I have your letter to me of the 11th. enclosing copies of reports, ore statements, vouchers and lists of outstanding pay-checks and drafts. In regard to the outstanding drafts, all of those made to my order are for the Mutual Aid Account, and had not been put into circulation, nor had they been endorsed by me. In all probability these drafts were destroyed, but it is just possible that they were stolen, and in that case, if they should ever be presented, you will of course refuse payment. Later on I will make a draft covering the sum total of these several drafts and turn it in to the Mutual Aid Acct.

Draft No.4077 - \$6.00, order C.W.Simmons, may or may not have been put into circulation; Mr.Simmons does not recall whether he had paid it out or not. If he had, of course it bears his endorsement, and will be paid; otherwise you will please treat it in the same manner as indicated above.

I have not had time to go over the blueprints carefully, and do not know just what, if any, are missing; if I find that we are short of any, I will wire you to make further search for such missing ones specifically.
