Dear Sir,

Considering the probability of our new mill being able to treat 800 tons of ore a day, with a consequent output of say 100 tons of concentrates, and some crude ore besides, it is apparent that we may at times have a larger tonnage to dispose of than our present contracts cover.

I think therefore that it would be wise for us to make a contract with Lyne on his offer, good to 1<sup>st</sup> Sep., at the rates of our present Globe contract. i.e. \$20<sup>00</sup> middle valuation, 104 iron, or else with the Butte & Ruby Valley Co. at \$17. flat - same as Jacoma, and I

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have wired you suggesting such a course. If we contract with Lync we can ship our coarse concentrates straight, which will take the \$20 rate, less iron, say 1<sup>00</sup>, or \$19 net. The Crude ore we could send to Tacoma if we chose, making more 1<sup>st</sup> Cl. concentrates to ship under the new contract.
