1.

A strong walled castle is our God,  
 a good defense and weapon:  
 He helps us free out of all need  
 Which us presently has struck.  
 The old evil foe,  
 he means earnestly now.  
 Great might and much guile,  
 are his horrible weapons,  
 On earth is not his equal.

Everyone who's born of God,  
 Is for victory elected  
 With our might is naught done  
 We are right fast lost.  
 There strives for us the right  
 Whom God Himself has elected  
 All who by Christ's blood's banner  
 in baptism truly have sworn,  
 Wins in spirit on and on.  
 Ask you who he is?  
 He's called Jesus Christ,  
 The Lord Sabaoth,  
 And it's no other God.  
 The battlefield must he seize.  
 Everyone who's born of God,  
 Is for victory elected.

Consider yet, child of God, the so great love,  
 that Christ himself  
 with his blood to you wrote down  
 By which he you  
 To battle against Satan's hosts and against  
 world and sinning enlisted has!  
 Give not within your soul  
 to Satan and corruption place!  
 Let not your heart  
 the Heaven of God upon the earth,  
 to wasteland become!  
 Rue your guilt with sorrow,
