

MINUTES OF JUNTURA COMMITTEE

Date: September 15, 1972

Present: Seaman, Barber, Johnson, Armstrong, Rouyer, Voxman

1. Chairman Armstrong read a memo from the Faculty Secretary to all University standing committees regarding the distribution of committee minutes. Juntura will follow the University's policy for proper distribution of committee minutes and send copies to the chairman of Faculty Council, the Faculty secretary, the academic vice president, and to the chairman of the Committee on Committees.
2. T. Armstrong also read a memo from Charles A. Webbert, head of the Department of Special Collections and Archives in the University Library, requesting that Juntura send copies of all minutes and records of the committee for permanent preservation in Special Collections. Since Juntura does not have the funds to duplicate this material, the originals will have to be submitted. F. Seaman asked if there was a consensus of the committee to give the records of last year's meetings to Mr. Webbert. All present were in agreement.
3. Bernard Hamilton was present at the meeting and discussed what he hopes to do in his job in the Office of Intercultural Programs. There was a general discussion of recruiting procedures for minority/disadvantaged students.
4. Jay Wheeler attended the meeting and discussed the general situation of the Black Student Union. He emphasized that in the event that the building they are using now is torn down to make way for more parking space, the University should allow them the use of another building. Wheeler also suggested that Juntura look into lessening the pressure of the University on the BSU to be constantly producing events and activities. He feels that many of the African students are afraid to take time from their studying to work with the BSU because they fear being sent home.
5. The meeting was adjourned at 1:00 p.m.
