Idaho Offers New Course

In response to suggestions from a number of University of Idaho students, the university will offer a new course this coming year on modern man and his problems.

Entitled "Man in the Nuclear Age," the course will be divided into two parts, and will be taught by leading university authorities in such fields as foreign policy, nuclear physics, psychology, urban affairs, geography, music, art. literature, history, economics, cybernetics, religion, anthropology, and race relations.

During the fall semester, emphasis will be placed on an examination of the Black identity. Six class sessions will be devoted to the alienation of the Blacks, followed by two meetings on methods by which the Black identity is preserved, and concluding with seven weeks of study on how the Black identity is affirmed today.

The second semester curriculum will be concerned with the threat of war. urban crisis, and the development and peaceful uses of atomic energy.

The course will be offered for two credits, and will include both formal lectures and small group discussions. IDAhemum - August 20, 1969
