The Tyler Winze made eight feet in the week. It shows a little ore throughout, but it is too lean to save. The Tyler Foot Wall Drift advanced 19 ft.

The Kellogg Tunnel advanced 72 feet, making the total 5765 ft. The ground is hard quartzite, rather massive and quite tight. It stands well without timbers, and if it remains as it is, we shall make pretty good progress.

The work of erecting the new compressor is moving rather slow
ly. Nordberg's man does not appear to be very expiditious, but after

the heavy parts are in place, the progress may be faster.
