Dear Sir,

I regret very much to have to announce the death of Ralph L. Drought, who was killed today by being run over by the switch train at our works. Just what he was doing on the R.R. track at the time I have been unable to learn, so far. An inquest will be held at 3 pm. This is the third fatal accident within a month - and it is peculiarly distressing because of the misfortune under which the young man labored, as well as because of the age & feeble condition of his parents, to whom his death is a terrible shock. I fear the effect on Mrs. Drought may be very serious.
