Garfield High School, an inner-city high school composed of predominantly minority students, in cooperation with the Educational Talent Search Program of Seattle, Washington, will be sponsoring a spring quarter Eastern Washington College Tour for approximately fifty high school seniors. The purpose of the College Tour is to expose inner-city minority high school students who would not ordinarily have the opportunity to visit and observe the unique physical, social and academic atmosphere of some of our finer distant colleges and/or universities.

Students are selected to participate in this tour if they have accomplished the following prerequisites: (1) They must have submitted a P.C.S. form to the Educational Talent Search Program within a specific time; (2) they must have applied to at least two of the college campuses on the tour; (3) they must have demonstrated academic social motivation in continuing their education.

Garfield High School and the E.T.S.P. have sponsored said tours for the past five years. We are requesting that via the E.O.P. and/or B.S.U. offices each respective college provide room and board for our students. E.T.S.P. is providing the transportation for the tour.

Mr. Eddie Rye, Director, and Ms. Alice Bankston, Assistant Director of E.T.S.P., along with myself, will be coordinating this tour. We would respectfully appreciate a response from your institution of your potential participation.
