Date: April 18, 1972

- 1. A. Rouyer chaired the meeting in T. Armstrong's absence.
- 2. The minutes of the previous meeting, April 11, 1972, were approved as presented.
- The committee briefly discussed the memo from President Hartung concerning Park Village Homes. F. Seaman will have the memo duplicated for all members and check into the issues raised.
- 4. A. Rouyer reported the the Afro-American Studies proposal has been received by Faculty Council and has been given an adjenda number.
- 5. A report on the position of Special Services Coordinator was presented as written by C. Bush and J. Ridley.
 - a. After a general discussion by the committee, J. Ridley moved that Juntura accept the report and that it be submitted to Faculty Council for their consideration and to President Hartung for his information.
 - b. The motion was seconded by R. Sprague and passed unanimously.
 - c. J. Ridley will follow up the report to see if President Hartung will encourage it or stand neutral on the issue.
 - d. J. Ridley asked whether the rational for this position be presented verbally at the Faculty Council meeting or in writing.
 - 1. The committee decided that it would be best to have someone at the meeting to explain the rational verbally.
 - 2. J. Ridley, E. Robinson, and the Chairman will attend the meeting to do this.
- 6. An addition to the Afro-American Studies Proposal was presented to the committee as prepared by K. Johnson and E. Robinson.
 - a. To give a broader prespective to the Afro-American Studies program exchange classes with WSU should be encouraged.
 - b. The addition also proposes a cross listing of Afro-American Studies classes at the U of I and WSU.
 - c. F. Seaman pointed out that since WSU students pay tuition and U of I students only pay fees, exchange programs aren't encouraged because there is no reciprocity.
 - d. J. Ridley moved that this proposal be sent to Faculty Council as part and parcel of the previous proposal on Afro-American Studies. The motion was seconded and passed.
 - c. As soon as K. Johnson checks on Point c above and notifies the committee, the proposal will be prepared and given to the Chairman to send to Faculty Council.
