Dear Sir,-

I have the letter from Mr. Rust dated July 3rd, with your request noted on the bottom thereof to write you the shape in which our ore contracts at at present, and what rates are being offered for renewals. All the data concerning our contracts having been destroyed, I can only state from memory the dates of their expiration, which are about as follows:

Globe contract for 900 tons per month expiring Sept. 1st, 1899.

Aurora " " 500 to 700 tons per month expiring the latter part of August.

Selby contract for 300 tons per month expiring about the end of this month.

The contract with Tacoma you have fully in mind.

We have received no offers for renewals of any of our contracts so far, and I presume that we shall receive none except upon our invitation, as the general impression is that our arrangement with Tacoma takes care of all of our output. I am writing to day, however, to the different smelters, stating that we shall probably be again producing concentrates in a few weeks, and inviting them to make us offers for any part of our product that they can handle. As soon as I have replies to any of these enquiries, I will advise you.
