Dear Sir,

Burch & Martin Courran went into the Last Chance on the 9th inst. as examiners under the order for survey & inspection. Burch says there has been almost no new work done since they were there last December. But they have begun to sink a winze, as I wrote you several months ago. & the chamber cut out at the top of it shows considerable carbonate ore. The Skookum stope above the Sweeney level would appear to be making to the east as it goes up, which is contrary to the impression we got last year. The present conclusion is reached from the fact that the west chutes from the stope are not being used, & all the ore is coming down through the chute at the east end. The winze also starts at the east end. We are making some

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inquiries among men who have worked there lately and if I gather anything further will let you know. If the ore does make to the east it would get into the extra lateral territory of the King. Beale heard from someone in Spokane that they claimed to be working now in the San Carlos - but I do not think they can have gone up far enough to bring them into that ground. Chas. Williams says that a raise is to be made from the slope to the surface, for ventilation - & that the men working there say it will come out on the Tyler. Of course it will not do so, but this talk tends to show that the workings must be making over towards the Tyler & may easily be in the King already.
