Dear Sir,-

Enclosed find the usual reports for the week ending 28th ult.

The mine is looking very well indeed, there being a noticeable improvement in the Wood stope, from which we shall again be able to get some shipping ore. The Roberts continues to look well and the Tyler also looks very well and is turning out considerable shipping ore. We are cutting the station at the Burch cross cut for the new winze, and in the Roberts stope we are raising on shipping ore to the Stemwinder level. We have about 60 feet more to go and will come out at the point where the Carbonate stope was started on the Stemwinder level. The Nevada cross cut is being extended through ore.

The work of reconstruction at the mill is nearing completion, and it is expected that the west side will be started by the 5th inst. There will be more or less changing to do for a while, no doubt, but we should be handling ore to its full capacity by the middle of the month.

The Power Plant can do but little more until the new compressor is received. The electric plant is in operation again. We begin to furnish lights to the town today.

At the Kellogg Tunnel progress for the week was 45 feet. The ground is again soft and needs timbering. I will look into the matter of advancing a heading beyond the timbering as suggested in your letter of 27 ult, and will see whether we can adopt that method of working to advantage.
