Dear Sir,-

I have your letter of 7th inst. Nordberg promised shipment of our compressor Sept. 15th, but it is quite likely to be somewhat later than that, and I expect it will be sometime in November before we get it in operation. In the meantime, when the west side of the mill is running, we shall want the compressor at the machine shop to run the machine drills in the mine. I have therefore ordered a No. 5, Class A, Straight Line, Ingersoll Serjeant Air Compressor, rated at 40 to 56 H.P. from the Anaconda Copper Mining Co., price \$1251 f.o.b. Butte. This is practically the only compressor in sight that is suitable for our purpose. We will set it up just outside and to the west of the Power Plant buildings, and take steam from the boilers there. This will be better than using the small 40 H.P. boiler and setting up at the tunnel, as fuel will be cheaper and no extra fireman will be needed.
