Dear Sir,-

I am in receipt of your favor of 31st ult. and note that you have been engaged by a Mr. Root in a matter of damages alleged to have been caused to certain premises owned by him at Kellogg by overflow and leakage from our flume. I also note your suggestion that we should send for Mr. Kellogg, who is the local representative of Mr. Root, and make a settlement with him without going into Court. We appreciate the spirit in which this suggestion is made, but a former talk with Mr. Kellogg makes us believe that it would be useless to take up the subject with him again. We have already expressed willingness to pay him the sum expended by him in repairing the damage which he claimed was done to the premises, and which he stated amounted to only a few dollars, and have promised to make a ditch large enough to carry away all leak from the flume hereafter, so that there can be no danger of any further damage. Work on this ditch has begun and will be completed shortly. This is all we can do. We have a very friendly feeling towards Mr. Kellogg, and if it were a personal matter of his own, we might try to help him out a little without insisting too strongly on our own rights, but as he is merely acting as the attorney-in-fact of Mr. Root, we shall be obliged to resist any action that may be brought in the premises.
