I have seen E. McCormick, the man referred to in your letter of 21st., and my impression is not particularly favorable. He says he has had eight or nine years experience in assaying, book-keeping, surveying and superintending mines, and as Professor of metallurgy and assaying at Rapid City, South Dakota. He worked for Heinze for about a year as surveyor, and claims to have been Superintendent of the Parrot Co. He is at present engaged in making some underground surveys for the Empire State people in connection with the approaching litigation of the Stemwinder. I think this is the first effort the Empire State people are making to prepare for trial. McCormick is not to testify as an expert, but simply to the correctness of his maps. I have told him that I would keep a look out, and that by the time he gets through with the Empire State work, we might be able to find something for him. This will keep him on the string, and make him friendly disposed towards us.
