This is just an informational note. Professors Davis, Barnes and I met Tuesday and discussed at some length the possibility of bringing in some outside talent for instruction in the above mentioned courses, preferably Black talent. It was decided to move in the direction of one nationally known figure and from one to three persons from nearby (regionally), with the first at least to be encouraged to provide some sort of a general or University wide program in addition to the special purpose for which he or she is brought in. We had in mind also a common reading room, possibly supplemented by a collection of paperbacks for which some special funds might be needed. In a very general way we talked about approximately \$2000 for each course + up to \$500 for books. Professor Davis will submit, in the near future a specific proposal for the Black Literature course and sometime after September 1, Professor Barnes and I will do likewise for the Negro History course.
