I am in receipt of your favor of 17th inst. During the month September, weshipped you ore and concentrates containing 1004.77 tons of metallic lead, or an average of 33.49 tons per day. In the present month, up to and including yesterday, the 20th inst., we have shipped to you, and to Selby on your account, ore and concentrates containing 894.46 tons of metallic lead, equal to 44.72 tons per day. These figures are all based on our weights and assays. As you will see, in September our shipments were a long way below the maximum allowable under the contract, and in this month the tonnage is almost identical with the maximum. We, of course, will not ship you in any month more than the contract provides for. I am anxious to accommodate you as far as possible, but as the contract was made with you by Mr. Bradley, I do not feel authorized to modify it in any way. I believe, however, that Mr. Bradley will be coming north within a week or so, and no doubt you will then have the opportunity of discussing this matter with him.
