Minutes Juntura Committee Meeting October 20, 1977 (noon, SUB)

Present: P. Dierker, J. Driskell, J. Hill, L. Morris, M. Moody, J. Mayfield, T. Grigsby, and J. Worster.

Business:

- 1. Paul Dierker, Chairman, read the Juntura charter to the 1977-78 committee members. He emphasized that full representation from minority student groups is needed.
- 2. Jean Hill gave a report on the 1977-78 budget for Minority Student Services. The budget was divided into three categories:

Salaries \$35,767.00 Operating Expenses 2,420.00 Travel 2,408.00

She noted that the \$78.23 deficit appearing in the operating expense category would be picked up by her office, Student Advisory Services (SAS). Dr. Hill further stated that \$100 had been allocated for the development of brochures. She noted that the Native American students already have brochures through the Native American Center and that brochures should be developed for the Black and Chicano students.

3. Paul Dierker noted that recommendations had been made previously to appoint an advisory board to represent minority students. In the past, there has been some question as to whether the Juntura Committee should serve as the advisory board or whether there should be a separate advisory board. If Juntura is to serve as an advisory board then there is a need to restructure the present committee membership.

Following this statement, Jerome Mayfield suggested that all three minority student advisors should be regular members (not exofficio) of the Juntura Committee. In addition, there should be a student representative from each of the minority groups: Blacks, Native American, and Chicano.

Jeanette Driskell then suggested there should be ex-officio members of the advisory board. These ex-officio members would be comprised of those persons who are directly involved with the activities of minority students such as Upward Bound, Financial Aids, Native American Center, etc.

These suggestions were discussed without action being taken by the Juntura Committee. The meeting was adjourned with a tentative meeting scheduled for the second week in November.
