Dear Sir,

Outario - your letter of 27th ulto. Today Burch & I went over this claim again, and we found an open cut or trench near the SW. End of the claim, which had evidently been made for the purpose of finding the apex of the vein. In this cut we found chiefly quartzite, but a little iron oxide. A sample of the latter was brought in, & I will advise you if it carries silver. The main opening on the claim had caved in, so we were unable to examine it again; but when we saw it last winter there was a good showing of vein matter - without value however. There is so little work done - & that now inaccessible that it is impossible to make any positive statement. but I believe there is a vein on the ground, the apex running approximately with the length of the claim, but so far as known without value.
