Enclosed I hand you the usual reports for the week ending 14th inst.

The Roberts stope looks very well all over, but most of the other stopes are quite poor.

The Tyler Winze was sunk 6 feet, making total depth 23 feet.

The cost per foot is shown to be \$25.50 for labor alone, but this appears to be due to the shift bosses incorrectly charging the work. I do not think it will be so expensive next week.

The Kellogg Tunnel advanced 58 feet in the week, making the total 5431 feet. The last round brought a change of ground, and it is now very loose and wet, and requires close timbering.

There are no other changes to report.
