Dear Sir,-

I enclose the usual reports for the week ending 28th inst.

At the mine there is practically no change to report, the only exception perhaps being that the Johnson stope is getting smaller, and apparently will not last more than a few months longer.

At the Tyler mine the Foot Wall drift advanced 12 ft. and the Winze 7 ft. Neither face shows any ore ^{of value} at present.

At the Kellogg Tunnel progress for the week was 42 feet. We wereshut down all round on Christmas day, so that all results represent 6 days work. Some time was lost through the breaking of part of the hoist in the Tunnel, and part of the time the ground was exceedingly hard and tight. The face shows somewhat softer now, and I think the progress will be faster, unless we should have to timber the ground, which at present, however, does not seem probable.

The erection of the new compressor still progresses slowly.
