He is mining, and getting the regular wages of \$^{3.50} a day, & it would be unwise I think to pay him any more than is paid to others for the same class of work. Of course if there should be any opening in which we could put him, with better pay, I would be glad to do so, but he is not content to wait for such an opportunity. I told him I would write you, to see whether, in view of your wanting him occasionally to make preliminary examinations for you, you would pay him 50¢ a day, as a retainer as it were. This would make his pay \$4- a day, and would, I think, satisfy him for a time at least. Please let me hear from you as to this.
