It's time for University of Idaho students to "pop some tags" at the thrift shop because a premier Seattle rap duo is heading to Moscow for Finals Fest.

Macklemore and Ryan Lewis most recently broke ground with an independent release of their full-length album "The Heist." Without a traditional record label, the album took iTunes' No. 1 spot and debuted at No. 2 on the Billboard charts. The duo's "Thrift Shop" single is currently the second most popular song, accord-

ing to Billboard.

Taylor Williams, ASUI Vandal Entertainment board chair, said UI student every is guaranteed a ticket, which will be available April 1-5 in the ASUI office.

To obtain a ticket, students must bring their Vandal cards, and this year, one non-perishable food item. All of the food collected

will go to the UI Food Pantry, which will seek to provide low-income students with food security.
