Dear Sir,

I was in the Tyler works today - & saw the new ore of which I have previously advised you. There is about 3 ft. of carbonate ore in the Teddy & cut, on which a little slope has been carried up, perhaps 20 ft. and about 20 ft. long. and from which we have got about 270 tons of shipping ore. Farther west, in the Burch & cut there is 3 ft. or so of shipping ore, but here it is galena. We are fixing up to open this ore through from one & cut to the other, and it will then make a very nice little stop. There is also some concentrating ore. 5 or 6 ft. wide at some points. The ore lies practically on the T.W.

I send you a tracing showing the work on the Sweeney level in Skookum ground. and the position of the winze. This winze is only down 10 to 15 ft. so far.

and appears to be going down in the direction of the dip. If so continued it will have to go about 300 ft. horizontally or 400 ft. on the slope to reach the northern limit of the Steamwinder extra lateral rights. Starting from the level again, and going up on the dip of the vein, you will see that they have only to go about 130 ft. to get into King extra lateral rights - and from all the indications they have already done this. Can we stop them on our King title?

You will also notice that continuing up on the dip this ore would come into the Tyler extra lateral rights at no distant date - and continued still farther it would apparently come to the Tyler level where we are now working.

The Empire State Co. have been working on this slope almost exclusively for about 16 months - and roughly speak-

ing they must have mined nearly 70,000 tons of ore from it in that period. They are shipping considerable first class ore at present - their streak of clean ore having widened to about 4 ft - between two good slips - and it breaks clean.
