As a result of a small survey of persons who are involved with and have shown an interest in the education of minority students here at the University of Idaho regarding the establishment of an Advisory Board for Minority Student Programs, the concensus of opinion would seem to indicate that the majority of those contacted (five out of the eight) suggested that the Advisory Board could very well be a function of Juntura - but of a restructured Juntura to reflect a broader input from all parties involved with and concerned with education of minority students here at this university.

The rationale for this suggestion seemed to be the feeling that establishing a separate Advisory Board in addition to Juntura would be a duplication of effort to some extent and that the purpose could very well be served by Juntura.

A minority of the contacts (three) suggested that an Advisory Board would be very advantageous and supported its creation but expressed the opinion that it should have a definite and specific purpose and structure.

In conclusion, I am in favor of restructuring Juntura to serve as an Advisory Board as reflected by the majority opinion voiced above.
