Enclosed find the usual reports for the week ending 7th inst.

At the mine there is no change to report, the stopes all looking about the same as they did last week. The tonnage of shipping ore was not so large, owing to the necessity of repairing the Fritz shoot, but the shortage will be made up, so that the tonnage for the month will be fully as large as it was last month.

The Tyler west drift was advanced 12 ft. and the winze 8 ft.

Work on the Power Plant has been rather slow, because of the non arrival of Nordberg's man who is to erect the compressor. He arrived on Saturday, however, and is now at work.

At the Kellogg Tunnel the ground keeps favorable, and we are making better progress. The advance for the week was 72 feet, making the total length 5693 feet.
