Dear Sir,-

I have an offer from the Colorado Smelting Co. to renew the present contract with them, for 200 or 300 tons of our first class concentrates per month, at the present rate, viz: \$20 for freight and treatment on the middle valuation. I had expected that we should be in position to say that we would sell only on the same terms as we have with Tacoma, but as mentioned in my letter of 16th inst., we shall probably have a surplus over and above what Rust proposes to take. I do not think that we shall be inconvenienced in any way, at present, if we decide not to renew this contract with the Colorado Smelting Co., as the tonnage is so small that it can easily be spread over our other contracts, and the <sup>it</sup> tonnage can be taken care of when some of the latter expire. If we do not renew this contract, but distribute the tonnage as suggested, you will be able to see Rust and fix up some kind of a deal with him, by which he will agree to take all of our ore if necessary.

*for the leverage it will give us with any outside smelter which may want our ore.*
