Dear Mr. Day:

Mr. Bush has requested me to write you and send you what data we have concerning our Clearwater Fire Protective Assn. work that you may use it at the St. Paul Conservation Congress.

I am sending you under separate cover a blue print of a map compiled by our Chief Fire Warden showing camp look-outs established, trails cut, wagon roads made etc. during the season of 1909. I am also enclosing you a copy of the the Secretary's report and Chief Fire Warden's report for season of 1909, which I trust will be of some service to you.

Concerning the season of 1910 will say up to about the middle of August we had about 50 men employed and had had no serious fires, but since that time owing to high winds which spread the fires very rapidly, we have been continually increasing our force until we have about 125 men employed at the present time. As to the number of fires we have had and the amount of timber destroyed I am unable to give you any information from the fact our Fire warden has not yet had an opportunity to check them up and send us in an accurate report.

The total acreage of the members of our Association for year 1910 amounts to 345454 Acres, the Northern Pacific has 10960 acres, and donations amounting to 4480 acres
