

ADDENDUM TO B.S.U. ORGANIZATIONAL STATEMENT
PROJECTED PROGRAMS FOR THE SCHOOL YEAR 1972-73

I. READING ROOM

Development of a Reading Room to contain reading materials: magazines, books and journals pertaining to the black experience. This room would be open to the general public at specific hours during the week. Respective materials will be supplied by donations from B.S.U. members, volunteer donors and the B.S.U. treasury.

II. CULTURAL AWARENESS PROGRAM

Will consist of bi-weekly discussions, debates, films, etc., to be followed by informal dialogue on various issues and events relating to the black experience. We plan to utilize resource people from the Moscow-Pullman University communities as well as outside areas. These activities will be open to the entire university community. Finances will be applied for from the appropriate university agencies. The B.S.U. treasury will be a source for supplemental finances.

III. BLACK ORIENTATION PROGRAM

Will entail efforts to assist incoming black students with getting settled and whatever initial adjustment difficulties that they might encounter. This program would not conflict with the general university orientation activities and should be viewed as contingent.

IV. Pan-AFRICAN INTEREXCHANGE

A monthly informal forum to communicate and exchange thoughts and perspectives between African and Afro-American students.

V. AFRO-AMERICAN STUDIES COURSE

A special seminar utilizing the B.S.U. facilities (see attached sheet for details).
