

TO THE MEMBERS OF THE WARDNER INDUSTRIAL UNION:

Your committee appointed to confer with Mr. Burbidge makes the following report:

1. As to a contribution to this Union by the Bunker Hill & Sullivan Mining & Concentrating Co. Mr. Burbidge stated that the Company would pay into the treasury of the Union each month a sum equal to the amount paid as monthly dues by all members of the Union who are in its employ, and that as soon as we furnish him with a statement of amounts so paid to date, he will give us a check for a like amount.
