Dear Sir,-

Enclosed I hand you usual reports for week ending September 28th. The stopes do not look quite so well this week as last. The Roberts and Hatton look well, but most of the others are poorer. There are some indications, however, that the next floor of the Wood stope will be in good ore again. The Teddy stope in the Tyler continues to yield a good tonnage of first class, and the Roberts will also give considerable first class ore this month.

The only development work in the week was the Hatton Raise, which has been temporarily stopped, and the Tyler Winze, which is down eight feet. The Tyler drift west and the King cross cut were resumed yesterday.

At the mill everything progresses satisfactorily.

The Kellogg Tunnel advanced 54 feet in the week, making the total 5300 feet. The ground does not require timbering except that sprags and lagging have to be put in to hold the roof.

There is no news yet of the shipment of the new air compressor.
