michael Klein on behalf of the Cowboys. "This case is simply one facet in an overall political and economic battle going on inside the NFL."

Klein said the NFL was not willing to settle the lawsuit, even though Jones has offered to share licensing proceeds, possibly with 60 percent going to his club and 40 percent to other teams.

"This lawsuit is worth more pending than it is resolved to NFL Properties," said Klein, "because they walk around claiming that Jerry Jones is misappropriating property and doing terrible and awful things and tearing up the league when, in fact, he is not."

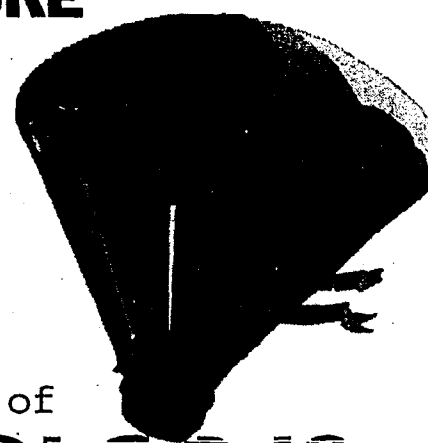

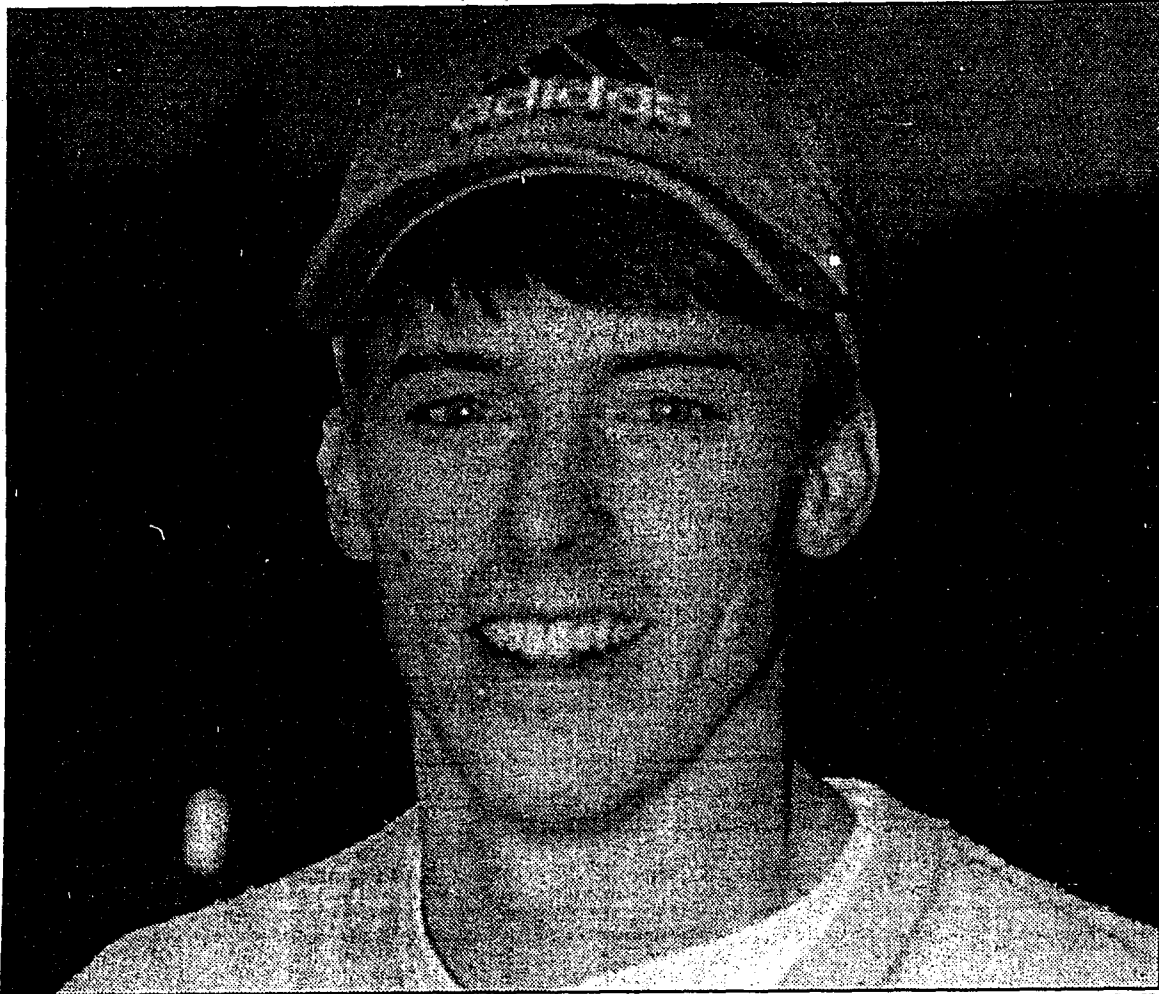

Oregon native Hathaway soaring in Idaho

Professional coach Sam Masubini's statement "you cannot put in what God's left out" to young 1924 Olympic hopeful Harold Abrahams, in the popular film *Chariots of Fire*, describes the raw talent and superior coaching an athlete needs to succeed.

Idaho high jumper Thad Hathaway's climb to the collegiate Division 1 level did not reach a plateau until coming to Idaho where Hathaway has been able to harness past coach's help with technique, strength and speed, establishing himself as a successful high jumper.

"My coach in high school didn't really know any techniques for the high jump to teach me, so I would just run and jump over the bar," Hathaway said. "Even though I could clear 6-feet 10-inches, I had no clue about the approach or any other jumping technique."

Involved initially as a distance runner in high school in La Grande, Oregon, Hathaway's coach pointed him toward the high jump and long jump.

"One day it just clicked, I went from jumping 6-4 to jumping 6-9 1/2 breaking the school record," Hathaway said. "I then realized that I had some potential in the high jump."

Hathaway attended Eastern Oregon State College for a couple of years where he had to start learning how to jump all over again, with the *crutch* of a coach this time. Coaching at Eastern Oregon made the beginning difference for Hathaway.

"Eastern Oregon's coach helped me with strength, technique, approach and conditioning," said Hathaway. "During the two years I was in Oregon, my personal best of 6-10 climbed five inches to 7-3 3/4."

A scholarship opportunity was what Hathaway wanted. In his search for schools to continue his

jumping, he concentrated on many schools in the Northwest. His final choice came down to Boise State and Idaho.

"The biggest difference was the coaching staff, quite frankly they were rude at Boise State," Hathaway said. "Coach Keller knew me, knew who I was, knew what I had jumped and wanted to help me in my career."

Looking back, Hathaway believes the coaching staff at Eastern Oregon and his belief in God, who he credits for his success, transformed his technique the most, making him a likely prospect for Idaho. Hathaway possessed the ability before he even knew it and now that he has come this far his goals have not changed the slightest for what he intends to achieve. They have changed as far as the effort he now must pull together to be successful in getting his degree in Sport Science and running possibilities after graduation. His wake-up call came last year when he sprained his ankle playing basketball. He realized he had to concentrate primarily on jumping and not take his opportunity lightly to achieve the kind of results he was after. For Hathaway this meant improving his jumping by two inches every meet.

"My initial goals coming here were to improve my jump 3 3/4 inches last year, but the transition here was not as smooth as I had hoped and I had to learn the whole system over again, getting mentally prepared for jumping," Hathaway said. "My new goal is to make it to nationals and I would love to make it to the Olympic trials for which the automatic qualifying height is 7-6."

Since this is his senior year, Hathaway finds himself fighting harder and harder to achieve more so he might possibly pick up a sponsor, jumping unattached after this year, his last year of eligibility. However, side stepping the spotlight, Hathaway remembers what it was like making it as far as he is now and how he had to prepare himself to be successful, taking nothing for granted.

"My advice to young high jumpers would be to look at film and really concentrate on building a strong base you can build off of," Hathaway said. "I've seen a lot of people who build in strength and speed, but they don't have the technique yet and that is what can really hurt your performance. Another thing is getting yourself in a positive mind set, being enthusiastic about going to practices ... because you want to instead of you have to and working out to improve."

Hathaway shined at last Friday night's UI Indoor Track and Field Meet, leading the pack with a jump of 7-0 1/2.

Sonics' GM quietly optimistic despite recent postseason jinx

SEATTLE—After the Seattle SuperSonics' second straight first-round playoff collapse, Wally Walker resisted the temptation to start all over again.

He refused to make a blockbuster trade involving either All-Stars Gary Payton and Shawn Kemp. And he didn't fire coach George Karl.

"I looked at the team and the coaching staff and what I saw were positives," the Sonics general manager said.

Fifty-one games into the season, the Sonics are playing better than any team in the franchise's history, better than their team two years ago that set a franchise regular-season record for wins and better than the 1979 Sonics who won the club's only NBA championship.

On Monday night, the Sonics made it seven straight victories for the second time this season, beating Atlanta to improve their Key Arena record to 23-2.

At 39-12, they're two games better than they were two years ago when they won 63 games. Since a 9-6 November, they're 30-6 and they're running away in the Pacific Division.

Like the dominating Bulls in the East, the Sonics are smoking in the West. Because of the Bulls' remarkable start, Seattle is going unnoticed, though.

"Since November, it's just been tremendous," Walker said. "You can't be anything but ecstatic about the way the team has played."

Kemp and Payton are still the big stars. Kemp was selected for his fourth consecutive All-Star Game and his third in a row as a starter. Payton was chosen to play in his third straight All-Star game.

They're starting with Detlef Schrempf, Hersey Hawkins and Ervin Johnson. Nate McMillan, Sam Perkins, Vincent Askew and Frank Brickowski have been Seattle's key players off the bench.

And the Sonics have played 19 games without Schrempf, a two-time former All-Star who was sidelined with a broken left leg. Schrempf is just beginning to play well again.

When the Los Angeles Lakers eliminated the Sonics in the first round last season, there was strong speculation they would make major changes, starting with Karl and involving either Payton or Kemp.

Walker looked at what he had

and what he didn't have. He kept Karl and Payton and Kemp. He traded disgruntled Kendall Gill to Charlotte for an outside shooter who would blend well, Hawkins. He sent Sarunas Marciulionis to Sacramento for Brickowski, who didn't even play last season.

The result?

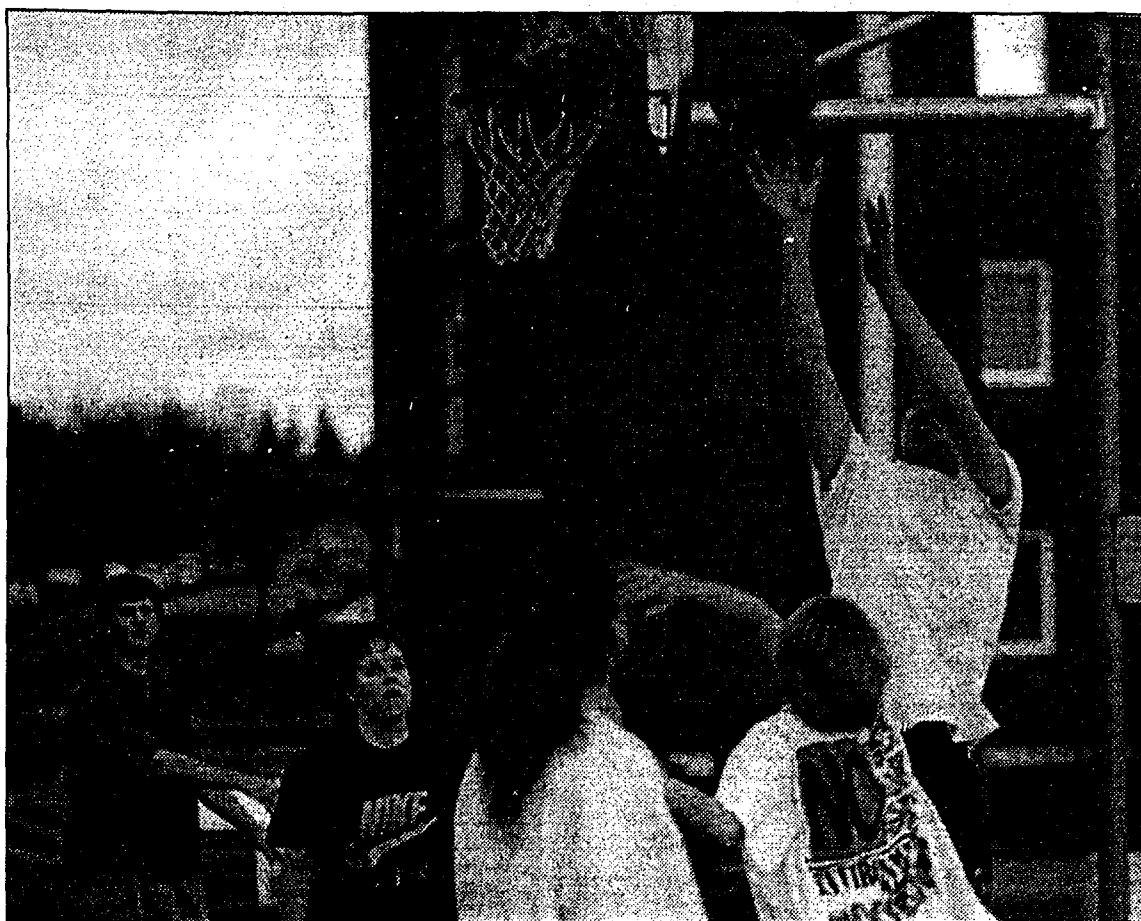
The Sonics have been better on the floor and they've been happy in the locker room.

"After talking to all the players and coaches, I just felt all it was going to take was some fine tuning. I felt the group deserved a chance to come back and play together and improve on their past playoff performances."

The Sonics realize their regular-season accomplishments won't mean anything if they go out in the first round of the playoffs for the third straight season.

Karl, in the final year of his contract, could be gone if the Sonics fail to make it to the NBA Finals. He could even be gone if the Sonics don't win the title.

If that happens, Payton, who is an unrestricted free agent, could choose not to return. Payton's career has flourished under Karl.

Hamp's gala concert kicks off Festival

When the lights dimmed in the Administration Building Auditorium Tuesday night, the beginning of the 29th Lionel Hampton Jazz Festival was underway.

Hamp's Gala Concert, a prelude to the multitude of activities in this year's festival, gave attendees a chance to see three great UI performing groups. The Wind Ensemble, Jazz Choir I and Jazz Band I all performed various selections and set the tone for this week's Festival.

The Wind Ensemble, directed by Robert Spevacek, was the first group to take the auditorium stage. Spevacek greeted the audience and said it was nice that the Festival was once again underway. "It's great to perform here from our home that's named after an old friend—the Lionel Hampton School of Music," he said.

The Ensemble jumped to life with a John Phillips Sousa number called "Easter Monday on the White House Lawn." Not a typical Sousa march piece, "Easter Monday" had a very upbeat and rollicking feel.

The second piece performed by the Ensemble was a "Concerto for Trombone" by N. Rimsky-Korsokov. UI trombonist Jason Malloy was the featured soloist in the concerto, and carried the piece along wonderfully.

To close their set, the Ensemble performed "Russian Sailor's Dance" by

Reinhold Gliere. Featuring dynamic swings in tempo and sound, this piece gave me a feeling that I was sailing the high seas of the Baltic instead of sitting in the auditorium listening.

After a brief intermission to

clear the stage, Jazz Choir I was the second group to perform in the evening. Under the direction of Daniel Bukvich, the choir did five numbers: "Listen to the Lambs," "Stardust," "Samba!" "When I Fall In Love" and "I Got Rhythm."

As usual, Jazz Choir I gave an exciting performance that energized the audience. One of the highlights of their set was "Samba!" Using multiple rhythms and phrasing in the choir, "Samba!" achieved a feeling that the human voice could be turned into a percussion instrument.

A second intermission, after Jazz Choir I, was needed to set the stage for the evening's final group. Jazz Band I, directed by Robert McCurdy, was the finale group with a three song set.

Besides playing as an ensemble, the band also featured several soloists in all of their songs. Director McCurdy also played a solo during "Ask Me Now," by Thelonious Monk (arranged by Greg Yasinitzky). The other songs performed by the band were "Captain Perfect" by Alf Clausen and "Moleids" by Chuck Owen.

One disappointment in Tuesday night's Gala was Lionel Hampton's absence from the stage. Scheduled to play the vibes during Jazz Band I's set, the 88-year-old Hampton instead stayed in the front row flanked by Dr. Lynn Skinner to watch instead of play.

Despite his absence from the stage, however, Hampton still gave rousing applause to all of the UI groups featured in the Gala concert.

Hampton is still scheduled to perform in concerts today and tomorrow. Seats are still available for some shows. For more information call the Lionel Hampton Jazz Festival office at 885-6765.

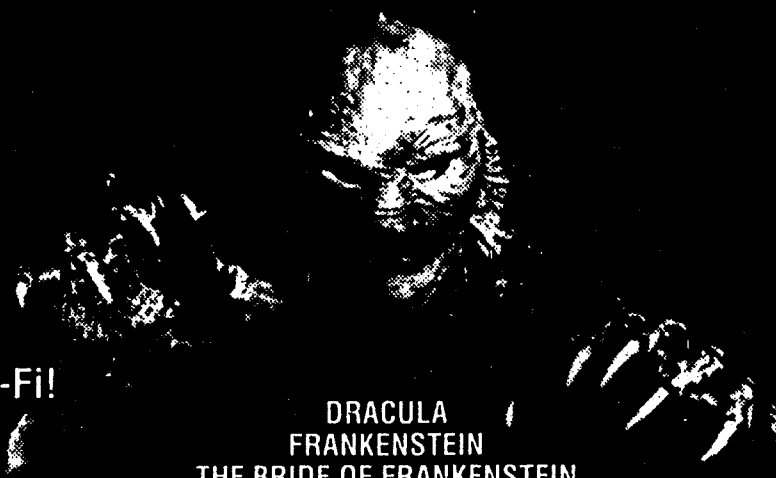

All-Star Concert promises to be a jazz odyssey

Guests of the All-Star Concert Friday can expect to enjoy the sounds of their favorite artists as well as a night of Latin Jazz.

"Tito Puente has often been labeled the King of Latin Music," Sue Ehrstine, assistant program coordinator of the festival, said "We are lucky to get these artists."

By the age of 13, Puente was considered a child prodigy in Spanish Harlem. Completing his formal musical education at Julliard School of Music, he played percussion with bands such as Jose Curbelo, Pupi-Campo and Fernando Alvarez.

Another child prodigy,

D'Rivera, on saxophone and clarinet, was born in Havana. He began his musical studies at the age of five. By the age of six he was performing in public, and by seven became the youngest artist ever to endorse a musical instrument.

Veteran big band player Al "Golden Trombone" Grey is recognized internationally as a premier trombonist. Grey has managed to produce over 1,000 recordings with such artists as Frank Sinatra, Tony Bennett, Bing Crosby and Count Basie whom he toured with for nearly 20 years.

Slide Hampton, another talented trombonist, skills as soloist, ensemble player, teacher, composer, arranger and conductor. He has

accepted dictatorships of the Collective Black Artists Ensemble and the Manhattan Jazz Composers Orchestra.

Shirley Horn, vocals and piano, studied composition at Howard University in Washington, D.C. at the age of 12. After 25 years out of the limelight, she was offered a gig in New York where she was discovered by Verve Records. Nominated for Grammy awards for four straight years, Horn was awarded a Grammy for her recording of "Here's to Life" with Johnny Mandel.

Jane Jarvis, also on the piano, started at age nine. She was an organist for the Milwaukee Braves for 10 years and for the New York Mets for 16 years and has appeared

and recorded with many jazz luminaries.

Claudio Roditi, trumpet, began his musical studies at the age of five. He studied music at the Berklee School of Music in Boston and performed at various clubs and concerts.

As a composer and arranger he has five critically acclaimed albums.

Wallace Roney was four when he began playing the trumpet. By

13 he had his own band. After attending Howard University and Berklee School of Music he joined Art Blakely's Jazz Messengers and was later offered the Music Director's Chair.

Bill Watrous is among the best of jazz trombonists. He has played with many top name artists and was a staff musician for CBS and band member of the Merv Griffin Show.



ALT-ROCK-A-RAMA

Alternative Rock. What the hell does alternative mean these days? That which used to be alternative is now mainstream. Columbia House even has an alternative section in their catalog.

When I saw Scott Schinder and the editors of *Rolling Stone* had put together a compendium of alternative music, I was pretty skeptical. What could they possibly tell us that we couldn't find in the liner notes of the latest Pearl Jam album? A brief glance at *Alt-Rock-a-Rama* dispelled any notions that this was going to be a run of the mill collection of buzzwords.

Alt-Rock-a-Rama takes a look at the history of alternative music from The Mothers of Invention and The Velvet Underground to Negativland in the words of the artists themselves, as well as *Rolling Stone*'s writers. With

commentary from the likes of Graham Parker and John Petkovic, we gain some insight into the attitudes and issues that helped shape alternative music over the years.

Even if history bores you, there is plenty in this book to grab your attention. The book contains nearly 500 pages of humor, observations and lists of things you maybe wondered about or never thought to question. For fans of the Ramones, it has the complete set list from their first show at CBGB as well as the number of The Ramones song titles that contain the word "wanna."

With book in your possession, you can amaze your friends with useless trivia such as: Nirvana's album *Bleach* was recorded in six days at a cost of \$606.17!

The Pogues got their name from the truncated Gaelic phrase "pogue mahone," which translates to "kiss my ass."

R.E.M. has covered no less than 85 songs, including the Everly Brothers' "All I Have to do is Dream" and Television's "See no Evil."

The Pixies' Black Francis (aka Frank Black) real name is

Charles Michael Kitteridge-Thompson IV.

If the factoids aren't enough to grab your attention, there are plenty of lists such as: Superchunk's Top Ten Worst Rock Club Restrooms, Joe Jack Talcum's Top Ten Reasons to Kill Your Boss and Five Alt-Rock Biographies Albert Goldman is Writing in Hell.

Sure, there's humor a-plenty, but the serious and creative sides of the music industry is also included, making this volume well worth acquiring. Included is Negativland's tenets of free appropriation, an anecdote by Robyn Hitchcock about life on the road and words of wisdom from Nine Inch Nails' Trent Reznor.

Alt-Music-a-Rama isn't the kind of book you'll be able to sit down and read, but that is the really appealing thing about it. Every time you glance through it, you find something new that grabs your interest. Schinder and *Rolling Stone* have done alternative music a favor, helping bring the roots of the latest movement in popular music to the forefront, giving them the recognition they deserve.

Pansy Division releases new album

Bundled with their classic "how-to-put-on-a-condom" diagram, Pansy Division releases a new album titled *Wish I'd Taken Pictures*.

The new album is available off of the independent label Lookout! Records. It features 14 tracks and an insert giving out the addresses and phone numbers to different gay and lesbian organizations. Congressional virus v1.2: Runs every program on the hard drive simultaneously, but doesn't allow the user to accomplish anything.

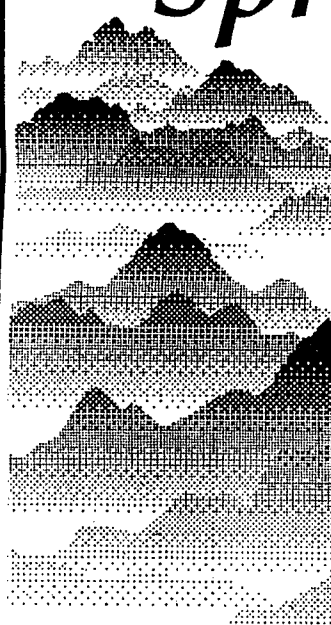
